
### DAY 1

Travelling by train across the border and climbing high into the mountains along the glorious **Highland Line** through Stirling. Perth and Aviemore to the city of Inverness. (D)

### DAY 2

A highlight of your holiday - travelling by train on one of the world's finest coast-to-coast railway journeys to the Kyle of Lochalsh, immortalised in Michael Palin's original "Great Railway Journeys of the World" TV series.





We roam the glorious Highlands and take a "Great Railway Journey of the World" on this all-rail escorted holiday. Relax as magnificent vistas glide past your window and the sensational views unfold.



The train stops briefly at the tiny townships of Achnashellach and Achnasheen before descending through forest and glen to Loch Carron and the west coast of Scotland.

As the train clings to the rocky shoreline you are rewarded with dream-like vistas across this mighty sea loch to the skyline of the dark Cuillin Hills, majestically dominant on the Isle of Skye, before we slowly draw into Kyle of Lochalsh, our journey's end. Here we take refreshments at the Lochalsh Hotel, with time to relax and view 'across the water' to Skye - a view described by Michael Palin as 'one of the great breakfast table views of the world', (B.T.D)

### DAY 3

Today's scenic rail journey is one of many contrasts, as we take the Far North Line through Caithness, one of the last true wildernesses in Europe, to Thurso on the most northerly shoreline of Britain. A two hour break gives time to stretch your legs, stroll along the riverside and seafront and explore some of the enthralling history of the area at the fascinating "Caithness Horizons", before experiencing more dramatic scenery en route back to Inverness. ### DAY 4

After breakfast it is time to bid farewell to the Highlands and return by train southwards past the Cairngorm Mountains and down through the Lowlands to Edinburgh and homeward stations. (B)



We travel by train to historic Chester, where our hotel is conveniently close to the railway station (D)


### DAY 2

Today we relax on our lovely circular train iourney of mountain vistas and seascapes. We travel through the hills of mid-Wales to the estuary of the **Dovey**; turning north our train hugs the coast as castles and the mountains

of **Snowdonia** come into view. At Porthmadog we board our narrow gauge steam train and climb inland to Blaenau Ffestiniog: here we transfer to our branch line train to descend the beautiful Conwy Valley, before journeying along the North Wales coast and turning inland again to Chester. (B,D)

### DAY 3

We head into the scenic heart of Wales by coach to experience two of Wales' great little railways. At Llanuwchllyn we join the Bala Lake Railway, a nine mile steam return journey offering lovely views of Bala Lake (Llyn Tegid) and the natural beauty of the Snowdonia National Park. After refreshments at the station buffet we continue to Llanfair for an 8 mile steam hauled journey to Welshpool on the charming narrow gauge Welshpool & Llanfair Railway, dating back to 1903. (B,T,D)

### DAY 4

It's time to bid farewell to **Chester** and return by train to homeward stations. If you would like free time in the morning to explore Chester more, please state this at the time of booking. (B)

### DAY 1

Experience one of England's most quintessential holiday welcoming moments - the great railway journey along the sea wall at Dawlish, before climbing high into the rural pasturelands of the Devon hills then descending back to the coast to arrive on the English Riviera at Torquay. We transfer to the Headland Hotel in its magnificent location, commanding the seascape. (D)





A wonderful short break on the English Riviera to explore the beauty and charm of Devon's magnificent coast by boat and two of Devon's finest steam railways.



### DAY 2

We transfer by vintage bus to **Totnes**, where we join the oldest preserved steam railway in the south-west, the **South Devon Railway**. Following a pretty route through the Dart Valley on a former GWR branch line, we follow a scenic seven mile journey connecting the beautifully maintained stations at **Totnes** and **Buckfastleigh**. After free time we return to Torquay by vintage bus. The day is then free for you to enjoy at leisure in **Torquay**; perhaps take "the mile" stroll around the harbour and seafront spotting the clues linked to a character in Dame Agatha's books, or take the sea ferry to Brixham, home of the "Golden Hind" replica of the iconic Tudor ship. (B,D)

### DAY<sub>3</sub>

Today we travel by **steam train** alongside the English Riviera coastline to Churston, then on through the wooded slopes of Long Wood bordering the Dart Estuary to Kingswear. We take a short ferry crossing to the historic resort of **Dartmouth** where there is free time for some sightseeing and a gentle circular **river cruise** viewing Bayards Cove, Kingswear and Dartmouth Castles, Britannia Royal Naval College, Dittisham Village, and Sir Walter Raleigh's Boathouse. We return by steam train to Paignton, and onwards to our hotel. (B.D)

We bid farewell to new found friends and transfer to Torquay station for homeward rail journeys. (B)

Upon our return to **Fort William** we have time for lunch and to wander the shops, before we take our tour of the fascinating **Ben Nevis whisky distillery**, concluding with a wee dram. We

then soar skyward in a **Nevis Range gondola** on our adventure to experience stunning panoramic views of the Highlands and Ben Nevis itself. (B,D)

### DAY 3

Today our adventure continues aboard the Jacobite steam train\* to Mallaig, journeying over the impressive Glenfinnan Viaduct, capturing the views of Bonnie Prince Charlie's monument, Loch Shiel and Loch Eilt, before the line turns north with astonishing vistas to the Atlantic coastline of golden white sands. There is time to explore the harbour town of Mallaig, with its majestic views across to the sle of Skye, before we return to Fort William on our great railway journey of dramatic and captivating scenes. (B.D)

### DAY 4

The beautiful rail journey from Fort William back to Glasgow concludes our holiday, passing across remote moors and through the glens to **Loch Lomond** and finally along the shores of the Clyde as we approach Glasgow for homeward trains. (B)

Introducing four great preserved railways and a scenic mainline on one tour based in the Heart of Wales spa town of Llandrindod Wells. View coastlines, vales, reservoirs and mountains from your window on the Vale of Rheidol Railway, the Heart of Wales Line, the Brecon Mountain Railway, the Pontypool & Blaenavon Railway and, last but not least, the Talyllyn, the world's first ever preserved railway.




the Fathew Valley, passing Dolgoch Falls. Opened in 1865 to carry slate, the railway fell on hard times in the early 1950s. A team of pioneering enthusiasts took over the running of the line and built the world's first preserved railway. Our coach then transports us south to Aberystwyth, where there is free time to take lunch before our journey by steam train through the beautiful Rheidol Valley. The Vale of Rheidol Railway is one of the Great Little Trains of Wales, running between Aberystwyth on the Cambrian coast and Devils Bridge. See the countryside change as you travel through wide open fields, woodland and rugged mountain scenery, the line twisting and turning as it clings to the hillside.

### DAY 4

We travel by coach to the **Blaenavon UNESCO World Heritage site**, where free time allows you to visit the preserved town or the Big Pit Museum to uncover the rich industrial heritage of South Wales. A highlight of the visit is the **Pontypool & Blaenavon Railway**, which transports us through the heritage site. This afternoon we continue to Pant for a journey on the **Brecon Mountain Railway**. Formerly part of the Brecon & Merthyr Railway, the line passes the full length of the Pontsticill Reservoir on its way to Torpantau, high in the Brecon Beacons. (B,D)

### DAY 1

Our tour begins in **Leeds** and the city's superb **Queens Hotel**, a Grade II listed building oozing Art Deco style next to Leeds Station. After meeting your Tour Manager, uncover the city's Victorian architecture before we dine together for the first time. (D)

### DAY 2

Departing Leeds, we head northwards on one of the great railway journeys of the UK. Heading north, we pass Bingley's **Five Rise Locks**, and **Skipton** on the edge of the Yorkshire Dales. From here the scenery becomes more dramatic, as we cross the Pennines on the famous **Settle & Carlisle Line**, trundling over **Ribblehead Viaduct** and passing Dent, England's highest mainline station. British Citizens: For European and Worldwide tours a full ten year passport is required, and many countries stipulate that it is valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date. It is your responsibility to have a valid passport. Please allow at least one month and preferably three months for issue or renewal. We will advise you at the time of booking of any visa requirements.

If you are not a British Citizen you must also check immigration requirements with the appropriate embassy or consulate of the country/countries that you plan to visit or travel through.

### OVERSEAS HEALTHCARE INFORMATION

For European tours: A European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) allows EU citizens access to reduced-cost, sometimes free, medical treatment that may become necessary during your holiday in a European Union (EU) country and Switzerland. To apply by post, pick up an EHIC form from the Post Office.

For Worldwide tours: We will advise you at the time of booking of any health precautions and immunisations recommdended that we are aware of at the time of going to press with our tour information, but you should also seek advice from a qualified medical practitioner.

The following Booking Conditions together with the information contained in our Brochure, Website, Tour Details and Itinerary form the basis of your contract with us. Please read them carefully as they apply to all bookings you make with us and set out our respective rights and

In these conditions 'we' and 'ourselves' means Railtrail Tours Limited; 'you' means the person making the booking to travel on a Tour, and includes any person travelling with or in the care of you or for whom you make any booking arrangements with the Company. 'Hotel' includes any accommodation provided or offered to you.

### 1. CONSUMER PROTECTION

In accordance with the provisions of article 7 of the EC package travel directive 90/314, your tour monies are held in a specially designated trust account until completion of the holiday. In the unlikely event of our insolvency the Trustee will refund all monies paid by yourselves from that

If you have booked your Railtrail holiday via an authorised travel agent all monies are held by that agent until paid to us or refunded to you. In the unlikely event of the travel agent's insolvency we cannot be held responsible for any monies paid by you to the travel agent but not subsequently transferred to Railtrail Tours Ltd.

All rail tickets issued by Railtrail Tours Ltd are guaranteed good for travel by the Rail Settlement Plan Ltd.

All the flights and flight-inclusive holidays in this brochure are financially protected by the ATOL scheme. When you pay you will be supplied with an ATOL Certificate. Please ask for it and check to ensure that everything you booked (flights, hotels and other services) is listed on it. Please see below for further information, or for more information about financial protection and the ATOL Certificate go to: www.atol.org.uk. Our ATOL number is 9056. 



We also visit the Stasi Museum, where the office of the former head of the Secret Police remains eerily untouched as a relic. Our day ends at Treptower Park, an extensive Soviet memorial to those who perished liberating Berlin. As well as being the resting place of 5,000 soldiers, the park has a series of typically triumphant Soviet sculptures portraying the Battle for Berlin. The remainder of the day is then at your leisure to explore Berlin further. (B,D)

#### DAY 4

We continue our train journey across the border into Poland to **Swiebodzin** and board our





Relax once more in **Desenzano** or enjoy the hotel's facilities, which include an outdoor pool. (B,D)

#### DAY 8

Our coach takes us northwards along the eastern side of the lake to **Malcesine**, where the rolling vineyards of the southern part of Lake Garda develop into brooding mountains and the broad expanse of water narrows considerably, affording the lake an almost fjord-like ambience, with dramatic cliffs rising from the water's edge. After free time in Malcesine, a town dominated by the Scaligeri Castle, we take a **cable car to the summit of Monte Baldo**, Lake Garda's highest mountain, climbing to 1750m with stunning panoramas of the lake. (B,D)

#### DAY 1
