

3 MAJOR AREAS OF INTEREST: I am very interested in vocal music, raising birds, and genetics.


PLANS AFTER HIGH SCHOOL: I plan to go to ISU in the fall. My major is tentatively Music Education.

HOW WOULD YOU SPEND \$1,000,000? Camera equipment and computer parts, if I'm being honest.


