Community Safety

On a daily basis I receive emails, phone calls and have personal meetings with residents regarding community safety issues and concerns. Undoubtedly, the most prevalent concern is roadway safety. Under the umbrella of roadway safety the major concerns are;

1. Speeding

The Traffic Hawk Speed Enforcement System has been a great tool to reduce the amount of speeding on property. We greatly appreciate the efforts of all residents and vendors to maintain a safe speed while driving on property. In order to illustrate the relationship of vehicle speed to the odds of pedestrian death in collisions, I have provided the research and chart below. If a pedestrian was struck by a vehicle travelling at 20 mph, the odds of dying are only 5%. However, if that same pedestrian was struck by a vehicle travelling at 40 mph, the odds of death increase to 85%. These numbers speak for themselves and should be shared with guests and family members during the holiday season.

2. Is Frenchman's Creek Drive and Tournament Drive one or two lanes?

These two roadways are SINGLE LANE roads. They are very wide to accommodate pedestrians, cyclists, golf carts, maintenance personnel or security/emergency vehicles. Vehicles should travel in the center of the roadways until they need to move over to accommodate for pedestrians, cyclists, golf carts, maintenance personnel or security/emergency vehicles. There is NO PASSING LANE on Frenchman's Creek roadways.

3. Pedestrian Safety

a. Pedestrians walking in the correct direction (facing traffic)

Please remember and remind all guests that <u>pedestrians walk facing traffic on the curb side</u> of the road and cyclists ride with traffic while on property. Security staff will be educating guests they encounter walking or cycling in the wrong direction to keep us all on the same page. These encounters typically occurs during the holiday season when guests and relatives are present and are either unaware or forgot. I will continue to direct our officers to be vigilant in "redirecting" our pedestrians to walk in the right direction. In addition to our officers efforts I have produced a video segment addressing this issue and all the other topics within this article that plays on Frenchman's Creek television throughout the day.

b. Pedestrians walking three and four abreast instead of single file or no more than two abreast.

When we have family and friends on property, and are out exercising, we sometimes forget we are in the roadway. We get so caught-up in conversation we find ourselves walking adjacent to one another three or four across. I would ask our residents and guests not to walk more than two abreast when on property and be aware of those that do. By obeying this critical practice we make the road safer for pedestrians and vehicles.

c. Pedestrians walking in dark clothing at or after dusk and at or before dawn.

For our residents and guests who choose to exercise on our roadways at dawn/dusk in dark colored clothing, we encourage you to stop by the Security Gatehouse for a reflective vest. You can also be safe by exercising in light colored clothing or with an illumination device.

4. Golf Cart Safety

a. Underage drivers driving carts

In order to keep our children and/or grandchildren safe, it is extremely important they have a driver's license prior to being allowed to drive a golf cart on property. Should we encounter underage or non-licensed golf cart drivers, we will have them park the cart, provide them transportation to their destination and contact the resident. Please help us by educating your guests and family members of this very important rule.

b. Overloading Golf Carts and children standing on the back of carts

We understand that during the holidays, you may have a large number of family and/or friends visiting at your home. We are all thankful for the opportunity for family and friends to visit. However, this can create situations where you may not have enough golf carts for family/friends to travel on property. We encourage you to contact the golf shop ahead of time and rent a cart while your family/friends are in town. This helps reduce the situation where guests overload a golf cart to travel on property. Many bad things can happen with children sitting on the laps of adults or standing on the back of carts while driving down the road. You may transport as many people on your cart as can be seated with their backside safely on the seat.

c. Golf Carts not stopping at STOP Signs

This is a situation where the person driving the golf cart will pay the ultimate price, financially and possibly, physically. When a golf cart does not stop at an intersection where vehicle traffic exists, they will always lose the encounter. Eventually, the assumption that the other vehicle will stop or slow down will catch up with a driver that takes that risk on a daily basis. For your own safety and that of your passengers, please stop at all intersections with STOP Signs.

Extra Holiday Patrols

Many of you have commented or inquired about the extra security personnel you have seen on property over the holiday season. The reason for the extra personnel is multifaceted. Primarily, the extra personnel are on property to address the numerous safety issues listed above regarding pedestrians, golf carts and speeding. As the occupancy level of the community increases, so do the calls-for-service. By adding extra staffing we are able to conduct the extra roadway safety patrols while allowing existing staff to respond to normal calls-for-service. Secondarily, the extra personnel are on property as ambassadors of Frenchman's Creek to assist all of the family, friends and guests who populate the community over the holiday. As ambassadors, they assist in duties such as escorting guests to their intended destination, providing information on where to find specific locations or activities, where to park their vehicle or golf cart and other general requests. They are also extra sets of eyes and ears to look out for the well-being of all of our young visitors who are at the playground, pool areas, arcade, clubhouse, Fitness Center, 19th Hole and golf course. We will continue to increase staffing during the high occupancy holidays in order to maintain the safest environment possible for our residents and visiting family members and guests.

Ask the Pro Rich Luchini, PGA, Head Golf Profesional

Improving Lie, Area of Intended Stance or Swing, or Line of Play: 13-2/.5

During last year's club championship a player found himself just off the right side of the 8th fairway (South) on the bank with some dry brush directly behind his ball. The player took his stance and when he brought the club back, he accidently broke off a piece of the dry brush in this backswing. He stopped his swing and moved away from the ball. This player was in breach of improving the area of his intended stance or swing by moving, bending or breaking anything growing or fixed (including immovable obstructions and objects defining out of bounds). Match play: Loss of hole. Stroke play: Two stroke penalty.

If the player would have continued to play the shot after breaking off the dry brush he would not have incurred a penalty. Take a moment to review the below chart, it will help you better understand the parameters in which this underlying principle operates.

Areas That Must Not Be Improved:

- The position or lie of the ball
- The area of his intended stance or swing
- His "Line of Play" or a reasonable extension of that line beyond the hole
- The area he is to drop or place a ball

Prohibited Means of Improvement:

- Pressing a club on the ground
- Moving bending or breaking anything growing or fixed (including immovable obstructions and objects defining out of bounds).
- Creating or eliminating irregularities of surface.

Exceptions:

- In grounding the club lightly when addressing the ball
- In making a backward movement of the club for a stroke and the stroke is made
- In creating or eliminating irregularities of surface within the teeing ground or in removing dew, frost or water from the teeing ground
- On the putting green in removing sand and loose soil or in repairing damage

Pace of Play

Reasonable Pace of Play

Each group (and all players in the group) has an equal responsibility to maintain a reasonable pace of play which allows every player on the golf course the opportunity to enjoy their round without being hurried but also without being delayed by slow play.

Now the question on the top of everyone's tongue is: "What is reasonable pace of Play?"

The answer to this question at Frenchman's Creek is:

Any 18 hole round of golf which from the time your first player tees off on #1 until the last player holes out on #18 takes between 3 hours and 50 minutes and 4 hours and 5 minutes is considered Reasonable. As a guideline, each "6 holes stretch" should be completed within 80 minutes. To play at a reasonable pace your group needs consistency.

Please don't think that if you play the front nine in 2 hours and 15 minutes that you will meet the pace f play guidelines by finishing the back nine in 1 hour and 45 minutes. Your group consistent pace means a comfortable consistent pace for everyone. Keep "pace" Means stay up with the group you teed off behind. Sounds simple, doesn't it?

"The Rabbits"

Groups which play faster than the pace of play guidelines need to adjust their pace if they are "pushing" other groups who are moving at a reasonable pace. Playing through is not permitted as it only delays the rest of the course.

"The Tortoises"

Groups which play slower than the pace of play guidelines will need to improve their pace if they are holding up groups behind them. Slow groups who are delaying the players behind will be required to pick up their ball, skip a $\frac{1}{2}$ or one hole and let the ranger direct them to drop behind the group they were in front of.

In order for any pace of play program to work, everyone's cooperation is needed 100% of the time. By following the guidelines listed and becoming more aware of our own pace of play we can make this work!

Let's hope that our scores get lower as our enjoyment gets higher! Remember it is a player's responsibility to keep pace with the group in front of them not the group behind them.


