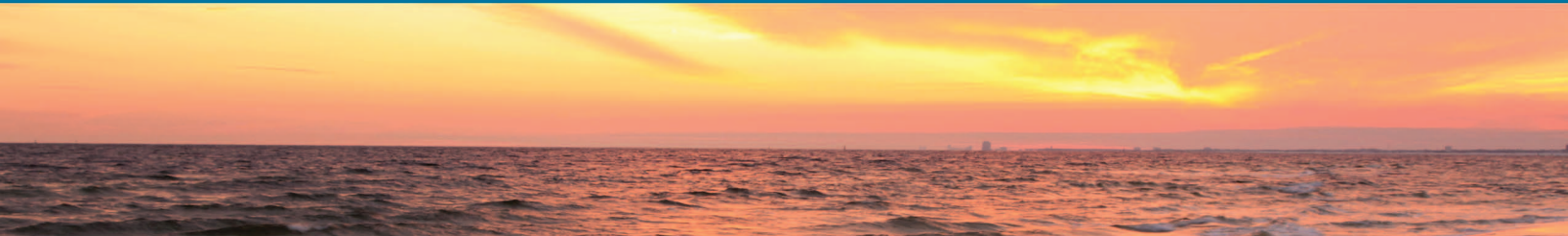

To prevent animals from getting into the trash, place garbage bags in trash cans, please do not leave plastic garbage bags curbside.

SERVICES

POA House Painting Service

If you live in a patio, villa or town house, a portion of your POA fees includes the painting of your house—trim painted every three (3) years and your whole house painted every six (6) years. The painting fees you pay are based on the costs associated with painting an original standard A, B, or C, patio, villa or town house.

However, if you live in a Barbados, Courtyard or Lake Front house (each of these house types are billed POA fees as Patio C house), or a non-standard A, B, or C Patio, Villa, or Town house in which changes or additions have been made, either when first built or subsequently, or if there are any extenuating circumstances where additional painting or preparation is required, then there will be an additional charge assessed to you at the completion of the painting job. The additional amount to be assessed will be the difference between the actual painting costs less the amount billed as part of your POA fees.

As a courtesy to our homeowners, prior to the start of your scheduled trim or full-house painting, a letter will be sent to you by the POA letting you know the approximate time frame your house will be painted and, if there is an additional charge for this painting, state the amount and reasons for the additional charge.

Letter from J.R. Congdon - Director of Golf

Dear Frenchman's Creek Members,

The golf operations team hopes that everyone is having a very enjoyable summer. While most of you are away during this time period, your golf staff is preparing for the upcoming golf season.

One of the changes that will be immediately noticed is that we recently converted our golf handicap system from GolfNet to the USGA's handicapping system known as GHIN. We decided to make this change for a several reasons, but the most important of them is that the GHIN system is the most commonly used handicapping platform at your Northern Clubs. This change will now provide a seamless posting of scores, no matter where the round may be played. Under a separate communication, we will be sending more details of how the system works. We are also asking any of our members that have GHIN numbers at other Club's for that number, so that we can merge your Frenchman's Creek GHIN number with any other Club's that you may have an affiliation with.

On a different note, at the most recent Frenchman's Creek Board of Governor's meeting; the Board discussed the current Hole-in-One fund. As a result of the discussions, the Board determined that some modifications should be made to the program as it currently exists. It was decided that after the thrilling feat of making a Hole-in-One; provided that the member is enrolled in the Hole-in-One program that the member making the Hole-in-One will receive a commemorative plaque memorializing the shot, plus a \$300 golf shop credit. The offering of unlimited drinks following each time a Hole-in-One is made has been discontinued.

Lastly, I would like to welcome to our team, Nakul Paliwal, who will be interning in golf operations from the next six months. Summer Clean Up

Summer is a great time to purge data. You may be surprised at how much data you are holding onto digitally. Delete emails, files, empty Internet browser cache, and old folders of digital garbage. Likewise look for ways of moving files, pictures, videos, etc. off of your computer using external hard drives or online backup services. Doing this will free hard drive space and may help speed up your computer.

Keep Your Data Safe

In order to keep your data safe, or in case of a hardware failure, it is good practice to have it on removable storage. You can use a thumb drive, an external hard drive, or anything else that stores data off of the computer. You may also want to consider using a cloud-based backup service as well. In addition, best practice is to isolate your computer from the wall outlet by first plugging into a surge protector. Plugging your computer into a surge protector first and then into a wall outlet second will help prevent your computer from suffering a catastrophic hardware failure. South Florida is the lightning capital of the world so keeping your computer powered through one of these devices will help protect you from permanently losing your data.

MOVE OVER, IT'S THE LAW

On a two-lane roadway, you are required to slow to a speed that is 20 miles per hour **less than** the posted speed limit.

If the speed limit is 20 miles per hour or less, you must slow down to **five** miles per hour.

If you are driving on an interstate or roadway with multiple lanes of travel in the same direction, and you approach an any emergency vehicle, law enforcement vehicle & tow vehicles parked along the roadway, you must vacate the lane closest to that vehicle as soon **as it is safe to do so**. If you are not able to safely move over, you must slow down to

a speed of 20 MPH below the posted speed limit unless directed otherwise by a law enforcement officer.

Violating the move over law puts **both yourself and a public safety professional** at risk.

Violating the move over law can result in a **fine and points** on your license.

Effective July 1, 2014, the law was changed to include sanitation vehicles and utility service vehicles.
