In reference to Hong Kong. This Society is satisfied from the documents submitted, and from the statement of the Attorney General of Hong Kong that the Examiners there conform as far as practicable to the regulations for the time being by which the examination of persons intending to become bound and offhandicats for admission to practice in England are governed, that the Solicitors of Hong Kong possess proper qualifications and competency within
