About the Centre



The campus is situated in the Royal Borough of Greenwich in the southeast of London. It is 14 kilometres from the centre of London and the local train station has direct trains with the famous Charing Cross (20-minute travel time). It is an urban area with a lot of open green space- parklands, fields and woodlands with modern sports facilities for the public. There is a very vibrant town centre with many shops, pubs and restaurants. Some great places to see include the National Maritime Museum, The Greenwich Royal Observatory, The Cutty Sark (the world's famous tea ship) and the Greenwich Pier from where you can catch a boat along the River Thames to the Shard in Central London.

Campus



The PLUS centre is located at Avery Hill campus, University of Greenwich. The Campus is a secure university setting and there are two Victorian buildings: Mansion Site and Southwood Site. Both of these buildings are in the 86-acre Avery Hill Park in Eltham. They have excellent teaching, living and sporting facilities. The classrooms, accommodation and cafeteria are 5 minutes walk away from each other. The campus is about 20 minutes walk to Eltham town centre and it is easy to get there by public transport. Near the campus there are plenty of restaurants, cinemas, a 28-lane bowling alley, and the historic Eltham Palace.

About the Centre



Twickenham is situated in south west London on the River Thames, about 15 km from the centre of London. It is a leafy area surrounded by ancient buildings and modern houses. Twickenham is full of attractive tree-lined residential streets with a wide variety of cafes, pubs and restaurants. It has a vibrant town centre with a range of shops selling items such as antiques, unique gifts, books, jewellery and designer goods. The area is popular for the famous Twickenham Stadium - the largest rugby venue in the world. It is well connected to central London by rail in just 35 minutes. The town centre is 15-minute walk from the campus and is a perfect location for a relaxing afternoon.

Campus



The Plus centre is a secure campus located at St. Mary's University. It has a mix of historic and modern buildings surrounded by extensive sports grounds. The focal point of the campus is Strawberry Hill House - a 300 year-old elegant house that resembles a fairytale castle. The Plus campus provides students with modern Sports centre and a variety of pitches and courts. The main train station, Strawberry Hill is only a 5-minute walk away from campus. There is also a bus stop just outside the campus gates.

About the Centre



Medway is located in the south east of England around 60 kilometres from Central London. The area consists of five smaller towns - Strood, Rochester, Gillingham, Rainham and Chatham. The nearest railway station, Chatham, links Medway to Central London in just 40 minutes. Medway is a vibrant destination with a variety of attractions nearby including the famous Rochester, Upnor and Leeds Castles, Rochester Cathedral, Chatham Historic Dockyard and the Museum of Royal Engineers, to bustling street festivals and international sporting events. There are many green areas, parks, restaurants, pubs and cinemas. The buildings are mostly brick houses and Victorian and offer a truly British experience.

Campus



The PLUS centre is located in the University of Greenwich, Chatham Campus, based at Chatham Maritime, near the historic Chatham Dockyard. The university is a secure environment consisting of Edwardian red-brick buildings, world-class teaching, living and sporting facilities and a lot of green areas. The campus offers a good mix of social and leisure facilities with nearby restaurants, cafes, shops and bars. There is very easy access to the town centre (25 minutes walk or 10 minutes bus ride) which is home to a shopping centre with lots of restaurants, cafes and entertainment spots. There is also a train station in the town centre which offers direct trains to Central London.

Ground Zero



In remembrance of 9/11, this walking tour guides you through the former World Trade Center in New York, where the tragic events of 9/11 took place.

World Trade Center



This is the principal memorial commemorating the 9/11 attacks of 2001 and 1993 WTC bombing. It is located at the site of the former Twin Towers that were destroyed.

The 9/11 Memorial features two enormous waterfalls and reflecting pools, each about an acre in size, set within the footprints of the original twin towers. The Memorial Plaza is one of the most eco-friendly plazas ever constructed.

A memorial was planned in the immediate aftermath of the attacks and destruction of the World Trade Center for the victims and those involved in rescue operations.

Walk through Wall Street. It's a 0.7 miles (1.1 km), eight-block-long, street running west to east from Broadway to South Street. Wall Street is the home of the New York Stock Exchange, the world's largest stock exchange by overall average daily trading volume and by total market capitalization of its listed companies. Several other major exchanges have or had headquarters in the Wall Street area, including NASDAQ, the New York Mercantile Exchange, the New York Board of Trade, and the former American Stock Exchange.

Charging Bull



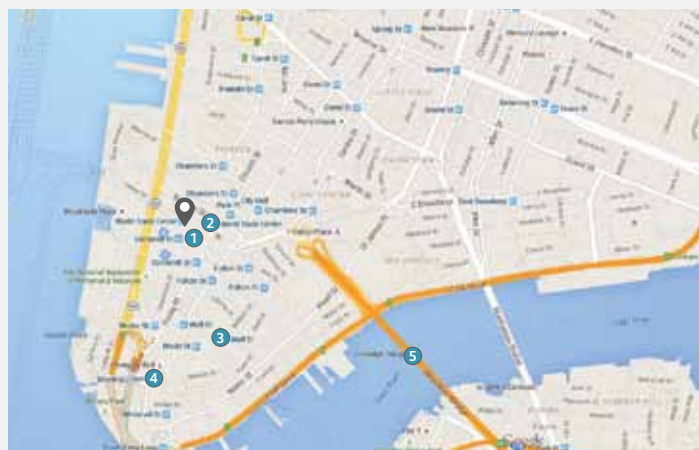
Charging Bull, which is sometimes referred to as the Wall Street Bull or the Bowling Green Bull, is a bronze sculpture, originally guerilla art, by Arturo Di Modica that stands in Bowling Green Park in Manhattan, New York. The oversize sculpture depicts a bull, the symbol of aggressive financial optimism and prosperity, leaning back on its haunches and with its head lowered as if ready to charge. The bronze color and hard, emphasizes the brute force of the creature. The work was designed and placed so that viewers could walk around it, which also suggests the creature's own movement is unrestricted a point reinforced by the twisting posture of the bull's body.

Brooklyn Bridge



The Brooklyn Bridge is a hybrid cable-stayed/suspension bridge and is one of the oldest bridges of either type in the United States. Completed in 1883, it connects the boroughs of Manhattan and Brooklyn by spanning the East River. You can walk it, drive it, bike it, or just admire it. One way or the other, the Brooklyn Bridge soaring over the East River is one of New York City's most famous routes, both for tourists and born-and bred New Yorkers. The great appeal of the Brooklyn Bridge is that the view is all around you: Look up to see the famous steel-cable suspension grid, look down at the water of the New York harbor, Manhattan, turn back to see the skyline views expand.

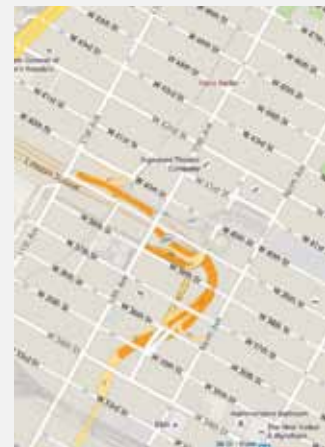

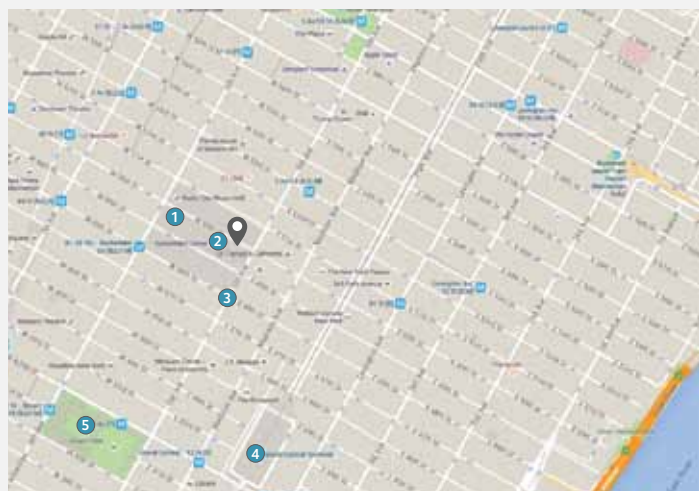

Liberty State Park



Liberty State Park is located on Upper New York Bay in Jersey City, New Jersey, opposite Liberty Island and Ellis Island. The LIBERTY WALK promenade graces the eastern edge of Liberty State Park, and is a 1.3 mile stroll from the park office and Statue of Liberty overlook to the partially restored CRRNJ Terminal. During the 19th and early 20th centuries, after being greeted by the Statue of Liberty and processed at Ellis Island immigrants purchased tickets and boarded trains, at the CRRNJ Terminal, that took them to their new homes throughout the United States. The Terminal served these immigrants as the gateway to the realization of their hopes and dreams of a new life in America.

Ellis Island



Ellis Island is an island that is located in Upper New York Bay. It was the gateway for millions of immigration to the United States as the nation's busiest immigrant inspection station from 1892 until 1954.

Bay in the Port of New York and New Jersey. The island was made part of the Statue of Liberty National Monument in 1965, and has hosted a museum of immigration since 1990. It is a place where visitors can spend hours learning about Ellis Island's history before, during, and after its use as America's immigration station.

Statue of Liberty



The Statue of Liberty is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbor in New York City. The copper statue, designed by Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi, a French sculptor, and dedicated on October 28, 1886, was a gift to the United States from the people of France.

The statue was constructed in France, shipped overseas in crates, and assembled on the completed pedestal on what was then called Bedloe's Island. The statue is of a robed female figure representing Libertas, the Roman Goddess, who bears a torch and a tabula ansta (a tablet evoking the law) upon which is inscribed the date of the American Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776. A broken chain lies at her feet. The statue is an icon of freedom and of the United States: a welcoming signal to immigrants arriving from abroad.

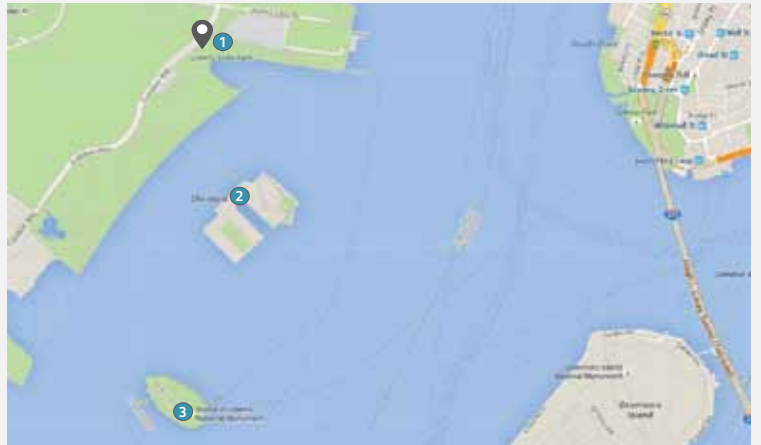

Enjoy a walk through Strawberry Fields, it's a 2.5 acre (1.0 ha) landscaped section in New York City's Central Park that is dedicated to the memory of former Beatle, John Lennon. It is named after the Beatles' song "Strawberry Field Forever" written by Lennon. The iconic black and white Imagine mosaic, designed by a team of artists from the Italian city of Naples, lies in the center of Strawberry Fields. Named after another famous song by John Lennon, "Imagine" evokes a vision and hope for a world without strife, war and conflict.

Bethesda Terrace



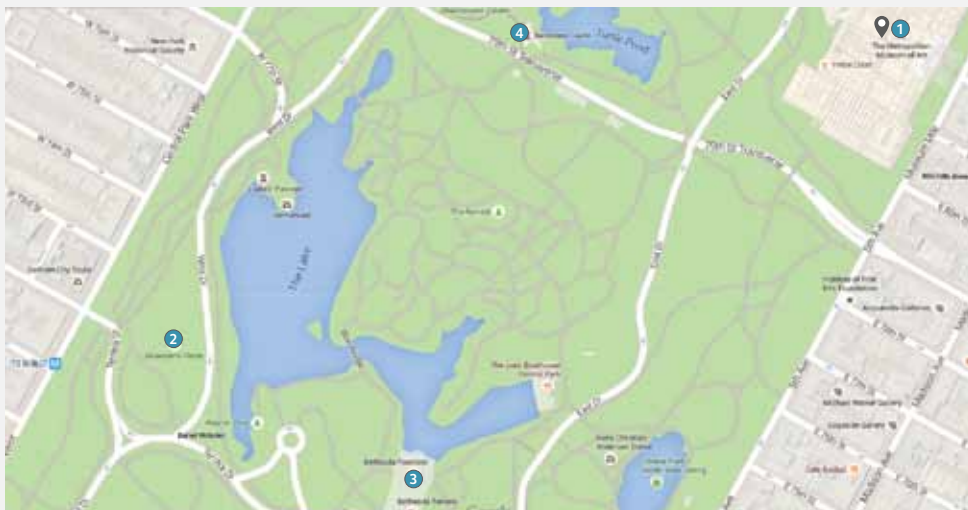
Bethesda Terrace and Fountain overlook The Lake in New York City's Central Park. The fountain is located in the center of the terrace. The Fountain, with the famous Angel of the Waters statue atop. The statue references the Gospel of John, which describes an angel blessing the Pool of Bethesda and giving it healing powers. The fountain commemorates the Croton water system, which first brought fresh water to New York City in 1842. The angel carries a lily in her left hand a symbol of the water's purity, very important to a city that had previously suffered from a devastating cholera epidemic.

Belvedere Castle



Belvedere Castle is a folly in Central Park. It contains exhibit rooms and an observation deck, and since 1919, the folly has also been the location of the official Central Park weather station. Named for the Italian meaning "beautiful view," Central Park's Belvedere Castle offers park goers exactly what its name implies. With its two balconies, it supplies wonderful panoramic views that include some of Central Park's most beautiful and famous landmarks: the Delacorte Theater, the Great Lawn, the Turtle Pond and the Ramble.

Liberty State Park



Liberty State Park is located on Upper New York Bay in Jersey City, New Jersey, opposite Liberty Island and Ellis Island. The LIBERTY WALK promenade graces the eastern edge of Liberty State Park, and is a 1.3 mile stroll from the park office and Statue of Liberty overlook to the partially restored CRRNJ Terminal. During the 19th and early 20th centuries, after being greeted by the Statue of Liberty and processed at Ellis Island immigrants purchased tickets and boarded trains, at the CRRNJ Terminal, that took them to their new homes throughout the United States. The Terminal served these immigrants as the gateway to the realization of their hopes and dreams of a new life in America.

2

Ellis Island



Ellis Island is an island that is located in Upper New York Bay. It was the gateway for millions of immigration to the United States as the nation's busiest immigrant inspection station from 1892 until 1954.

Bay in the Port of New York and New Jersey. The island was made part of the Statue of Liberty National Monument in 1965, and has hosted a museum of immigration since 1990. It is a place where visitors can spend hours learning about Ellis Island's history before, during, and after its use as America's immigration station.

The museum also tells the stories of why so many people immigrated to America. Ellis Island has become a place where families and individuals celebrate and honor those family members who made the arduous journey to a new life in America and what became of them after they arrived.

Statue of Liberty



The Statue of Liberty is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbor in New York City.

The copper statue, designed by Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi, a French sculptor, and dedicated on October 28, 1886, was a gift to the United States from the people of France.

The statue was constructed in France, shipped overseas in crates, and assembled on the completed pedestal on what was then called Bedloe's Island. The statue is of a robed female figure representing Libertas, the Roman Goddess, who bears a torch and a tabula ansta (a tablet evoking the law) upon which is inscribed the date of the American Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776.

A broken chain lies at her feet. The statue is an icon of freedom and of the United States: a welcoming signal to immigrants arriving from abroad.

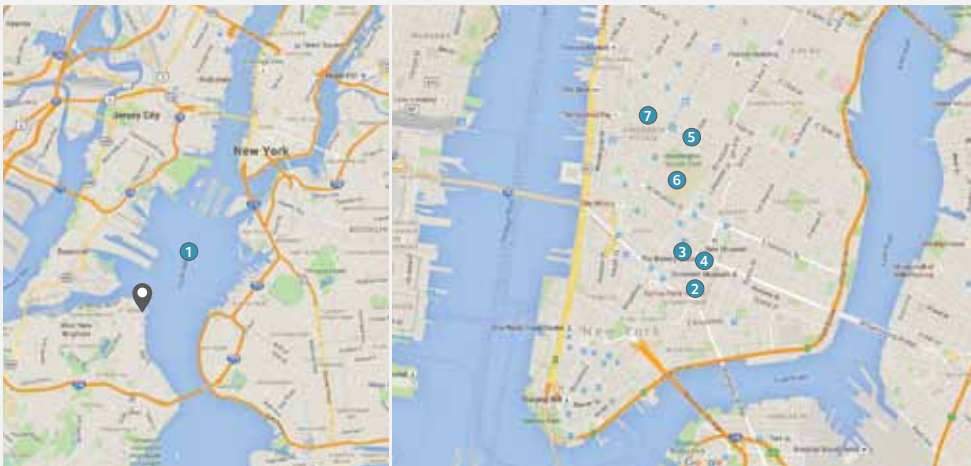

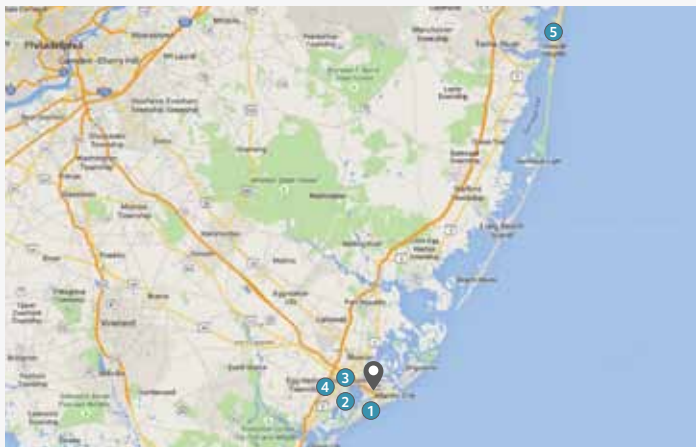

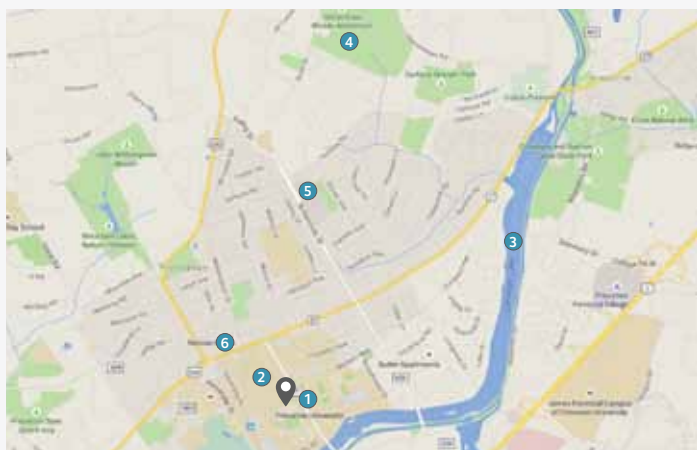

Liberty Bell



The Liberty Bell is an iconic symbol of American independence, located in Philadelphia. The State House bell became a herald of liberty in the 19th century. “Proclaim Liberty Throughout All the Land Unto All the Inhabitants thereof,” the bell’s inscription, provided a rallying cry for abolitionists wishing to end slavery. It’s this bell that would ring to call lawmakers to their meetings and the townspeople together to hear the reading of the news.

It’s not until the 1830’s that the old State House bell would begin to take on significance as a symbol of liberty. That bell cracked on the first test ring. Local metalworkers John Pass and John Stow melted down that bell and cast a new one right here in Philadelphia.

3

J. F. Kennedy Plaza



John F. Kennedy Plaza is located in the City Center of Philadelphia and gets its famed nickname “LOVE Park” due to its famous sculpture. Located near City Hall, LOVE Park serves as the grand entrance to the Benjamin Franklin Parkway. The plaza, designed by famed City Planner Edmond Bacon, father of actor Kevin Bacon, was originally constructed 1965.

Robert Indiana’s iconic LOVE statue was not installed until the bicentennial in 1976. Aside from photo opportunities, LOVE Park also features the Fairmount Park Welcome Center and Gift Shop and is a favorite spot to grab a bite to eat from some of the city’s top food trucks.

As famous as the statue itself is, the stairs leading to the East Entrance of the Museum, aka "The Rocky Steps," may be even more famous.

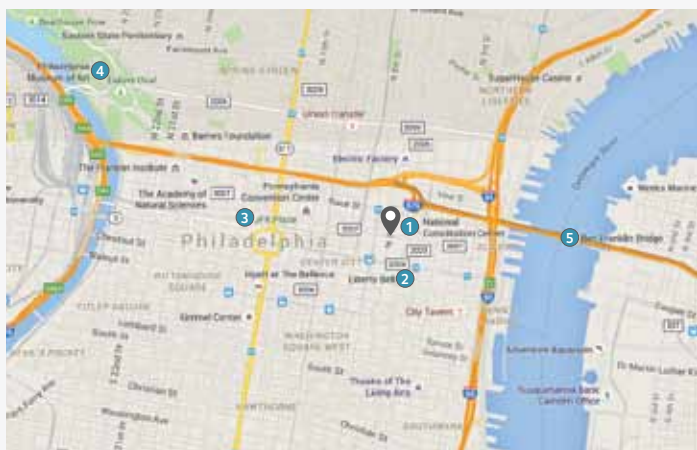

Franklin Bridge



The Benjamin Franklin Bridge – opened to traffic on July 1, 1926 as the Delaware River Port Authority Bridge. In 1956 it was renamed Benjamin Franklin Bridge, after one of the Founding Fathers and one of Philadelphia's most famous citizens. It's a suspension bridge across the Delaware .

The bridge was designed to accommodate six lanes of traffic, two tracks for subway/elevated trains, two track areas for streetcar/trolley operation, and two walkways for pedestrians. In 1987 a computerized lighting system was added to the bridge as part of the celebration of the Bicentennial of the US Constitution. This makes the bridge a colorful spectacle at night.

White House



The White House is the official residence and principal workplace of the President of the United States, located at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue NW in Washington, D.C. It has been the residence of every U.S. president since John Adams in 1800. The modern-day White House complex includes the Executive Residence, West Wing, East Wing, the Eisenhower Executive Office Building the former State Department, which now houses offices for the President's staff and the Vice President and Blair House, a guest residence.

Capitol Center



The Capitol is among the most architecturally impressive and symbolically important buildings in the world. The Senate and the House of Representatives have met here for more than two centuries. Begun in 1793, the Capitol has been burnt, rebuilt, extended, and restored; today, it stands as a monument not only to its builders but also to the American people and their government. Once inside the historic Capitol, visitors will see the Crypt, the Rotunda, and National Statuary Hall.

3

National Museum of American History



The National Museum of American History: Kenneth E. Behring Center collects, preserves and displays the heritage of the United States in the areas of social, political, cultural, scientific and military history. The museum is part of the Smithsonian Institution and located on the National Mall. It was the sixth Smithsonian building to open on the National Mall, and is now considered a National Historical Landmark. Among the items on display are the original Star-Spangled Banner and Archie Bunker's chair.

4

Washington Monument



The Washington Monument dominates the United States Capital skyline as a symbolic tribute to George Washington's military leadership, humble statesmanship, and Presidential fortitude and wisdom. Constructed from marble, granite and gneiss, the Monument is the world's tallest free-standing stone structure, towering more than 555 feet (169 meters). Fifty American flags (not state flags), one for each state, are now flown 24 hours a day around a large circle centered on the monument.

5

Lincoln Memorial



The Lincoln Memorial is an American National Monument built to honor the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln. It is located on the western end of the National Mall. The building is in the form of a Greek Doric temple and contains a large seated sculpture of Abraham Lincoln and inscriptions of two well-known speeches by Lincoln: The Gettysburg Address and his Second Inaugural Address. The memorial has been the site of many famous speeches, including Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech.

World War II Memorial



The National World War II Memorial is a national memorial dedicated to Americans who served in the armed forces and as civilians during World War II. Consisting of 56 pillars and a pair of small triumphal arches surrounding a plaza and fountain, it sits on the National Mall at the eastern end of the Reflecting Pool. The Freedom Wall has 4,048 gold stars, each representing 100 Americans who died in the war. In front of the wall lies the message “Here we mark the price of freedom”.

Pentagon



The Pentagon is the headquarters of the United States Department of Defense, located in Arlington County, Virginia. As a symbol of the U.S. military, “the Pentagon” is often used metonymically to refer to the U.S. Department of Defense. The Pentagon is virtually a city in itself. Approximately 23,000 employees, both military and civilian, contribute to the planning and execution of the defense of our country.

Arlington Cemetery



Arlington National Cemetery is a United States military cemetery in Arlington County, Virginia, across the Potomac River, in whose 624 acres have been buried the dead of the nation’s conflicts beginning with the American Civil War. There are only two U.S. presidents buried here, John F. Kennedy and William Howard Taft. Some others are Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy Onassis and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Hollywood Walk of Fame



The Hollywood Walk of Fame comprises more than 2,500 five-pointed terrazzo and brass stars embedded in the sidewalks along 15 blocks of Hollywood Boulevard and three blocks of Vine Street in Hollywood, California. The stars are permanent public monuments to achievement in the entertainment industry, bearing the names of a mix of actors, musicians, directors, producers, musical and theatrical groups, fictional characters, and others.

TCL Chinese Theatre



One of Hollywood's most iconic and memorable sites, the TCL Chinese Theatre (originally Grauman's Chinese Theatre) opened in 1927 and represents the excess of Hollywood's Golden Age when lavishly-designed theaters were the movie-going standard. With pagodas, temple bells and stone Heaven Dogs imported from China, Grauman's Chinese Theatre was a wonder when it opened in 1927 – and this recently restored giant red pagoda with a huge green dragon remains so today.

The Dolby Theatre (formerly known as the Kodak Theatre) is a live-performance auditorium in the Hollywood and Highland shopping mall and entertainment complex, on Hollywood Boulevard. Inspired by the elegance of a European opera house, with state-of-the-art technical capabilities, Dolby Theatre has been host to many of the world's top performers including Celine Dion, Prince, Barry Manilow, Alicia Keys and the Dixie Chicks. 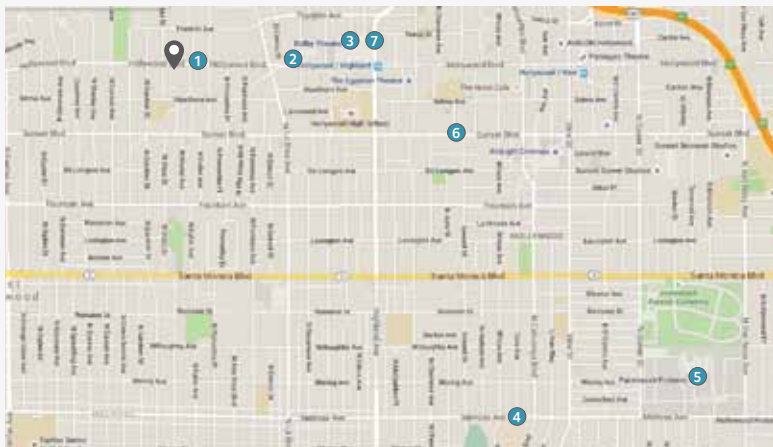

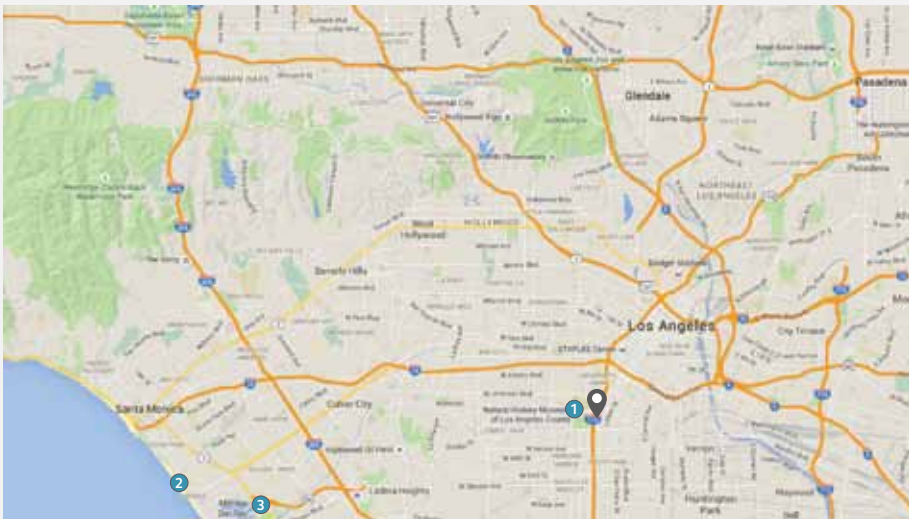

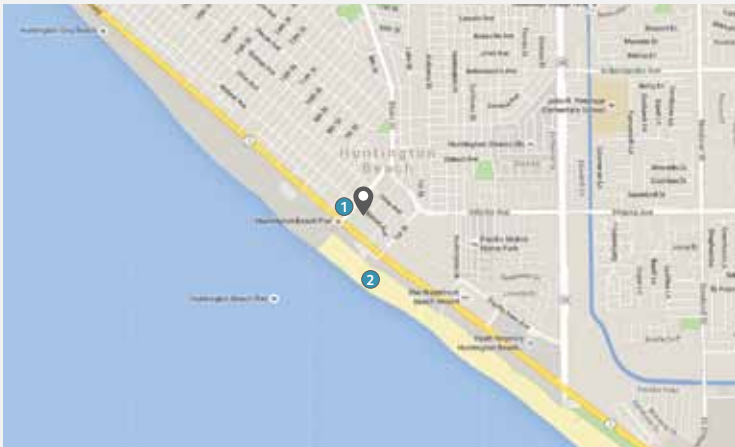

Cloud Gate



The Cloud Gate, also known as the bean, was designed by British artist Anish Kapoor. It is made up of 168 stainless steel plates welded together; its highly polished exterior has no visible seams. Its design was inspired by liquid mercury and the sculpture's surface reflects and distorts the city's skyline. Visitors are able to walk around and under Cloud Gate's 12-foot (3.7 m) high arch. On the underside is a concave chamber that warps and multiplies reflections. The sculpture is popular with tourists as a photo-taking opportunity for its unique reflective properties.

Crown Fountain



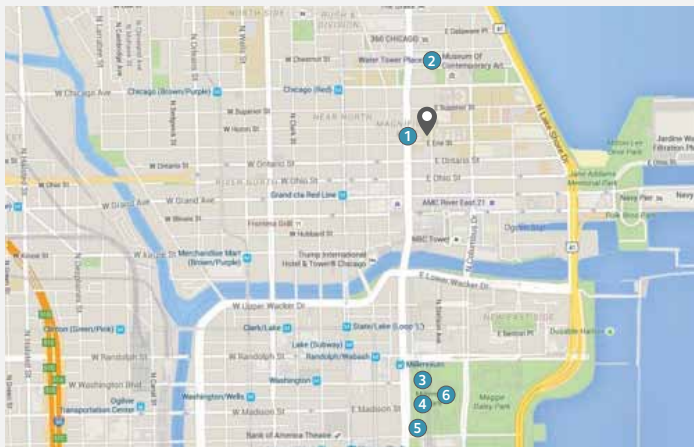
The fountain is composed of a black granite reflecting pool placed between a pair of glass brick towers. The towers are 50 feet (15.2 m) tall and they use LEDs to display digital videos on their side. It is a popular play area for young Chicagoans.

Lincoln Park Zoo



Lincoln Park Zoo is a 35-acre (14 ha) zoo located in Lincoln Park in Chicago.

The zoo's exhibits include big cats, polar bears, penguins, gorillas, reptiles, monkeys, and other species totaling about 1,100 animals from some 200 species. Also located in Lincoln Park Zoo is a burr oak tree which dates to 1830, three years before the city was founded.

Lincoln Park Conservatory



Lincoln Park Conservatory is a Victorian Era glass house, built in late nineteenth century. It contains four rooms displaying exotic plants from around the world. Rare orchids, like the Moth orchid, can be found in the Orchid room. A French-style formal garden is situated in front of the Conservatory; one of the oldest gardens in Chicago, designed and planted in the late 1870s.

Since its foundation, the formal garden has been the home of many sculptors and works of art. The most famous are the Bates fountains, the Schiller monument, and the Shakespeare monument.

Lincoln Park Nature Boardwalk is urban oasis with Nature Boardwalk at Lincoln Park Zoo! This new, natural ecosystem offers a haven for native birds, frogs, fish, turtles, insects and more.

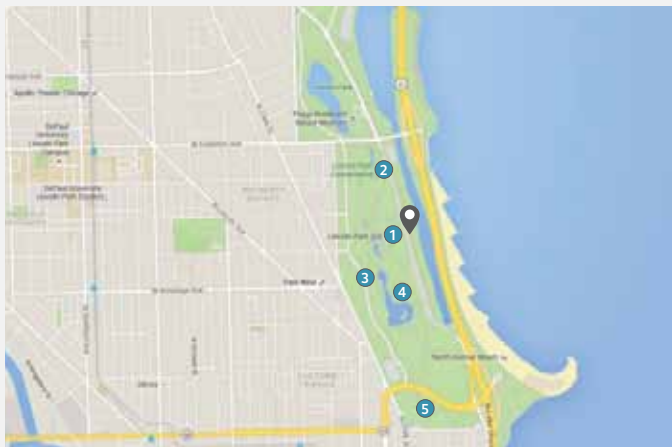

The Seven Noses of Soho and they are plaster casts of the artist Rick Buckleys' nose.

It is believed that there were over 30 noses around Soho back in 1997, but now there is only 10 because of vandalism.

Chinatown



Chinatown is the unofficial name for the area centred around

Gerrard Street. It is known as the tiny Chinese ghetto and it is home to about 60 000 Chinese in London. The area is primarily commercial and it is the focal point for the Chinese community. It has a number of Chinese restaurants, Chinese supermarkets and souvenir shops. Chinatown, as we can see it today, has been there since 1950s, however it goes much further back as it was originally in East End in the Limehouse but it burned down in the Great Fire of London. In the 50s when British soldiers came home from the Far East they had developed a taste for Chinese food and that is how the development of the current Chinatown started.

Leicester Square



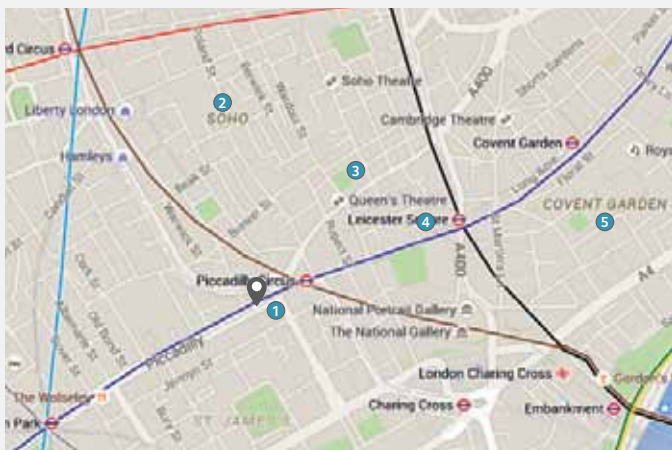

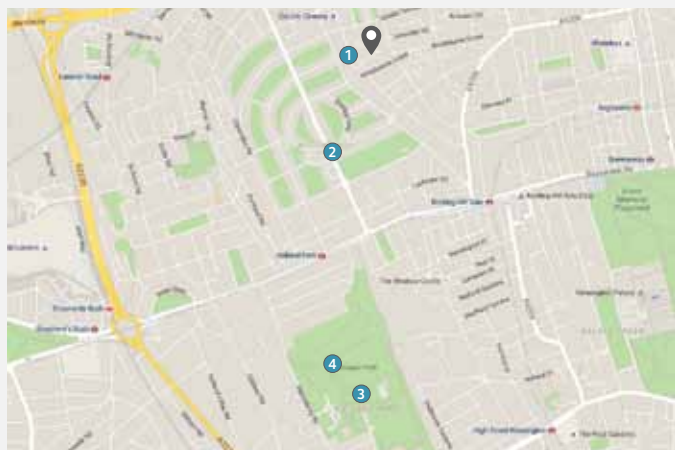

The Science Museum in London is the most visited science and technology museum in Europe. The Museum has over 15 000 objects on display, including the world-famous Apollo 10 command capsule and Stephenson's Rocket. The interactive galleries show the first scientific principles and contemporary science debates. You can also try what it is like to fly with the Red Arrows, blast into space on an Apollo Space mission in the 3D and 4D simulators or watch a film on a screen that is taller than four double-decker buses.

Natural History Museum



Natural History Museum is in one of the most beautiful landmark buildings in London. The Museum offers a wide range program of temporary exhibitions and events. Some of the highlights in the Museum are the Dinosaurs gallery, which explores the diversity of life on Earth, Mammals display with the model blue whale and the spectacular Central Hall with the Museum's iconic Diplodocus skeleton. You can also visit the state-of-the-art Darwin Centre Cocoon where you can see hundreds of specimens and have a look into laboratories where scientists are at work.

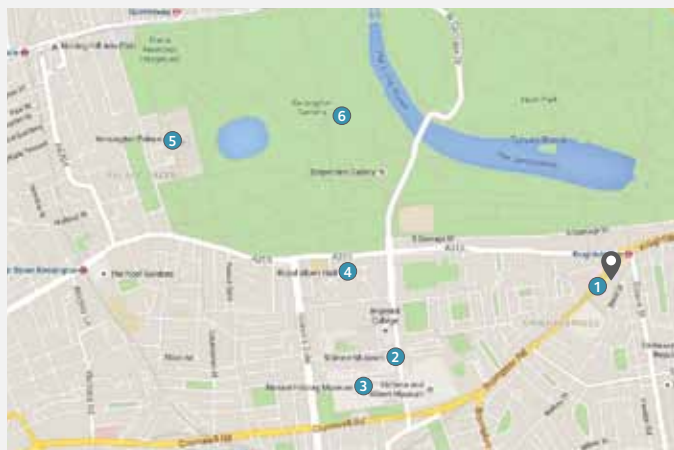

Kensington Palace



Kensington Palace has been a royal residence for about 300 years. The Palace is perhaps best known as once being the home of the Queen Victoria, and later lady Diana, Princess of Wales, but today the Palace is the official London residence for the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge (William and Kate). The Palace contains both offices and apartments for various members of the royal family. For some female members of the royal family life inside the Palace was quite depressing and isolating. Tower Hill



The full name of the Tower of London is Her Majesty's Royal Palace and Fortress, The Tower of London. The Tower was built as a royal palace and a defence system at the end of 1066.

The Tower is still officially a royal residence of Her Majesty The Queen. The crown jewels are being held in the tower and the estimated total value of the jewels is over £20 billion, but it is only an estimation based on the jewel's worth as jewels and including their relations to the Monarchy, but actually the crown jewels are priceless. Today the Tower is a designated World Heritage site by UNESCO and it is one of the few intact medieval buildings listed as a World Heritage Site.

Every evening, at precisely 9:53pm, a ceremony takes place to lock the Tower of London - the ceremony of the keys. An armed escort of the Queen's Guards set off with the Chief Yeoman Warder to lock all the gates.

2

Tower Bridge



Tower Bridge was built 120 years ago to ease road traffic but still maintaining river access to the London docks. The Bridge has giant movable roadways that lift up for passing ships. It is required to raise to provide access for registered ships of 30 feet or taller free of charge with 24 hour notice. It is available anytime for 365 days of the year. The Bridge is raised around 850 times in a year. In 1952 a London bus 78 had to leap from one side to the other because the bridge began to rise whilst the bus was still on it. Inside the Bridge there is the Tower Bridge Exhibition where you can learn about how one of the world's most famous bridge works and about the history of the Bridge.

3

Borough Market



Borough Market is London's oldest fruit and vegetable market. Alongside fruit and vegetables, bakers and butchers now sell a huge variety of British and international produce and it has grown to have over a 100 individual stalls. Borough Market is a charitable trust and its purpose is to provide a market for public benefit. The Market upholds a reputation as Britain's most renowned food market. Many of the traders are also the primary producers, and people know exactly who grow the food they sell.

Shakespeare's Globe



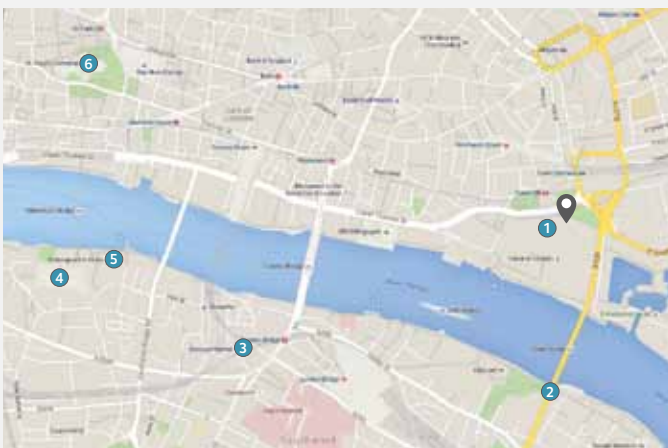
The Shakespeare's Globe was founded by an American actor and director Sam Wanamaker and it is dedicated to the exploration of Shakespeare's work. Together with the Globe Exhibition & Tour and Globe Education, the Globe Theatre seeks to further the experience and international understanding of Shakespeare in performance. The original Globe, designed in 1599, was a few hundred yards from its current site. The rebuilt open-air playhouse founded by Sam Wanamaker was opened for performances in 1997. Today in the Globe Theatre you can see Shakespeare's plays such as Romeo & Juliet, Macbeth, The Merchant of Venice and many more.

6

St Paul's Cathedral



St Paul's Cathedral was originally built in 604AD, however, the current cathedral is the fourth one that has been built. The now standing Cathedral was built between 1675 and 1710. The Cathedral was destroyed twice by fires and once by Vikings, however, it did survive World War II. Many important events have been held at the Cathedral, such as the funerals of Sir Winston Churchill, Duke of Wellington and Lord Nelson, the wedding of Prince Charles to Lady Diana Spencer and most recently the service for 80th Birthday of Her Majesty the Queen. There is a Whispering Gallery in the Cathedral where you can hear a whisper on the other side of the dome, 112 feet away. The dome is 366 feet high and it is the second largest in the world.

The Houses of Parliament, also known as the Palace of Westminster or Westminster Palace is the meeting place of the two houses of the Parliament of the United Kingdom the House of Lords and the House of Commons. The Houses of Parliament contains over 1,100 rooms, 100 staircases and 4.8 kilometres of passageways, which are spread over four floors.

3

Westminster Abbey



Westminster Abbey is one of the most notable religious buildings in London and it has been around since the 7th Century. It is a place of royal importance, a place of coronations, weddings, and funerals. Throughout its long history, it has accumulated many interesting stories, facts and persons.

10 Downing Street



10 Downing Street is probably one of the most well known addresses in the world. It is the home of the Prime Minister.

Horse Guards




Horse Guards is in front of the Horse Guards Parade. It was originally the main entrance to Buckingham Palace and some royal processions still pass under the arches of the building. The Queen takes the salute of the Trooping of The Colour ceremony on her official birthday on the parade ground.

Buckingham Palace is the official London residence of Her Majesty The Queen. It has been the official residence of Britain's sovereigns since 1837 and evolved from a town house to the grand palace it is today.

Piccadilly Circus



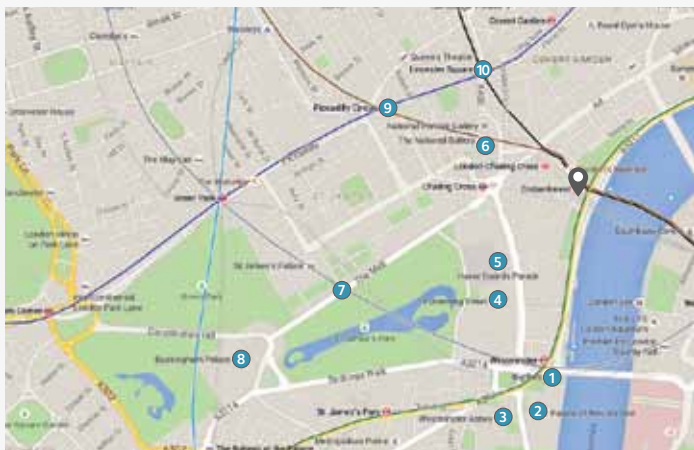
Piccadilly Circus is a famous road junction and public space of London's West End in the City of Westminster, built to connect Regent Street with the major shopping street of Piccadilly.

Shakespeare's Globe



The Shakespeare's Globe was founded by an American actor and director Sam Wanamaker and it is dedicated to the exploration of Shakespeare's work. Together with the Globe Exhibition & Tour and Globe Education, the Globe Theatre seeks to further the experience and international understanding of Shakespeare in performance. The original Globe, designed in 1599, was a few hundred yards from its current site. The rebuilt open-air playhouse founded by Sam Wanamaker was opened for performances in 1997. Today in the Globe Theatre you can see Shakespeare's plays such as Romeo & Juliet, Macbeth, The Merchant of Venice and many more.

2

Tower Bridge (view from London Bridge)



Tower Bridge was built 120 years ago to ease road traffic but still maintaining river access to the London docks. The Bridge has giant movable roadways that lift up for passing ships. It is required to raise to provide access for registered ships of 30 feet or taller free of charge with 24 hour notice. It is available anytime for 365 days of the year. The Bridge is raised around 850 times in a year. In 1952 a London bus 78 had to leap from one side to the other because the bridge began to rise whilst the bus was still on it. Inside the Bridge there is the Tower Bridge Exhibition where you can learn about how one of the world's most famous bridge works and about the history of the Bridge.

3

St Paul's Cathedral



St Paul's Cathedral was originally built in 604AD, however, the current cathedral is the fourth one that has been built. The now standing Cathedral was built between 1675 and 1710. The Cathedral was destroyed twice by fires and once by Vikings, however, it did survive World War II. Many important events have been held at the Cathedral, such as the funerals of Sir Winston Churchill, Duke of Wellington and Lord Nelson, the wedding of Prince Charles to Lady Diana Spencer and most recently the service for 80th Birthday of Her Majesty the Queen. There is a Whispering Gallery in the Cathedral where you can hear a whisper on the other side of the dome, 112 feet away. The dome is 366 feet high and it is the second largest in the world.

4

British Museum



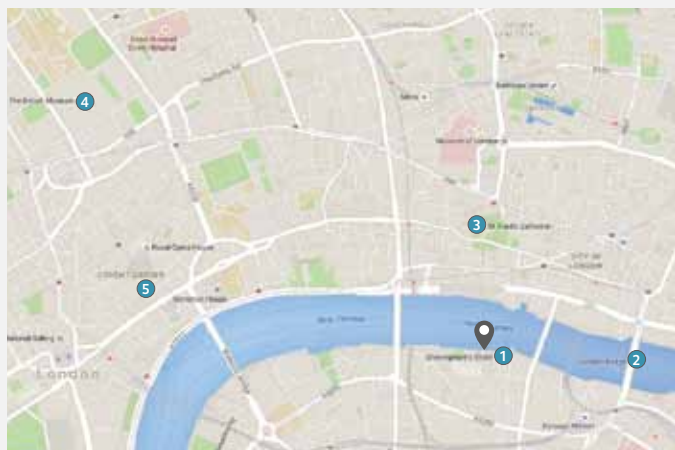
British Museum was founded in 1753 by Sir Hans Sloane (he also invented chocolate milk), but it was opened to the public in 1759. The museum's collection contains at least 8 million objects, but only 1%, or 80 000, of these objects are on display at the same time in the 194 designated store rooms. The collection in the Museum spans over two million years of human history. A few great attractions in the Museum are; the Great Court, which has a reading room in the middle of the court yard and looks more like an old fashion library, the Rosetta Stone, Elgin Marbles and the Egyptian mummies. The Museum is intended to be a place where humane cross-cultural investigation can happen.

5

Covent Garden



Covent Garden gets its name from a convent/monastery that used to locate the spot. The name is actually a spelling mistake, as it used to be a market for the convent. Ever since 1600's there has been some kind of a market in Covent Garden, but the current market was built in the 1830's. It was London's central fruit and vegetable market for 140 years. Covent Garden is usually used to describe the Covent Garden Market, but Covent Garden is actually an entire neighbourhood in London.

1

Clarendon Building



The Clarendon Building was built in the early 18th century to house the Oxford University Press. This Grade I listed building was named after Lord Clarendon who wrote the History of the Great Rebellion and some of the profits from the book was used to pay for the building. In the 19th century the building was used as a police station for a few years until it became the registry for the University of Oxford. The building is owned by the University of Oxford, and it is now part of the close by Bodleian library. Today the building is used as office and meeting space for senior members of staff as well as the Bodleian library's admissions department and the Victorian County History of Oxfordshire.

2

Sheldonian Theatre



The Sheldonian Theatre was built in 1668, and it was named after Gilbert Sheldon, the University Chancellor at the time. The building has a prominent eight-sided cupola in the centre of the roof. The cupola is accessible via a staircase leading to the dome over the main ceiling. The cupola has large windows on all sides, providing views across central Oxford. The Theatre is the official ceremonial hall of the University of Oxford. The Theatre can also be hired for music concerts, lectures, talks and other events.

3

Radcliffe Camera



The Radcliffe Camera was built in the 18th century to house the Radcliffe Science Library. The distinctive circular dome of the structure makes the Radcliffe Camera one of the most recognisable and photographed buildings in Oxford and it is the earliest example in England of a circular library. Today the Camera contains reading rooms used by undergraduates at the University. It is connected to the Old Library with a subway housing an underground book-storage. The Radcliffe Square, where the Radcliffe Camera stands, is widely regarded as the most beautiful square in Oxford.

4

University Church of St. Mary the Virgin



The University Church of St Mary the Virgin is the largest of Oxford's parish churches and it is the centre from which the University of Oxford grew. In the early 13th century when the University started to develop as scholars and teachers moved into halls of residence in Oxford, they needed a central meeting place and they came to the Church. It was used for academic lectures as well as Christian services. The importance of the Church did not diminish and it is still a site for major events within the University. The Church has one of the most beautiful spires in England and eccentric baroque porch.

5

Queen's College



The Queen's College was founded in 1341 as the 'Hall of the Queen's Scholars at Oxford'. It was established as a residence for fellows, chaplains 'poor boys' and various officials and servants. During Queen Elizabeth's reign it became one of the most popular colleges at Oxford. Since the 19th century the College has developed a strong academic reputation, whole solid funding and wise management have made it secure and successful.

6

Merton College



Merton College turned 750 last year, and it is the first fully self-governing College in the University of Oxford. It houses the Mob Library, which is the oldest continuously functioning library for university academics and students in the world. Over the centuries many notable scholars and cultural leaders have called Merton home, including JRR Tolkien who was a professor at Merton at the time the first volume of The Lord of the Rings was published. The College houses the Turf Tavern and some of its real life patrons have included Oscar Wilde, Richard Burton and Stephen Hawking.

7

Christ Church



Christ Church is one of the largest colleges in the University of Oxford, and it is the Cathedral Church for the Diocese of Oxford. Many distinguished people have studied at Christ Church including Albert Einstein and 13 Prime Ministers. The College also has a world famous Cathedral Choir; scholarly collections of books and art and much more. Today Christ Church is a vibrant academic community with about 425 undergraduate students and 250 graduate students. There are also around 100 teaching and research staff who are senior members of the College.

Grasmere

Grasmere is a charming village in the heart of the Lake District National Park, situated in a valley surrounded by the lush green slopes of the Lakeland hills. Lovely old cottages and houses built of the local blue-green slate sit along side the art galleries and shops that line the twisty streets of the village. Once home to the famous poet William Wordsworth, visitors can see his two former homes - Dove Cottage and Rydal Mount and Gardens. At the centre of the village is St. Oswald's Church which contains the Wordsworth family graves. It is only a short walk to the lake, which is superb especially in summer. Rowing boats are available for hire. Each year from the end of July to the beginning of September at Grasmere Village Hall is the Lake Artist Society Summer Exhibition, where some 300 exhibits by local artists and sculptors are on display.

Dove Cottage

Step into Dove Cottage to get a sense of that time: stone floors, dark panelled rooms, glowing coal fires and the family's own belongings. Little has changed in the house since the Wordsworths lived here. Stroll in the Dove Cottage garden, a place of refuge, meditation and inspiration.

Wordsworth Museum & Art Gallery

Next door to Dove Cottage, the new Wordsworth Museum houses a fascinating collection of letters, portraits and manuscripts relating to the Romantic movement.

St. Oswald's Church

In the churchyard of this tiny chapel in the centre of Grasmere are the Wordsworths's family graves: look out for tombstones belonging to including William,

Mary, Dorothy and all three children. Samuel Taylor Coleridge's son Hartley is also buried here.

Sarah Nelson's Gingerbread Shop

Today's Grasmere Gingerbread is made to a "secret recipe" popularized by Sarah Nelson (1815-1904). By the early 19th Century, Grasmere gingerbread was al-

ready being sold as fairings as well as being a popular seller in its own right.

A number of popular walks begin near the centre of the village, including the ascent of Helm Crag, a longer route up to Fairfield and a moderate 2 mile ascent to Easedale Tarn. Travelling time from Grasmere to Bowness-on-Windermere is only 20 minutes by coach.

Bowness-on-Windermere

Bowness is a town in South Lakeland, Cumbria, England. Due to its position on the banks of Windermere, the town has become a tourist honeypot. Although their mutual growth has caused them to become one large settlement, the town is distinct from the town of Windermere as the two still have distinguishable town centres. Bowness-on-Windermere is a sprawling tourist town on the shore of Windermere, about half-way along the 12 mile length of the lake between Waterhead and the North end, and Lakeside at the South end.



Belsfield Hotel

Overlooking Bowness Bay, was once home to Henry Schneider, charmain of the Barrow Steel-works.

St. Martin's Church

It is the parish Church of Bowness, and it was built in 1483, with various alterations, including the

restoration of 1870, when the Church was enlarged. It is probably the most interesting building in Bowness, and it is worth looking aside. The area behind the church is the oldest part of Bowness, a delightful web of narrow

streets known as Lowside, which gives an idea of what the village was like before the arrival of the railway. The village of Windermere grew around the railway station, about a mile and a half from the lake.


Orrest Head

A short walk from Windermere takes you to Orrest Head, an outstanding viewpoint. It was the first 'summit' in Lakeland visited by A. Wainwright, author of the famous guidebooks, in 1930.

Museum Gardens



The Museum Gardens around the Yorkshire Museum were planted in the 1830s. This ten-acre botanical garden contains many varieties of trees, native and exotic. The Common Pear Tree close to the river is thought to be the oldest of all the trees in the gardens. In the Gardens you can also find the ruins of St Mary's Abbey, which was one of the wealthiest and most powerful Benedictine monasteries in England, St Leonard's Hospital, which was the largest medieval hospital in England, York Observatory, which is the oldest working observatory in Yorkshire, and the Hospitium.

2

York Theatre Royal



York Theatre Royal is one of England's leading producing theatres. The Theatre was established in 1734 on a converted tennis court, but ten years later the Theatre was built on its current site. The Theatre represents the architecture of many periods, including Roman, 12th century, Georgian and Victorian. The Theatre has been producing performances for over 250 years, and has a wide range of shows including, drama, music, comedy, dance and musical theatre.

3

York Minster



York Minster is a world-class cathedral and one of the finest medieval buildings in Europe. It is also known as St Peter's, and its full name is Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of St Peter in York. The first church on the site has been dated to 627. The current Gothic-style church was designed to be the greatest cathedral in the country. It took over 250 years to build it, and it was finished in 1472. The medieval stained glass and stone masterpieces in the cathedral are world famous and admired by thousands of visitors around the world every year.

4

Stonegate



Stonegate is one of the most architecturally varied street in York. The street started as the Via Praetoria, which still lies six feet under the pavement. It was the busiest and most important road inside the Roman fortress and linked the main entrance gate (where the St Helen's Square is today) to the legionary headquarters building (where the Minster is today). In the Middle Ages the street was home to trades and crafts. Many of the medieval buildings are still on the street today, just as they were back then, including the Mulberry Hall built in 1434.

St Helen's Square



St Helen's Square was a churchyard of St Helen's Church until the early 18th century. The Square gets its name from the Church that dates back to the 13th century. On the other side of the Square is The Mansion House built in 1725 as an official residence for the Lord Mayor. The Square in its current form was created in the 1920s when a number of buildings were demolished around the area.

Today the Square is a busy crossway surrounded by the High Street shops, Stonegate, and the Cultural Quarter of Museum Gardens and Exhibition Square. Street performers often occupy the Square.

6

Guildhall



The Guildhall is a replica of a 15th century building. The current building was opened by Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother in 1960. The original was destroyed by a fire in an air raid during World War II. The 15th century building was built for the purpose of council meetings in 1445. When the Guildhall was not used for Council meetings, all different kinds of events took place in the building. Sometimes the Guildhall was used as a Court of Justice. Access to the Guildhall is through the Mansion House arch from St Helen's Square.

7

York Shambles



'The Shambles' is often used as a general term for the maze of narrow lanes, but at the heart of this maze is the lane actually called the Shambles, which is one of the best preserved medieval streets in the world.

Many of the buildings on the street date back to the late 14th and 15th centuries. Shambles is the oldest street in York. Back in the day it was a street of butchers' shops and houses. The reason why the street was made narrow was to keep the meat out of direct sunlight. The unique look of the Shambles has been awarded the title of the most picturesque street in Britain.

8

Parliament Street & Parliament Square



Parliament Street was built in 1834, and it is also known as Parliament Square. It is the modern shopping area in York.

The Parliament Square got its name from the Parliament House, which was built on the Square in 1641. The Scottish Parliament sat in the Parliament House until members were moved to Westminster in London.

St Giles Cathedral was named in honour of the patron saint of the town, St Giles. Some of the highlights of the church include the beautiful stained glass windows and the famous Thistle Chapel, which is the home of the Knights of the Order of the Thistle.

The Mercat Cross was the central meeting place where Royal orders, rulings, and other official announcements were read.

2

Gladstone's Land



Gladstone's Land is a surviving 17th century high-boarding house. It has been restored and furnished by the National Trust for Scotland, and it is operated as a popular tourist attraction. The House offers a look into 17th century life, with open fires, lack of running water, and period decoration and furniture. This most important example of 17th century high-tenement housing to survive in Edinburgh was completed in 1620, and it was the home of a successful merchant.

3

Victoria Terrace



Victoria Terrace runs along the upper level of one side of Victoria Street. Victoria Street is well known in Edinburgh for its multi-coloured shop fronts, and it is one of Edinburgh's most popular places for tourists to visit. It was originally called the West Bow.

4

Edinburgh Castle



Edinburgh Castle is located at the top of the Royal Mile, which offers a naturally defended position. In front of the castle is a long forecourt known as the Esplanade. The story of the Castle has helped shape the nation's history, as battles were fought over it, royalty lived and died within its walls, and countless generations have been inspired by it. The Castle has been a military base housing a huge fortification and a secure jail for prisoners of war.

5

Grassmarket



The Grassmarket was once one of Edinburgh's main markets. The area has always been dominated by a series of public houses, and in recent years many have become more family-friendly. For most of its history, however, Grassmarket was one of the poorer areas of the city. This changed in the 80s when property prices started to rise sharply. The Market was also used as a setting for public executions.

Greyfriar's Kirkyard



Greyfriar's Kirkyard is filled with history. It belongs to the Greyfriar's Kirk, and in 1526 the former convent garden was granted to be used as a burial ground.

The graveyard has had many famous names buried there. Now visitors have started visiting the grave of Tom Riddle, who many Harry Potter fans believe may have inspired the name of JK Rowling's famous villain Voldemort.

National Museum of Scotland



The National Museum of Scotland is one of the top 10 visitor attractions in the UK, and it is in the top 20 of the most visited museums and galleries in the world. The Museum houses diverse collections with over 20 000 pieces telling the history of Scotland, showing the wonders of nature, world cultures and science and discovery. Today National Museums Scotland also includes the National Museum of Flight, the National War Museum and the National Museum of Rural Life.

8

George Heriot's School



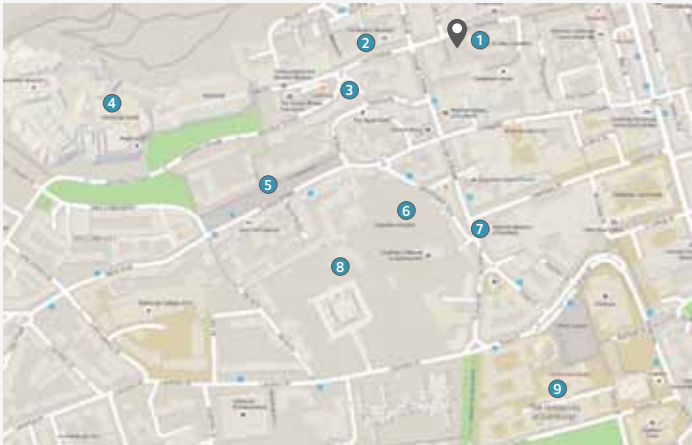
George Heriot's School is one of the historic landmarks of the city of Edinburgh. It is recognised as an important and outstanding example of Scots Renaissance architecture, displaying early 17th century stone carvings. The School is named after George Heriot, a goldsmith in Edinburgh. George Heriot lost all of his children and he decided to turn his mind to providing help to educate the children of his home town, Edinburgh.

9

University of Edinburgh



The University of Edinburgh is one of the most noted universities in Scotland. It was founded in 1583 as 'the Town's College'. The University has slowly grown and established more and more faculties. The University is particularly known for its school of medicine. The English naturalist Charles Darwin studied medicine there, and the University has many other famous alumni including the novelist Sir Walter Scott and the author of the Harry Potter series JK Rowling.

1

Charlotte Square



Charlotte Square is a city square originally called St George's Square. The Square was renamed after King George III's first daughter to avoid confusion with George Square, in the south of the city. The town houses on each side of the square are designed as unified blocks, which creates a palace-like frontage to the square. Completed in the early 19th century the square soon became one of the most prestigious addresses in Edinburgh. The large statue in the middle of the private garden commemorates Prince Albert, who was the Royal Consort to Queen Victoria.

2

George Street



George Street was built to be the widest street in the New Town in Edinburgh. The street is 115 feet broad, and it links St Andrew Square and Charlotte Square. The street was built because there were too many people living in the Old Town. To encourage people to move to this New Town, a £20 prize was offered to the first person to build their home in the New Town. The layout of the street today is still the same as it was when it was first built. More streets, such as the Queen Street and Princes Street flanking George Street on the north and south were built to extend the New Town.

3

Princes Street



Princes Street is the main shopping street in Edinburgh. The street has basically no buildings on the south side which provides panoramic views of the Old Town, Edinburgh Castle and the valley between. Originally all the buildings on the street had the same format and they were all only three storeys, but in the 19th century most of the buildings were redeveloped and the street evolved from residential to mainly retail uses. Several UK high street brands are located on Princes Street.

4

Scottish National Gallery



The Scottish National Gallery houses Scotland's national collection of fine art from the early Renaissance to the end of the 19th century. The collection is regarded as one of the very best in the world, including masterpieces from Ramsay, Raeburn and Wilkie, and some international artist, from Raphael, Velazquez and Vermeer to Monet, Gezanne and Van Gogh. The Gallery includes an interactive IT Gallery, drawing classes and storytelling sessions.

5

Princes Street Gardens



Princes Street Gardens is a public park created in the early 19th century following the creation of the New Town. The Gardens was built where the Nor Loch was located. The park has a wide collection of three different types of public monuments and memorials. The first type commemorates influential Scottish men of the 18th and 19th centuries. The second group remember those who died fighting in wars, including the Scots American War Memorial. The third group include miscellaneous sculptures and monuments, such as the Ross Fountain.

Scott Monument



The Scott Monument is the largest monument built to commemorate a writer in the world. The monument remembers Sir Walter Scott, who was one of Scotland's greatest novelists. The monument was built in the mid 19th century and it houses a museum room where you can learn more about Sir Walter Scott and the monument. The monument is 61 meters high and there are 287 steps to the top where there are great views of Edinburgh. There are 64 statues on the monument, which are mostly characters from Scott's novels with some figures from Scottish history.

7

St Andrew Square's



St Andrew Square's construction began in the late 18th century as the first part of the New Town. It became one of the most fashionable residential areas. At the end of the 19th century St Andrew Square evolved into the commercial centre of the city. The east end of George Street, where the Square is located, used to be known as the hub of Edinburgh's financial world but is now mainly known for its restaurants and designer shops.

In the centre of the Square is a Roman column, Melville Monument, which was built in memory of Henry Dundas, the first Viscount Melville.

Museum of Childhood



The Museum of Childhood has been described as the noisiest museum in the world. It is the first museum in the world dedicated to the history of childhood, it displays toys and games from across generations.

The museum is set in two historic buildings, which were both constructed in the 18th century. The eastern building used to be the home to some well-know figures in Edinburgh, and the western building used to house a theatre.

2

John Knox House



John Knox House is a Scottish Storytelling Centre, and the home for Scotland's Culture.

It is a unique venue that incorporates contemporary design and entertainment with medieval architecture. This vibrant arts venue presents a packed programme of live storytelling, theatre, music, exhibitions, family events and workshops all year round. You can discover Scotland's rich story heritage, find a dragon's nest, enjoy the story wall and much more. The building dates back to the 15th century, which makes it the only original medieval building left surviving in Edinburgh.

3

Canongate Tollbooth



Canongate Tollbooth was built in the late 16th century for the purpose of collecting tolls and public dues. The Tollbooth also served as the council house, courtroom and a prison for the Canongate. The prominent clock was added later in 1820, and the Latin inscription on the front of the building reads: "The place of the seal of the Burgh. For one's country and one's successors, 1591". Nowadays the building houses a little museum called "The People's Story", which tells the story of ordinary people of Edinburgh from late 18th century to the present day.

4

Canongate Kirk



The Canongate Kirk serves the parish of Canongate in Edinburgh's Old Town. The parish includes the Palace of Holyroodhouse and the Scottish Parliament, it is also the parish church of Edinburgh Castle, even though the Castle is detached from the rest of the parish. The Kirk was built in the late 17th century, and it is a magnificent example of the architecture of its period. The Kirk has a Dutch-style end gable and a curious small Doric-columned terrace over the entrance. Although it is rectangular on the outside, its interior has a cross shaped layout.

Museum of Edinburgh



The Museum of Edinburgh is the city's treasure box. It is a maze of historic rooms crammed full of iconic objects from the capital's past. In the Museum you can discover more about Edinburgh's past, its people, crafts and trades and the beautiful objects they created, and the city itself.

The Museum is located in a series of interconnected 16th and 17th century buildings.

6

Scottish Parliament Building



The Scottish Parliament Building sits at the foot of Edinburgh's famous Royal Mile. It is constructed from a mixture of steel, oak and granite, and the complex building is one of the most innovative designs in Britain today. The construction of the building started in 1999. It is the home of the Scottish Parliament, and they held their first debate in this new building in 2004, the same year when Queen Elizabeth formally opened the building. The Scottish Parliament Building is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

7

Palace of Holyroodhouse



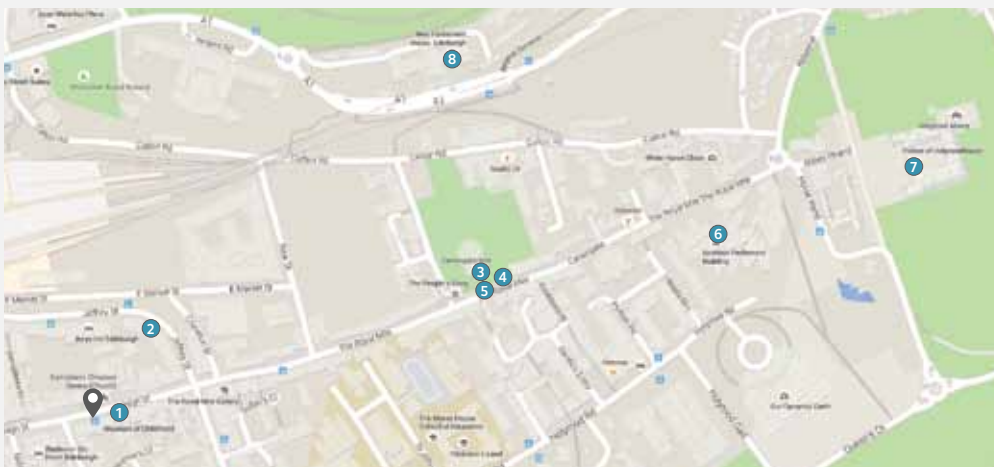
The Palace of Holyroodhouse is Her Majesty The Queen's official residence in Scotland. It was founded as a monastery in the early 12th century, and it is associated with the turbulent past of Scotland. Today the Palace is the setting for State ceremonies and official entertaining, including the Queen's Holyrood week, when Her Majesty carries out a wide range of official engagements in Scotland at the end of June. Each year, The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh entertain around 8 000 guests from all over Scotland.

8

Calton Hill



Calton Hill is a hill in central Edinburgh, and it offers some of the best views of the city. The hill houses several iconic monuments and buildings, including the National Monument, the Dugald Stewart Monument, Nelson's Monument, the Old Royal High School, and the City Observatory. This UNESCO World Heritage Site includes the acropolis, which is an unfinished monument. It was meant to be a replica of the Parthenon in Athens, as a memorial to those who died in the Napoleonic Wars, but funds ran dry before the monument was finished.

Grosvenor Museum

The Grosvenor Museum was built in 1886 to house the collections of the Chester Archaeological Society and the Chester Society of Natural Science, Literature and Art. The Museum was designed by the Chester Architect Thomas Meakin Lockwood and it is named after Hugh Lupus Grosvenor because he donated a portion of the site in Grosvenor Street and part of the building costs. The Museum houses collections exploring the history of Chester, its art and silver heritage, and its natural history. You can find displays on Roman life and times in Chester, particularly the military occupation. The Period House at the end of the Museum has separate rooms from the 17th century to the 1920s. The Museum also has a year round programme of special exhibitions and events.

2

Chester Castle

The Chester Castle was founded by William the Conqueror in 1070. At the time the castle became the administrative centre of the Earldom of Chester. The original structure was a motte and bailey castle with a wooden tower. In the twelfth century the castle was rebuilt in stone and the wooden tower replaced with a square stone gateway, which is now known as the Agricola Tower. After the Civil War the Castle was used as a prison, a court and a tax office. In the Castle complex you can still see the remaining parts of the medieval castle together with the neoclassical buildings. Parts of the neoclassical buildings are used today as Crown Courts and as a military museum. In the Castle is the chapel of St Mary de Castro, which contains the remains of some very high-quality wall paintings from about 1240. The chapel has also been used as a gunpowder store. The Castle is a Grade I listed building.

1

Roman Amphitheatre



The Roman Amphitheatre in Chester is the largest Roman amphitheatre in Britain. It was built in the late first century AD and it was just outside the Roman legionary fortress. It was most likely used for both entertainment and for practising troop manoeuvres. More recently archaeologists have found that also more gruesome shows where gladiators were chained and tortured were also seen at the Amphitheatre. The Amphitheatre would have been able to seat between 8000 and 12 000 spectators but today only about two-fifths of the Theatre is visible. The rest lies behind the brick wall.

2

Grosvenor Park



The Grosvenor Park is the main decorated park in Chester. The Park has a Victorian layout with formal avenues lined with trees and statues and ornamental bushes, for which the park has become well known. The Park was opened in 1867 and it went through a full restoration last year.

3

Eastgate Clock



The Eastgate Clock is considered to be one of the most photographed clocks in the world. It was created to commemorate the diamond jubilee of Queen Victoria and the Clock was unveiled in 1899 on the 80th birthday of the Queen. Since the unveiling the Clock has been universally admired, even though it was initially controversial; some people thought that the bright red and gold and the iron frame made the Clock too flashy, loud and over-bright and unsuited to its surroundings. The roman numerals on the clock are made of glass and an internal lamp illuminates the hands at night.

4

Chester Cathedral



The Chester Cathedral is a national treasure and it has been a Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Chester since 1541. The structure was first built as a monastery in 1092. The monastery was dissolved in 1539. However, Henry VIII handed the monastery back as the Cathedral so the building was preserved. The external Bell Tower was opened in 1975, the stone floor dates from 1997, and the Song School was only completed in 2005. The Cloisters and the Church form one of the most complete medieval monastic complexes in the UK. The Cathedral has a 13th Century Refectory Cafe open to visitors.

5

Chester Cross



The Chester High Cross stands in front of St Peter's Church and it is designated as a Grade II listed building. The origin of the Cross dates back to the 14th century, but the original one was replaced by a new one in 1476. The Cross was damaged and broken during the Civil War in 1646, but the head was saved and discovered again in the 19th century and in 1975 the Cross was moved to its present location, close to its original place. The head and possibly the moulded base of the shaft are the only original parts of the Cross, but the rest of the structure is modern.

6

The Guildhall



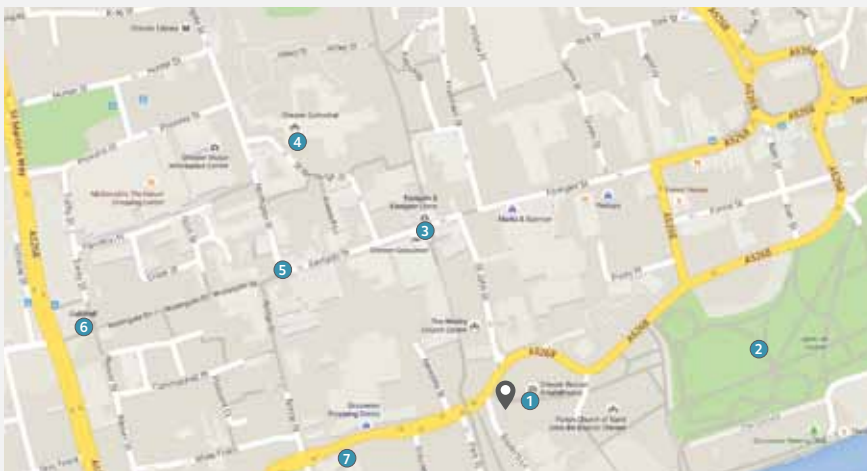
The Chester Guildhall is a former church of the Holy Trinity dating back to the Medieval times. The original church was built between 1865 – 1869. Today the Guildhall is used as a venue for special occasions, events and meetings. Built on the original Roman Watergate the modern main hall can accommodate up to 200 people while the lower hall holds up to 60 people.

7

St Michael's Church (Chester History & Heritage)



St Michael's Church is an ancient parish church that is used as a History and Heritage Centre today. The Centre provides a variety of family and local history sources such as images of Chester, microfilm sources, maps and a local history library and film shows of Chester from the 1930s. It is unknown when the current stone structure was built, but there was a wooden church on the site until it burned down in the great fire of Chester in 1188. The Church is built in yellow sandstone and has a grey slate roof. The Church was closed in 1973 and later opened as a History Heritage Centre.

The Old Buttermarket & Christ Church Gate



The Christ Church Gate is a Norman gateway, and it was built in 1517. It is a dramatic feature of the old Buttermarket and it acts as the main entrance to the Canterbury Cathedral seen behind it. Canterbury is probably most famous for the Cathedral. Thousands of people travel yearly from all over the world to visit the world famous structure. It is also one of the oldest Christian structures in England. It is the Cathedral of the Archbishop of Canterbury, who is the leader of the Church of England and symbolic leader of the worldwide

2

Eastbridge Hospital & Greyfriars Chapel



Eastbridge Hospital was built in the 12th century to provide overnight accommodation for poor pilgrims, soldiers and local societies. Today the Hospital provides Almhouse accommodation for elderly people. It currently has 8 flats and they are all occupied. The residents of the hospital are a Christian community who worship together in the chapels and welcome visitors.

The Hospital has a chapel, Greyfriars Chapel. The chapel is free to enter to anyone who wishes and inside the chapel you can find a visitors book to sign. The Chapel has an exhibition on the lower floor where you can learn more about the history of the Hospital, the Chapel and Canterbury.

3

Dane John Gardens



The historic Dane John Gardens date back to 1551, but before that it was a Roman cemetery, which was converted into a castle in the 11th century and then later into a civic park. Within the gardens you can find a safe play area for children, a newly built bandstand, which is used as a venue for traditional concerts throughout the summer, and a fountain halfway through the shaded walk along the avenue of lime trees. On top of the mound you can enjoy the excellent views of the city of Canterbury.

4

Castle Ruins (Norman Castle)



The ruins of the Canterbury Castle are amongst the most ancient in the UK. The castle has acted as a royal residence, a fortification and a prison. By the 17th century the castle was already completely ruined and could not be used for any of its former purposes. The sole surviving and visible part of the castle is the great tower or 'keep'. Today you can climb half way up the tower. The Castle was once one of the three original Royal castles of Kent, the other two being Rochester Castle and Dover Castle. The Castle was built soon after the Battle of Hastings on the main road from Dover to London and used by William the Conqueror. It was originally built as a mote-and-bailey castle to guard the important route from Dover to London.

5

Westgate Tower Gardens



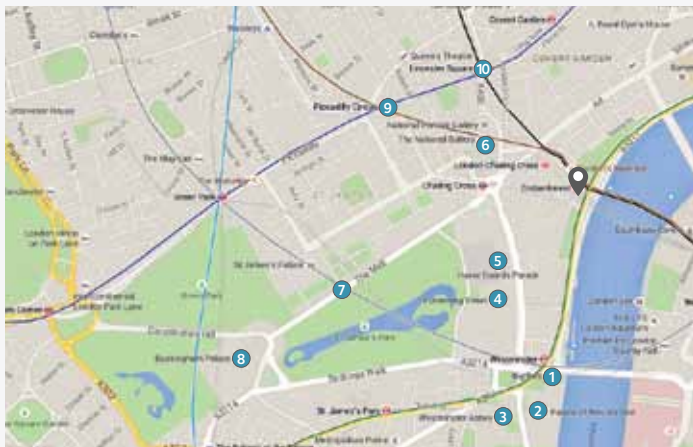
The Westgate Tower Gardens were formally opened in 1936. The site has been a public space since the middle ages but prior to that many disputes arose between residents and the Prior of Christ Church about the garden's ownership. The site is one of the oldest parks in the UK. The Westgate Gardens extend along the river Stour.

6

Westgate Tower



The Westgate Tower is 60 foot high and it is one of the largest surviving city gates in the UK. It was built around 1397 and it is the last survivor of Canterbury's seven medieval gates. The Gate is still very well preserved and it is one of the city's most distinctive landmarks. The West Gate was built by Archbishop Sudbury to replace an earlier Roman gate. For many years the West Gate served as the town prison and it was connected by a walkway to the police station next door. Today the West Gate houses the West Gate Towers Museum, which houses armour and weapons used by the defenders of Canterbury from the medieval period to World War II.

Union Terrace Garden



The Union Terrace Garden was created in 1876 in Aberdeen's Denbuen Valley. Often people think the Garden is a natural amphitheatre, but the amphitheatre shape and the pocket park are only the covered remains of Denburn Terrace. Only the remains are left after the Gardens went through a construction. The landscaped Victorian garden is sometimes used for concerts and leisure activities.

2

Cowdray Hall



The Cowdray Hall was opened in 1925 as part of a major extension of Aberdeen Art Gallery. The Hall was constructed with a view to encourage the taste for art and music in the city of Aberdeen. Today it still has its original purpose stating a huge variety of entertainment. It is one of the city's most popular concert venues with superb acoustics and it is regularly hired by cultural organisations.

3

Kirk of St Nicholas



The Kirk of St Nicholas was established in the 12th century. It is argued that it is the most important and undervalued building in the royal burgh of Aberdeen. The church is at the heart of the city to provide spiritual worship and refuge. It is a holy building, but also a space that holds records of the history of the city and its inhabitants. The Kirk of St Nicholas has the largest set of bells, consisting of 48 bells.

4

Marischal College



The Marischal College was founded in 1593, and it was the second university in Aberdeen in addition to the already existing King's College. The two colleges were merged in 1860 to form the modern University of Aberdeen. This additional construction made it the second largest granite building in the world after El Escorial Palace in Madrid. Although it was originally built for Aberdeen University, since 2009 it has been the headquarters for Aberdeen City Council and is no longer used by the university.

5

Town House and County Hall



Aberdeen Town Hall is neo-gothic structure that dates back to the 1870s. The building is situated in the city centre and it provides a connection between the old burgh of Aberdeen and the newer merchant city. The County Hall is a medieval style room with impressive decorations and paintings. Its ceiling is reminiscent of Flemish influences and the beauty of the room makes it a wonderful place to get married.

Maritime Museum



Aberdeen Maritime Museum is an award-winning museum built in 1593. The Museum tells the story of the city's long relationship with the Sea. It houses a unique collection of fast sailing ships, fishing and port history. The Museum is the only place in the UK where you can see displays on the North Sea oil and gas industry. The Museum houses collections of maritime paintings and objects, new exhibitions, interactive displays with touch screen consoles and multi-media presentations.

7

Music Hall



The Music Hall has been the venue for concerts and community life since 1822. The Music Hall stage has seen music from classical, pop and rock to Scottish traditional music, folk, jazz and blues. People such as the Queen, Nelson Mandela, Winston Churchill and Alex Ferguson have received the honour at the Music Hall. Today an even wider range of events are held at the Hall.

8

St Mary's Cathedral



St Mary's Cathedral was opened in 1860 as the principal Catholic Church in the west of the city of Aberdeen. It serves the area's Catholic population and organises regular community events. The Cathedral was designed by Alexander Ellis. When the tall spire bells were added in 1877 the former church was elevated to a Cathedral.

8

Dunnottar Castle



The exact date when Dunnottar Castle was built is unknown but it is known its origin is in the Pictish times (5000BC to 700AD). The ruined cliff top fortress has played an important role during many crucial episodes of Scottish History and it is probably the most dramatic historical sight in Scotland. The Castle is surrounded on three sides by the North Sea and can only be accessed by a narrow steep stone-cut path.

Mathematical Bridge



The Mathematical Bridge belongs to the Queens College, which is one of the many colleges of Cambridge University. The Bridge was built in 1749, but it has since been rebuilt twice.

3

St Catharine's College



St Catharine's College was founded in 1473 by Robert Woodlark, Provost of King's College. It was formally founded on St Catharine's day (November 25) in 1473.

The University of Cambridge was founded in 1209 and it is the second oldest University in the UK, and the seventh oldest University in the world.

King's College was founded in 1441 and it is the most known out of the 31 colleges in Cambridge University.

5

Trinity College



Trinity College was founded in 1546 by Henry VII combining two buildings already with in Cambridge University. Life at the College has changed greatly over its long history but a strong academic tradition has still been maintained.

6

Round Church



The Round Church, officially called the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, was built in 1130, which makes it one of the oldest buildings in Cambridge. The Church is one of the only four medieval round churches in England.

7

Bridge of Sighs



The Bridge of Sighs was built to connect the New Court to the Third Court on the other side of the river. It was built in the 19th century and it was named after the covered bridge in Venice.

1

Royal Pavilion



The Royal Pavilion was built for the Prince Regent (later King George IV) between 1878 and 1823. The unique character and interior is a reflection of the George's personality.

The Pavilion is remarkable for its exotic oriental appearance both inside and out.

The palace was built from a simple farmhouse into the spectacular oriental palace we can see today, which was due to the George's confidence in his vision and his indifference to the opinion of others.

The Pavilion has Chinese wall papers and large quantities of bamboo and lacquer furniture.

The completed Pavilion was considered progressive for its time.

2

Brighton Museum



The Brighton Museum & Art Gallery was founded by a local social reformer Henry Willett but it was originally King George IV's stable complex.

The museum houses one of the most important and electric collections outside national institutions and the World Art collection is one of the finest in the UK. The Fine Art collection contains around 2000 paintings, which is almost as many as the National Gallery.

The galleries include fashion and style, 20th century art and design, and fine art. In addition to the permanent galleries there is a continuing programme of temporary exhibitions.

3

Brighton Dome & Pavilion Gardens









The Brighton Dome was originally Prince Regent's stables and riding house but currently works as an arts venue that contains a Concert Hall, Corn Exchange and the Pavilion Theatre. All three venues are linked to the rest of the Royal Pavilion Estate by an underground tunnel to the Royal Pavilion in Pavilion Gardens and through shared corridors to Brighton Museum.

The gardens have been restored as closely as possible to the original Regency. The gardens are planted with a mix of native, Chinese and Indian plant species, with lawns and beds of mixed shrubs and floral plants.

Brighton's Lanes



The Brighton's Lanes district is an example left from the old fishing town that Brighton was. Some of the Lanes are from the 18th century when they were fully laid but some of the Lanes are only from 1979. The Lanes were due to be demolished in the 1960s because they were seen as dirty and run-down but public opinion turned against it.

The Lanes are a maze of small and narrow streets and alleyways consisting of independent shops and boutiques selling a mix of antiques, jewellery and contemporary fashion. Some of the narrow passageways are called 'Twittens', which is a Sussex word for the narrow passages. The streets are often lined up by buskers playing live jazz.

5

Churchill Square Shopping Centre



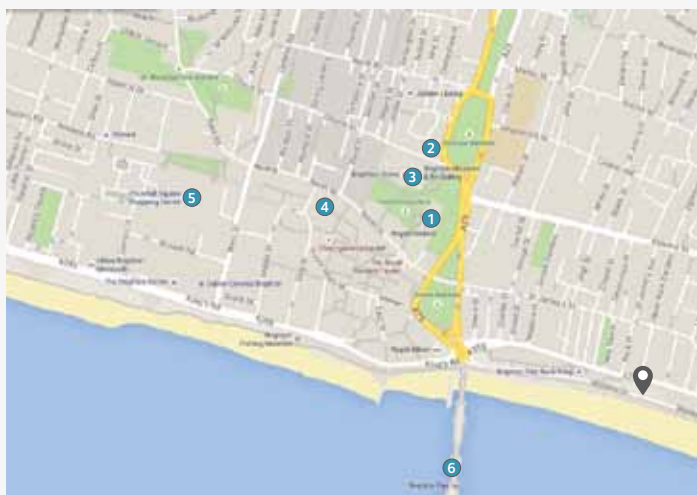
The Churchill Square Shopping Centre has over 90 shops and restaurants. It is an innovative and modern shopping centre.

6

Brighton Pier



Originally in 1823 the Brighton Pier was the Old Chain Pier which was mainly used for passenger ships that sailed from France. The former Chain Pier was struck by multiple storms causing irreparable damage and it was eventually fully destroyed in a storm in 1889. The current Palace Pier was finally fully built in 1899 costing around £27,000. During the following 20 years the Pier had many new additions such as amusement machines, games, rides, a concert hall, a bandstand and different restaurants and fish and chips shops. The big wheel, later know as the Brighton Wheel, was added in 1932 extending the width of the pier even more.

Hollytrees Museum



Hollytrees Museum was opened as a Museum to the public in 1929, but the building itself dates back to the early 18th century. The Museum displays domestic life for the rich and the poor, and childhood in Colchester over the past 300 years. You can find out the origin of the famous nursery rhyme 'Twinkle Twinkle Little Star', which was written in Colchester. The museum has on display fascinating toys, costumes and decorations, and you can try out the clothes and dress up as a servant for example.

2

Town Hall



The present Town Hall is the third Town Hall on the site. It was opened in 1902. The building is designed in the Baroque style, and the 162 foot tower is from the Victorian times. The statue at the top of the tower is the Virgin Mary. The four ravens below the statue represent the harbourmaster, which signifies Colchester's past history as a major port. This Grade I listed building has a wealth of Mayoral history. The function rooms within the Town Hall are still used for their original purpose. The rooms can be hired for functions and weddings. The Council Chambers, used for weddings, has a painted ceiling showing a classical description of the twelve months of the year.

3

High Street



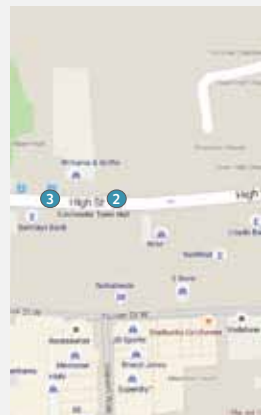
The Colchester High Street, formed in 1470, was originally called High Street, but it has had multiple names throughout the history, until it was called High Street again. The High Street houses multiple different shops, and there is something for everyone. The High Street is the centre of Colchester.

1

Royal Garrison Church



The Royal Garrison Church was built around 1200 as part of a hospital complex. The Church was closed in 1540 when Henry VIII dissolved all religious houses and the building was used as an Armoury. Later a part of it was converted into a residence for the Governor of Portsmouth and it was called the Government House. In 1826 the Government House was demolished and the interior of the Church was tidied and a reconstruction work on the Church began. The Church has got some well preserved stained glass windows and each of them depicts scenes from history.

2

Square Tower



The Square Tower was built in 1494 and designed as a part of the fortifications to protect the rapidly expanding Naval Port. The Tower has had a varied history and it has had many different usages since it was built. It has been used as a home to the Governor of Portsmouth, a semaphore signalling tower, a provisions store for the Royal Navy and as a gunpowder store. In 1979 and 1986 the Tower was restored to its present condition and an archaeological examination revealed centuries-old features such as windows and fireplaces. Today the Square Tower is not open to the general public.

3

Anglican Cathedral



Portsmouth Anglican Cathedral only became a cathedral in 1927. The history of the building, however, dates back to the 12th century. The Cathedral has witnessed wars and peace, famous marriages, been bombed and rebuilt. Most recent developments of the Cathedral include the transformation of Cathedral House into a music centre, rooms for community use and cathedral offices. The Cathedral has an important role in the city of Portsmouth. It hosts civic events, school services and events of artistic and cultural importance.

4

City Museum



The Portsmouth City Museum allows you to discover about the life in Portsmouth and at the seaside, both past and present. The Museum has exhibitions such as A Study in Sherlock, Football in the City, No place like Pompey and Magnifying Sherlock. In addition to the permanent exhibitions, a regularly changing programme of displays can be seen in the Temporary Exhibition Gallery.



5

University of Portsmouth



University of Portsmouth has a city campus and it is made up of over 40 buildings scattered between green spaces and communal areas such as cafes and coffee shops. Over the last ten years the University has invested more than £100 million into buildings and resources. The University was first opened in 1908 when the Park building opened as a main college and public library. The focus in teaching was in chemistry and engineering. The roots of the University can be tracked back even further to the Portsmouth School of Science and the Arts.

Portsmouth Guildhall



Portsmouth Guildhall was built in 1890 and is the biggest events venue in the city of Portsmouth today.

This majestic building is also home to some of the city's best loved historical treasures, such as the city of Portsmouth's Civic Plate, which is nationally renowned as one of the finest collections in the country. The building has played several different roles during its history, including the civic home to the Lord Mayor. It has also suffered some damages during its history. Today the Guildhall is famous as the city's premier entertainment and events venue. Recently it has also become the home to the Council chamber and a number of local services and group.

Historical Dockyard



The Portsmouth Historical Dockyard is one of the three operating Naval Bases in the UK for the British Royal Navy. Her Majesty's Naval Base features the new Mary Rose Museum, the world famous ships HMS Victory and HMS Warrior, HMS Alliance and the only remaining World War II era British ocean going submarine. Situated within a working Naval Base, the Dockyard is the only place in the world to see the Royal Navy's past, present and future.

Mary Rose Museum



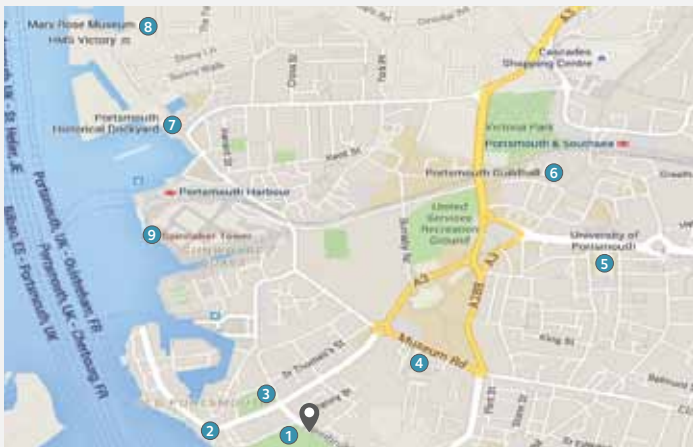
The Mary Rose Museum is an historical Museum dedicated to tell the story of the ship Mary Rose. The story of the Mary Rose spans almost 500 years, and in the Museum you can discover everything that has been recovered from the wreck site since the 1970s. The Mary Rose Museum opened its doors to visitors in 2014. The new Museum provides one of the most significant insights into Tudor life in the world. The Tudor ship that was raised from the sea in 1982, is the only sixteenth century warship on display anywhere in the world and the new Museum built around the ship reunites many of the 19 000 artefacts with the ship.

Spinnaker Tower



The Spinnaker Tower is a 170-metre tower, and it is the centrepiece of the redevelopment of Portsmouth Harbour. Being visible beyond 23 miles away it has become Portsmouth's most prominent landmark. The Tower opened in 2005 as a public and educational facility to celebrate the new Millennium.

Old Market Square & Council House



Old Square Market in Nottingham is the largest public space in the UK after London's Trafalgar Square. The Market has been functioning since 1928, and its purpose was to be a neutral ground for trading. The Square has a long history as a meeting place, as well as the locations for local events.

Today the Square is a modern area reflecting the history of the city including the recreation of an ancient border which once divided Nottingham. The Nottingham Council House is a vital, living part of the city and it is the centre of local politics as elected councillors who represent the people of the City of Nottingham conduct much of their business here.

2

Sky Mirror & Nottingham Playhouse



The Sky Mirror outside the Nottingham Playhouse is a sculpture designed by Anis Kapoor in 2001. The Sky Mirror is almost 6 meters in diameter, and it weighs 10 tonnes. It is made from strips of stainless steel from the UK, but it was made in Finland. Media has speculated that the Sky Mirror poses a danger to the public and pigeons in the form of a barbecue ray, but this is not true and it is very safe.

The Nottingham Playhouse puts on a wide variety of drama, music, dance, comedy and the legendary Nottingham Playhouse pantomime. It was founded in 1948, and it has been one of UK's leading producing theatres ever since. The Theatre can also be hired for weddings and conferences.

3

Theatre Royal Concert Hall



Theatre Royal and Royal Concert Hall in Nottingham are two of the UK's most successful touring venues. Theatre Royal is one of the most beautiful Victorian theatres in Britain. Built in 1865, the Theatre has been providing entertainment for 140 years. The Theatre has had the world's longest running play, Agatha Christie's *The Mousetrap*, premiere at the Theatre in 1952.

The Royal Concert Hall was opened in 1982 with a gala concert starring Sir Elton John. The Hall has a modern architectural design and therefore superb acoustics. This attracts the world's most known orchestras, soloists and conductors. The Hall is also the home of one of the largest electronic organs in the world.

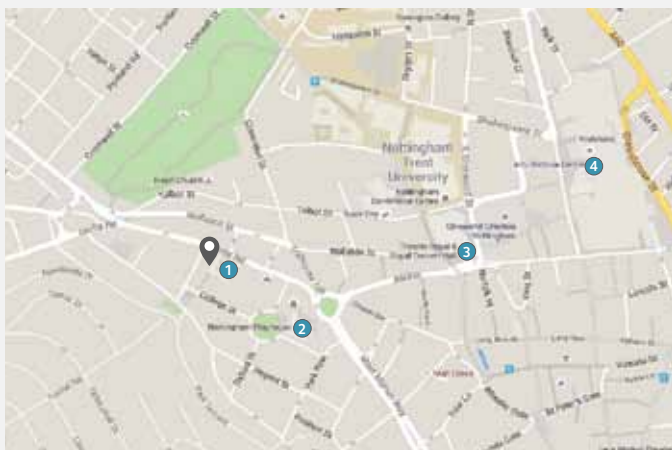

Once part of a royal hunting forest, Sherwood Forest National Nature Reserve covers 450 acres and incorporates some truly ancient areas of native woodland where slender birch trees grow alongside more than one thousand veteran oaks, most of which are over 500 years old.

Royal Exchange Theatre



The Royal Exchange Theatre was opened in 1976, but it is much more than just a theatre. Some of the finest actors in the UK have appeared on the Theatre stage; Helen Mirren, Robert Lindsay and Vanessa Redgrave. The Theatre has also featured young actors before they became big names, such as Hugh Grant and Kate Winslet. The Royal Exchange is the largest round theatre in the country, seating up to 750 people on three levels. The performances in the theatre are 360° which means that every audience member sees the performance from a different angle and all the seats are no further than 9 meters from the stage.

2

Town Hall



Manchester Town Hall was opened in 1877 and designed by Alfred Waterhouse (who also designed the Natural History Museum in London). This magnificent building is situated in Albert Square and is considered to be one of the finest examples of neo-Gothic architecture in the UK. The building contains many majestic staircases, the Mayor's parlour, a clock tower and multiple grand ceremonial rooms, such as the Great Hall, which is decorated with Murals that illustrate Manchester's history. Nowadays the building functions as a ceremonial headquarters of Manchester City Council and also houses a number of local government departments.

3

Central Library




Manchester Central Library celebrated its 80th birthday in 2014, the same year it was re-opened after four years of reconstruction work. The building is often thought to be much older due to the traditional neoclassical architecture. The Library has always been a grand building based on Rome's Pantheon. The renovation turned the Library into a functioning 21st century children's library, media lounge, extensive music library and of course the home to thousands of books. As Manchester is one of the rainiest cities in the UK the Library was built from Portland Stone which copes well in rainy climates.

Museum of Science and Industry



The Museum of Science and Industry occupies the former Liverpool Road Station. The Museum was originally opened in a different location but since the Station closed in 1975, the Greater Manchester City Council bought the station from British Rail for only £1 and it became the Museum's new home. The Station is the world's oldest surviving railway station. In the different galleries of the Museum you can see Revolution Manchester; a digital journey through the city's greatest innovations, Science Gallery, one of the world's largest collection of working steam mill engines, you can time-travel back to 19th century Manchester and much more.

The Wheel



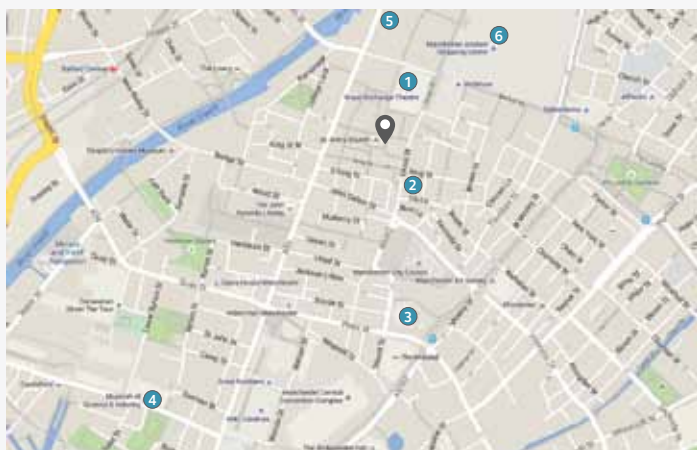
The Wheel of Manchester has 42 carriages, and although very similar to the London Eye, is actually transportable. It is one of the world's largest transportable wheels. The Wheel was built in Holland and it was located in Paris, at the end of Champs Elysee, for three years before it was transferred to Manchester in 24 containers. When the Wheel got to Manchester it took two weeks to construct it in the Exchange Square.

6

Arndale Shopping Centre



The Manchester Arndale features 240 shops and has hundreds of high street brands. The Shopping Centre has been under renovation quite a few times and it has been extended to fit even more shops. In 1996 a bomb was detonated outside the shopping centre which had devastating results. The explosion damaged the western end of the centre and destroyed the Food Court, Voyagers Walk and multiple shops, including Nike and JD Sports. This incident was the start of the renovations and slowly, and costly, the other parts of the shopping centre have been renovated as well.

Rochester Cathedral



The Rochester Cathedral was founded in 604AD, which makes it the second oldest Cathedral in England. The Cathedral is a mixture of Norman architecture, later Gothic styles and 14th century additions. The Cathedral roof has been destroyed once by a fire, but it was restored by the monks with the donations from the thousands of pilgrims visiting the Cathedral every year. The latest addition to the Cathedral was made in 1904 when the present tower and spire were dedicated. The Cathedral's stone keep is 35 meters high, 22 meter square, and the walls are up to 4 meters thick. Today the Cathedral welcomes visitors from all over the world to see the many historical, architectural and spiritual wonders the Cathedral holds.

2

Rochester Castle



The Rochester Castle is built in stone in the 1080s. It is one of the best preserved and finest examples of Norman architecture in England. The Castle has a long history of destruction and rebuilding, and today it is a proud reminder of the history of Rochester. It is situated within the walls of the Roman city of Rochester at a strategic crossing of the river Medway. The Castle has been used both as a defensive building and a luxurious residence. Today it is a visitor attraction, and it also plays host to a number of spectacular events. The round tower has been completely rebuilt contrasting with the original square towers of the Norman Castle. One of the oldest surviving parts of the Castle is the remains of the cracked curtain wall, which was built in the late 11th century.

Vines Gardens



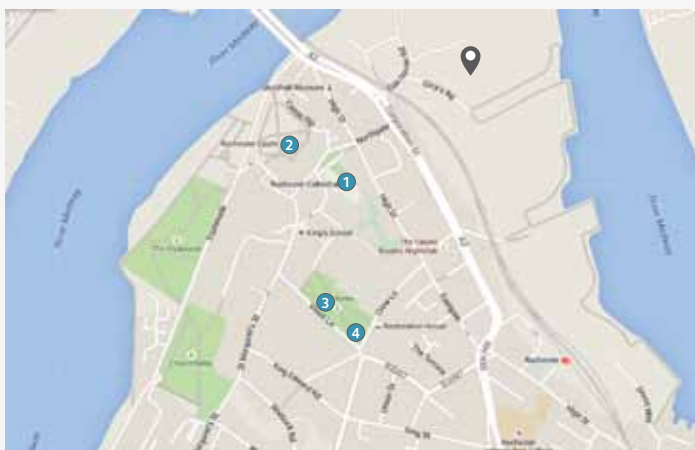
The Vines Gardens is a Grade II listed garden. In the medieval times it was used by monks to cultivate vines. The monks grew grapes in the Gardens for their wine, and there is a statue of a monk in the Gardens as a reminder of that time. The London Plane trees bordering the central path in the gardens is known as the Board Walk. The late 19th century park was badly damaged in 1987, but it has been fully restored since then. There are interpretation panels within the park telling the story and history of the Gardens.

4

Restoration House



The Restoration House is a historic city mansion linking to people like Charles II and Charles Dickens. The Restoration House seen today is a combination of two medieval buildings creating a mansion house just outside the city wall of Rochester. The Restoration House Gardens are in classic English style with decorative borders, box seating, a vegetable garden and a meadow. The garden is maintained to the highest standard and it continues to be developed by gardeners and craftsmen.

Caernarfon

It was not until 60AD that the Romans arrived in Caernarfon, North Wales. In 80AD a fort, Segontium, was established, and that is now known as Caernarfon.

Back then the fort housed 800 men and from there the Romans were able to keep a watch over Anglesey Llyn Peninsula.

The fort was occupied by the Romans for over 300 years, and during that time the original wood and mud fort was replaced by a complex of stone buildings.

It was not until the Edwardian times when Caernarfon was established as a town. Officially Caernarfon was founded in 1284.

It is said that King Edward I's son was born in Caernarfon, and he was the first English Prince of Wales. Today Caernarfon is a town of contrasts: a busy market town, a major tourist centre, the county town for Gwynedd and a major local commercial and administrative centre. There are not many more towns as thoroughly Welsh as Caernarfon is.

Caernarfon Castle

The Caernarfon Castle is probably the most famous of Wales's castles. The building of the Castle seen today began in 1283, and finished 40 years later. It was built not only as a military stronghold, but also as a seat of government and a Royal Palace. The Castle stands on the mouth of the Seiont river and it is the dominant feature of the town. The design of the Castle is quite unusual.

2

Beaumaris

Beaumaris was originally a Viking settlement, and the town itself began to develop in the early 13th century.

It was the port of registration for all ships in North West Wales, and ship building was a major industry in Beaumaris.

Today Beaumaris is a parish, a market town, seaport, and a parliamentary borough in the island county of Anglesey in North Wales.

Beaumaris Castle

Beaumaris Castle is the last and the largest of the castles built by King Edward I in Wales. The building of the Castle begun in 1295, but it was never fully completed. It was built with an almost geometric symmetry, and it is considered to be the most sophisticated example of medieval military architecture in the UK.

The design of the Castle was meant to make the Castle almost impenetrable. The outer curtain wall has ten towers, and the inner wall contains six towers. Today the Beaumaris Castle is a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site.

3

Conwy

Conwy is a medieval walled town, and the walls of Conwy Town are considered to be the finest in the UK. The walls are completely intact and still seem as though they are protecting the town and its people. The Town Walls are a World Heritage Site. Conwy also has the oldest town house in Wales.

Conwy Castle

Conwy Castle was built on the orders of King Edward I of England and construction began in 1283. Today the Castle is one of the best preserved castles in the whole of North Wales. It is a dark stoned fortress with massive military strength. The Castle has no 'walls within walls', but they are not needed because of the rock base the Castle has. When the Castle was finished Edward I moved English into to the town and for a long time Welsh natives were banned from entering the walled town.

Albert Dock

Today the Hall is used for exhibitions, tours, corporate events and weddings. However, the ground floor and basement still house holding cells for prisoners and the condemned cell.

Radio City Tower



The Radio City Tower, also known as the St John's Beacon, was originally designed to be a chimney. The tower located at the heart of the city centre is over 400 feet tall. It offers panoramic views of the city of Liverpool and its surroundings. Three radio stations occupy the Radio City Tower. The oldest resident is Radio City, which was launched in 1974 and it broadcasts over Liverpool, North West England and North Wales.

7

Metropolitan Cathedral



Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral is a Roman Catholic Cathedral and it was opened in 1967. The current Cathedral was the fourth attempt by the Catholic Church to build a mother church in Liverpool. The Archbishop of Liverpool, at the time, launched a competition in 1960 inviting entries from all over the world, and over 300 submission were received. The design of Frederick Gibberd was selected and the construction began in 1962.

8

Liverpool Cathedral



Liverpool Cathedral took 74 years altogether to build. It was not finished until 1978. The Liverpool Cathedral is the largest in the UK and the fifth largest in the whole world; the under-tower vault is the highest in the world and the bells are the biggest and heaviest in the world. The Cathedral managed to survive two world wars, recessions periods and great hardship in the port of Liverpool. The organ in the Cathedral is one of the largest in the world.

Echo Wheel



The Echo Wheel of Liverpool, or the Liverpool Wheel, was built next to the Echo Arena in 2010. It is an observation wheel that provides panoramic views of Liverpool's most famous landmarks with commentary. The wheel is 60 meters and has 42 capsules, including a luxury VIP capsule.

The Museum is the only national museum in the world dedicated to the history of the transatlantic slave trade and its legacy. The Museum addresses such issues as freedom, identity, human rights, racial discrimination and cultural change.

The five statues on top of the Town Hall looking over Liverpool were washed for the first time in 200 years in 2014.

2

World Museum



The World Museum is the oldest museum and galleries operated by National Museums of Liverpool. It was first opened in 1853 in Ropeworks district. The Museum has expanded to be one of the great museums of the British regions, with collections and displays of life sciences, earth sciences and human cultures around the world. In the Museum you can see millions of years of the Earth's history, the World Cultures gallery shows the customs, objects and achievements that have shaped the civilization, discover the wonders of the natural world in the Natural History Centre, travel through space in the Planetarium.

3

Central Library



The Liverpool Central Library was originally opened in 1860, and it is one of the largest public libraries in the UK with large collections that have been built up over the last 150 years. During World War II the Library was hit by a bomb and thousands of books and archives were lost in addition to the interior being destroyed. The facade, however, remained intact. In 2013 the Library was fully restored and modernised. The library has three million items in the archive and one million items on display. Altogether the Library has 36km of shelves.

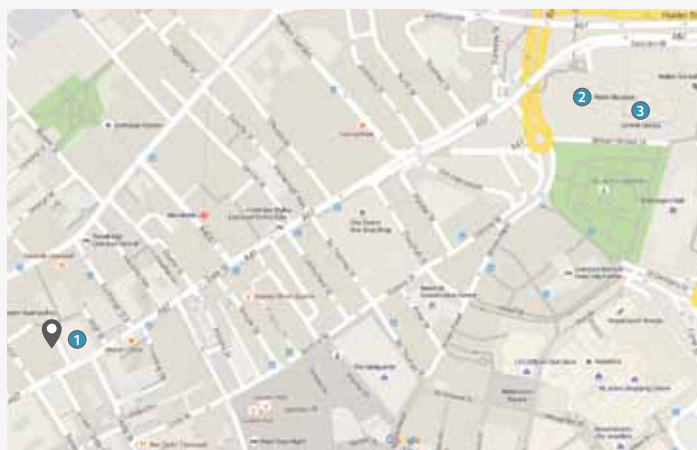

The Echo Wheel of Liverpool, or the Liverpool Wheel, was built next to the Echo Arena in 2010. It is an observation wheel that provides panoramic views of Liverpool's most famous landmarks with commentary. The wheel is 60 meters and has 42 capsules, including a luxury VIP capsule.

St Luke's Church



The site of St Luke's Church was granted to the town of Liverpool in 1791 by Lord Derby. The Foundation stone for the church was laid in 1811 but it took decades before the church was ready. The Church was built of free stone and it is one of the finest examples of florid Gothic architecture in the UK. The Church was once the sight of elaborate weddings and beautiful bells, but now it is only an empty shell. The church is lacking in roof and windows due to it being hit by a incendiary device which resulted in a fire and destroyed the Church.

Liverpool Cathedral



Liverpool Cathedral took 74 years altogether to build. It was not finished until 1978. The Liverpool Cathedral is the largest in the UK and the fifth largest in the whole world; the under-tower vault is the highest in the world and the bells are the biggest and heaviest in the world. The Cathedral managed to survive two world wars, recessions periods and great hardship in the port of Liverpool. The organ in the Cathedral is one of the largest in the world and the sound of the stops is aided by a nine second reverberation in the Cath.

Super Lamb Banana on Tithebarn Street



The Super Lamb Banana on Tithebarn Street was designed for the Britain's Art Transpennine exhibition in 1998. It is one of the most popular and instantly recognisable pieces of public sculptures in Liverpool.

The sculpture is the work of a Japanese artist Taro Chiezo. Through the Super Lamb Banana the artist aimed to represent both humour and the serious contemporary issues of genetic engineering.

Radio City Tower



The Radio City Tower, also known as the St John's Beacon, was originally designed to be a chimney. The tower located at the heart of the city centre is over 400 feet tall. It offers panoramic views of the city of Liverpool and its surroundings. Three radio stations occupy the Radio City Tower. The oldest resident is Radio City, which was launched in 1974 and it broadcasts over Liverpool, North West England and North Wales.

St George's Hall



St George's Hall was built in the early 1800s. It was built as a space for music festivals and the Civic and Crown courts. It is regarded as one of the finest neo-classical buildings in the world. Today the Hall is used for exhibitions, tours, corporate events and weddings. However, the ground floor and basement still house holding cells for prisoners and the condemned cell.

4

St John's Garden



St John's Garden is a memorial garden and it is part of the William Brown Street conservation area. It was originally the location of a church and a cemetery, but the graveyard was closed in 1865 and the church was demolished four years later to make space for the gardens. The sculptures in the gardens display listed monuments from the late Victorian and Edwardian era.

Oscar Wilde House



The Oscar Wilde House is the former childhood home of one of Dublin's most famous people, the writer and dramatist Oscar Wilde. The Wilde family lived at Number One Merrion Square for the first 23 years of Oscar's life. During that time the house had six live-in servants and two governesses to help with the upkeep of the house. The house is where the Wilde family went through many tragedies.

After the Wilde family left the house, it continued to be used as a residence, but it eventually fell into disrepair and it was boarded up. Today the house is the home to the American College.

In 1994, when the College came into possession of the House, it was fully restored and refurbished. It was created to be a teaching and cultural facility.

2

Merrion Square and Wilde Statue



Merrion Square was a fashionable address for the aristocracy and the professional classes. These houses were not exactly like the houses English people live in today. They were much more of a city home or a business home, where the father of the house had a business. People lived upstairs in order to enjoy the views and fresher air as the street was noisy and smelly due to horses being everywhere.

The statue is probably one of the most visited memorials in Dublin. The statue's nickname is "The Fag on Crag".

Oscar Wilde was persecuted for his flamboyant homosexuality, and arrested for gross indecency relating to "the love that dare not speak its name". He was found guilty and sentenced to two years in jail.

3

Natural History Museum



The Natural History Museum in the National Museum of Ireland in Dublin was opened in 1857. The Museum is famous for its Victorian cabinet style, which was designed to showcase a wide-ranging and comprehensive zoological collection. The Museum houses one of the world's finest and fullest collections still available to be viewed by the public. The Museum houses 2million different species, and is often described as a 'museum of a museum'.

Government Buildings



The complex of Government Buildings was designed for two government departments, The Local Government Board and the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction. St Stephen's Green



St Stephen's Green is the best known Victorian public park in Ireland. It was opened in 1880, and it has maintained the original Victorian layout till this day. Over 3.5 kilometres of pathways are available for everyone, and a number of sculptures are located throughout the park. The park also includes a popular children's playground and a 19th century bandstand, which is still the focal point for free daytime concerts during the summer.

6

Grafton Street



Grafton Street has a great variety of retail stores from small boutiques to mainstream stores. The street was named after Henry Fitz Roy, the 1st Duke of Grafton. He was the illegitimate son of Charles II of England who owned land in the area. The street was developed from a country lane in the early 18th century.

7

Molly Malone



The bronze statue of Molly Malone honours the young woman featured in the local ballad 'Cockles and Mussels'. The song tells the story of the street fish trader selling her cockles and mussels. The song is probably more associated with Dublin than any other song. It has been adopted as Dublin's unofficial anthem, even though there is debate as to whether Molly Malone ever even existed. She is very real to the people of Dublin and is celebrated every year on National Molly Malone Day in June.

The collections come from all over the world, including Asia, The Middle East, North Africa and Europe, which make the Library's displays rich in the artistic treasures of the great cultures and religions of the world.

Dublin Castle



Dublin Castle was originally built in the 13th century on a site previously settled by the Vikings. The Castle functioned as a military fortress, a prison, treasury, courts of law and the seat of English Administration in Ireland for 700 years. The Castle was rebuilt between the 17th and 20th centuries, and it is now used for important State receptions and Presidential launches. The city of Dublin gets its name from the Dubh Linn, on the site of the present Castle Gardens and Coach House.

Dublin City Hall



The City Hall was built as the Royal Exchange in the 18th century. Since the mid 19th century Dublin City Council has owned the building, and have just recently restored it to its original beauty. The building is a great example of the Georgian architecture for which Dublin is known for. Today the City Hall is the meeting place of Dublin City Council, and a major cultural attraction.

5

Bank of Ireland



The building where the Bank of Ireland is based, was originally the first purpose built parliament house in Europe, completed in 1739. It served as Ireland's Parliament for a little over 40 years. If you look at the front of the building, you will notice there are no windows. This is because when the building was under construction, a Window Tax was in force throughout Britain and Ireland. The intended windows were filled in with the intention to be glazed at a later date. Because the tax retained for several years, the window bricks were ultimately never removed and they became a permanent feature.

6

Trinity College



Trinity College was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I, making it the oldest university in Ireland. It was modelled on the English universities Oxford and Cambridge. Trinity College is one of the most internationally respected colleges. The traditions of the College are very old and superstitious. It is illegal for a student to walk through Trinity College without a sword, however, this rule has never really been enforced. The College Library is a legal deposit library, which means that it is entitled to one copy of every book that is published in the UK and Ireland.

National Archaeology Museum



The National Museum of Ireland Archaeology first opened in 1890. The Museum displays collections of prehistoric gold artefacts in western Europe, examples of metalwork from the Celtic Iron Age, and also a world-renowned collection of medieval objects and jewellery.

The building itself is an architectural landmark. It is built in the Victorian Palladian style and often compared to the Altes Museum in Berlin.

St Patrick's Cathedral



The site of St Patrick's Cathedral is said to be the earliest Christian site in Ireland. The present building, the largest church in Ireland, was built in the 12th century. The Cathedral is the final resting place for some of the most famous men in Ireland, such as the world-renowned author Jonathan Swift. The Cathedral has also become the National Cathedral for the Church of Ireland a place of worship. Today the Cathedral is the location for a number of public national ceremonies, for example Ireland's Remembrance Day ceremonies, which are hosted by the Royal British Legion and attended by the President of Ireland.

3

Christ Church Cathedral



The Dublin Christ Church Cathedral is the oldest building in Dublin. The Cathedral located in the heart of medieval Dublin was founded in 1030.

Originally built from wood, but rebuilt in stone 100 years later.

This time it took almost 200 years to build the Cathedral, so a transition from Norman to Early English Gothic styles can be seen in the architecture. The Cathedral hold the oldest and largest 12th century crypt in Britain and Ireland. It was heavily restored in the 19th century, and as with most Victorian renovations, the work was important for preserving the ancient building. Unfortunately the renovation also robbed the Cathedral much of its medieval character.

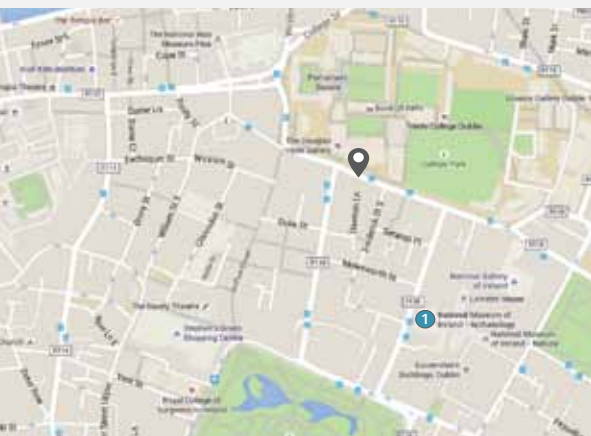

Ha'penny Bridge

Ha'penny Bridge opened in the early 19th century. Before the Bridge, a ferry took people and goods from one side of the river to the other. The ferry was always overcrowded, and usually leaked as well. At the time when the Bridge was built it cost a ha'penny to cross over to the other side, the exact same price as the ferry had been. Even after the Bridge was opened the paid fee went to the owner of the ferry, and he could retire.

Ha'penny is the first pedestrian bridge to cross the Liffey, and it remained as the only pedestrian bridge until the opening of the Millenium Bridge in 1999. When the ha'penny, at the time known as Liffey Bridge, first opened, around 450 people walked across ever day. Today an average of 30.000 people cross the Bridge every day.

The Spire



The Spire of Dublin was the winning entry in an architectural competition to provide a replacement for Nelson's Pillar, which was blown up in 1966. The

Spire was erected in 2003 in celebration of Ireland's confident future in the third millennium. At 120 meters tall, the Spire is the tallest structure in Dublin city centre. At the base it is three meters wide, but at the top it is as thin as 15 centimetres.

The structure responds to the character of the Irish landscape, it sways gently in direct response to the wind, and during daytime the monument reflects the light of Ireland's sky.

2

Garden of Remembrance



The Garden of Remembrance is dedicated to the memory of all those who gave their lives in the cause of Irish Freedom. It is intended as a place of quiet remembrance and reflection.

The Garden opened in 1966 on Easter Monday, marking the 50th anniversary of the 1916 Rising. The Garden is a very specific representation of Ireland and its history.

At the head of the cross pool, is a sculpture by Oisín Kelly.

It was added in 1971, and it is called The Children of Lir.

Cliffs of Moher

The Cliffs of Moher in County Clare are Ireland's most visited natural attraction with one million visitors every year. They stretch for 8 kilometres along the Atlantic coast in the west of Ireland. The cliffs reach the height of 214 meters at their highest point at Knockardakin. The cliffs are mostly formed of Namurian shale and sandstone, and they are home to 30 000 birds

representing more than 20 different species. At the south end of the Cliffs stands Hags Head, which is a natural rocky promontory that resembles a seated woman when it is viewed from the north. The river channels that cut through the Cliffs are over 300 million years old. They have slowly through time been shaping the Cliffs the entire time. In ancient Gaelic language, the word Mothar means 'ruined fort'. A fort stood at the sight of the Moher tower in 1st century BC.

Therefore the Cliffs of Moher mean the cliffs of ruined fort. The Visitor Experience centre is located almost midway along the cliffs and the site has an environmentally friendly visitor centre set into the hillside, O'Brien's Tower. It is a 19th century viewing tower and has 800 meters of protected cliff side pathways, viewing areas and steps.




The Cliffs of Moher have made many film appearances, one of the most famous being Harry Potter and the Half Blood Prince. The cliffs were also the sight for the cover art of U2's album No Line on the Horizon.

Spanish Arch



The Spanish Arch was built in 1584. It was added to the town's walls to protect merchant ships from looting. The Arch built on the left bank of the River Corrib has no proven association with the Spanish and the building of the Arch. It features a wooden sculpture, called Madonna of Quays. Today the Arch is home to the Galway City Museum.

Eyre Square



Eyre Square is the centre piece to Galway City. It was officially presented to the city in the early 18th century by Mayor Edward Eyre, from whom it was named after. In 1965 the square was officially renamed 'Kennedy Memorial Park' in honour of US President John F. Kennedy. There is also a bust of John F. Kennedy in the park. Walking around Eyre Square you can see major landmarks in Galway, such as: The Bank of Ireland, Eyre Square Shopping Centre, The Browne Doorway, The Cannons and the Quincentennial Fountain, which symbolises the importance of the sea for trade in Galway.

Galway Cathedral



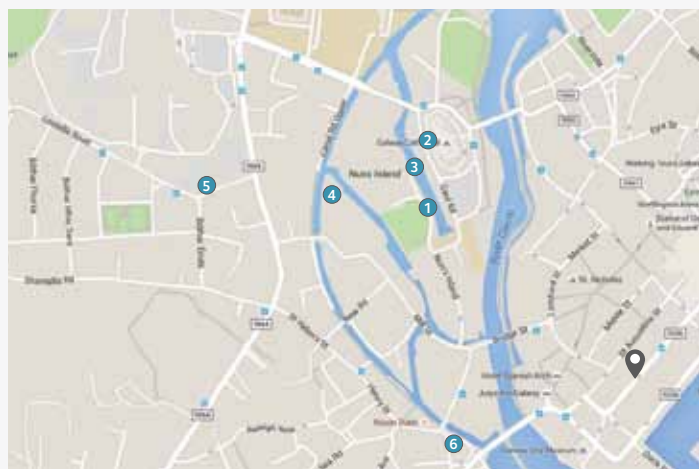
The Galway Cathedral is located on Nun's Island. It is one of the largest and most dominating buildings in Galway. The Cathedral was completed in 1965 after eight years of building and it is located on the site of the former city jail. It was the last large church in Ireland to be made from stone, and features a huge dome at the height of 145 feet. The Cathedral is dedicated to Our Lady Assumed into Heaven and Saint Nicholas. The Galway Cathedral is the youngest of Europe's great stone cathedrals.

5

St. Nicholas' Collegiate Church



St Nicholas' Collegiate Church is the largest medieval parish church in Ireland, and it is in continuous use in the heart of Galway. The Church is dedicated to St Nicholas of Myra, who is the patron saint of children and of mariners. There is some disagreement when the Church was built but it was definitely finished by 1320. The Church has had many famous visitors over the years, the most famous being Christopher Columbus who prayed at the Church during a visit to Galway in 1477.

Nelson Mandela Place



Glasgow was the first city to make Nelson Mandela a freeman in 1981. At the time the South African government refused him permission to leave prison to accept the honour.

This fuelled a worldwide campaign to set him free.

Five years after this, the city renamed St Georges Place, which is the location of the South African consulate, as Nelson Mandela Place. This was a big annoyance to the people who worked at the consulate. Mandela was eventually released in 1990 and he became South Africa's first democratically elected president in 1994.

2

George Square



George Square is the main civic square in Glasgow. It is named after King George III, and originally a statue of him was intended to be in the centre of the Square.

The Square was laid out in 1781. Many of Glasgow's public statues are placed around the Square, which include Queen Victoria and Prince Albert, poets Robert Burns and Thomas Campbell, inventor, James Watt, chemist Thomas Graham, generals Sir John Moore and Lord Clyde, and politicians William Gladstone, Robert Peel and James Oswald.

3

Glasgow City Chambers



Glasgow City Chambers is one of the city's most important and prestigious buildings, and the symbol of Glasgow's political strength and historical wealth. The building was completed in 1888, and it has been the headquarters of the Council of the City of Glasgow for over a hundred years.

The building has been used for other purposes as well, such as a prison, a court, and it housed booths for rent collection. The original City Chambers was 5016 square metres, but due to the Council expanding the current, extended building is 14 000 square metres.

4

Lighthouse



The Lighthouse is Scotland's Centre for Design and Architecture, it is a visitor centre, exhibition space and an events venue. The Lighthouse is the former warehouse at the back of the printing office of the Glasgow Herald.

The building was designed in 1895. It contained a 8000-gallon water tank, which was to protect the building and all its contents from the risk of fire. The Lighthouse was launched in 1999.

Tolbooth Steeple



The Tolbooth is a seven-storey structure, and it is the most important feature of Glasgow's Cross. It used to be a part of a much larger building, which provided accommodation for the Town Clerk's office, the council hall and the city prison. The Tolbooth acted as a site for many of the dramatic events in the city, such as the hanging of witches, thieves and murderers. The prison housed in the Tolbooth was nothing like prisons today, it was run by the inmates more like an exclusive club than a prison. As the city of Glasgow expanded and moved westwards, the Tolbooth was abandoned and eventually demolished. Only the Steeple was left as an isolated reminder of the days gone.

6

Merchant City



Merchant City is one of Glasgow's oldest quarters dating back to the 1750s. Back then it was home to the warehouses of wealthy merchants, "tobacco lords", who shipped tobacco, sugar and tea. In the 19th century the area was the home to Glasgow's central fruit, vegetable and cheese markets. Today Merchant City has some of the city's most exciting bars, restaurants, galleries and boutiques. It is one of Glasgow's most vibrant areas, and one of the most prestigious parts of the city.

7

Glasgow Cathedral



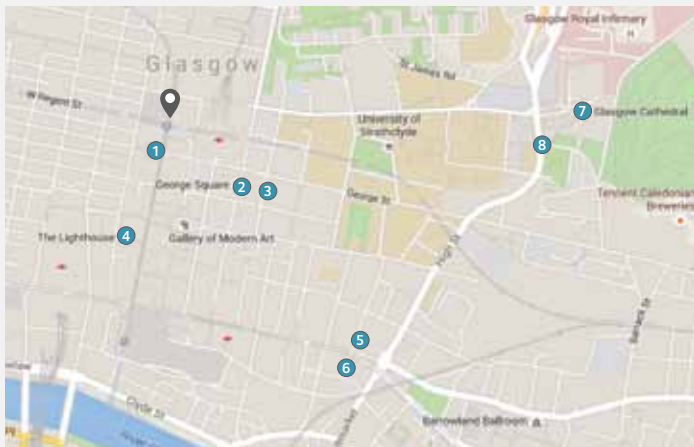
The first Glasgow Cathedral was the very first stone building built in 1136, and the present larger building was constructed in 1197. Since these times the Cathedral has never been uncovered, and it has been a functioning Cathedral for over 800 years. However, not everything in Cathedral is old, it has got one of the finest post-war collections of stained glass windows in Britain. The Cathedral is thought to be built on the site where St Mungo, the first bishop within the ancient British kingdom, was buried in 612AD. His tomb is still in the lower crypt in the Cathedral. The Cathedral is the oldest building in Glasgow, and a typical example of Gothic architecture.

8

Provand's Lordship



Provand's Lordship was built in 1471 as part of a hospital, and with the Cathedral it is one of the only surviving medieval buildings in Glasgow. It is the oldest house in the city, and today it provides a look back to what homes around 1700 would have looked like. Behind the house is the St Nicholas Garden, built in 1997. It is a medical herb garden, containing medical plants used on the 15th century, designed to reflect the original purpose of the house. The Garden also has a series of stone masks called Tontine Faces.

1

Trinity college



Trinity College was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I, making it the oldest university in Ireland. It was modelled on the English universities Oxford and Cambridge. Trinity College is one of the most internationally respected colleges. The traditions of the College are very old and superstitious. It is illegal for a student to walk through Trinity College without a sword, however, this rule has never really been enforced. The College Library is a legal deposit library, which means that it is entitled to one copy of every book that is published in the UK and Ireland

2

O'Connell Bridge



Ha'penny Bridge opened in the early 19th century. Before the Bridge, a ferry took people and goods from one side of the river to the other. The ferry was always overcrowded, and usually leaked as well. At the time when the Bridge was built it cost a ha'penny to cross over to the other side, the exact same price as the ferry had been. Even after the Bridge was opened the paid fee went to the owner of the ferry, and he could retire. Ha'penny is the first pedestrian bridge to cross the Liffey, and it remained as the only pedestrian bridge until the opening of the Millenium Bridge in 1999. When the ha'penny, at the time known as Liffey Bridge, first opened, around 450 people walked across ever day. Today an average of 30.000 people cross the Bridge every day.

3

Dublin City Hall



The City Hall was built as the Royal Exchange in the 18th century. Since the mid 19th century Dublin City Council has owned the building, and have just recently restored it to its original beauty. The building is a great example of the Georgian architecture for which Dublin is known for. Today the City Hall is the meeting place of Dublin City Council, and a major cultural attraction

4

Christ Church Cathedral



The Dublin Christ Church Cathedral is the oldest building in Dublin. The Cathedral located in the heart of medieval Dublin was founded in 1030. Originally built from wood, but rebuilt in stone 100 years later. This time it took almost 200 years to build the Cathedral, so a transition from Norman to Early English Gothic styles can be seen in the architecture. The Cathedral hold the oldest and largest 12th century crypt in Britain and Ireland. It was heavily restored in the 19th century, and as with most Victorian renovations, the work was important for preserving the ancient building. Unfortunately the renovation also robbed the Cathedral much of its medieval character.

5

Dublin Castle



Dublin Castle was originally built in the 13th century on a site previously settled by the Vikings. The Castle functioned as a military fortress, a prison, treasury, courts of law and the seat of English Administration in Ireland for 700 years. The Castle was rebuilt between the 17th and 20th centuries, and it is now used for important State receptions and Presidential launches. The city of Dublin gets its name from the Dubh Linn, on the site of the present Castle Gardens and Coach House.

Chester Beatty Library



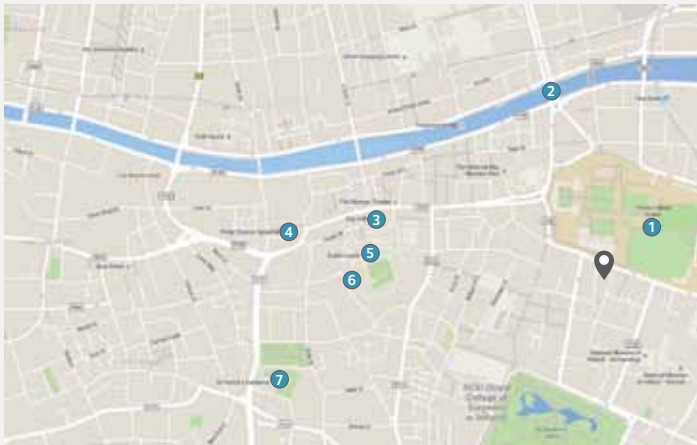
The Chester Beatty Library is an art museum and library, which houses a great collection of manuscripts, prints, drawings, rare books and some decorative arts. The collections come from all over the world, including Asia, The Middle East, North Africa and Europe, which make the Library's displays rich in the artistic treasures of the great cultures and religions of the world.

7

St Patrick's Cathedral



The site of St Patrick's Cathedral is said to be the earliest Christian site in Ireland. The present building, the largest church in Ireland, was built in the 12th century. The Cathedral is the final resting place for some of the most famous men in Ireland, such as the world-renowned author Jonathan Swift. The Cathedral has also become the National Cathedral for the Church of Ireland a place of worship. Today the Cathedral is the location for a number of public national ceremonies, for example Ireland's Remembrance Day ceremonies, which are hosted by the Royal British Legion and attended by the President of Ireland.

1

National Gallery



The National Gallery of Ireland was established by an Act of Parliament in 1854. The Museum has around 2 500 paintings, and 10 000 other works in different media. Every major European school of painting is represented, and it also houses a renowned collection of Irish paintings.

2

Oscar Wilde House



The Oscar Wilde House is the former childhood home of one of Dublin's most famous people, the writer and dramatist Oscar Wilde. The Wilde family lived at Number One Merrion Square for the first 23 years of Oscar's life. During that time the house had six live-in servants and two governesses to help with the upkeep of the house. The house is where the Wilde family went through many tragedies. After the Wilde family left the house, it continued to be used as a residence, but it eventually fell into disrepair and it was boarded up. Today the house is the home to the American College. In 1994, when the College came into possession of the House, it was fully restored and refurbished. It was created to be a teaching and cultural facility.

3

Merrion Square



Merrion Square was a fashionable address for the aristocracy and the professional classes. These houses were not exactly like the houses English people live in today. They were much more of a city home or a business home, where the father of the house had a business. People lived upstairs in order to enjoy the views and fresher air as the street was noisy and smelly due to horses being everywhere. The statue is probably one of the most visited memorials in Dublin. The statue's nickname is "The Fag on Crag". Oscar Wilde was persecuted for his flamboyant homosexuality, and arrested for gross indecency relating to "the love that dare not speak its name". He was found guilty and sentenced to two years in jail.

4

Government Buildings



The complex of Government Buildings was designed for two government departments, The Local Government Board and the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction. The complex was completed in 1922, and was immediately occupied by the new Irish State government. More recently the building has been transformed for more modern use. A number of departments and key offices of the Government of Ireland occupy the building.

5

St Stephen's Green



St Stephen's Green is the best known Victorian public park in Ireland. It was opened in 1880, and it has maintained the original Victorian layout till this day. Over 3.5 kilometres of pathways are available for everyone, and a number of sculptures are located throughout the park. The park also includes a popular children's playground and a 19th century bandstand, which is still the focal point for free daytime concerts during the summer.

6

Bank of Ireland



The building where the Bank of Ireland is based, was originally the first purpose built parliament house in Europe, completed in 1739. It served as Ireland's Parliament for a little over 40 years. If you look at the front of the building, you will notice there are no windows. This is because when the building was under construction, a Window Tax was in force throughout Britain and Ireland. The intended windows were filled in with the intention to be glazed at a later date. Because the tax retained for several years, the window bricks were ultimately never removed and they became a permanent feature.

7

Grafton Street



Grafton Street has a great variety of retail stores from small boutiques to mainstream stores. The street was named after Henry Fitz Roy, the 1st Duke of Grafton. He was the illegitimate son of Charles II of England who owned land in the area. The street was developed from a country lane in the early 18th century.

8

Molly Malone



The bronze statue of Molly Malone honours the young woman featured in the local ballad 'Cockles and Mussels'. The song tells the story of the street fish trader selling her cockles and mussels. The song is probably more associated with Dublin than any other song. It has been adopted as Dublin's unofficial anthem, even though there is debate as to whether Molly Malone ever even existed. She is very real to the people of Dublin and is celebrated every year on National Molly Malone Day in June.

9

Temple Bar



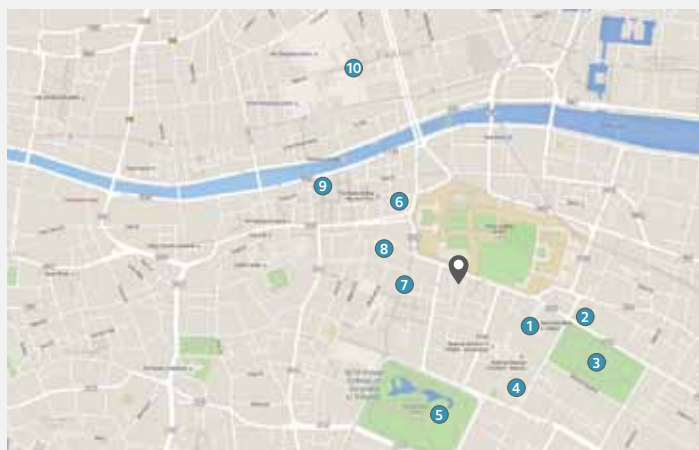
Temple Bar is one of the oldest parts of Dublin, and the city of Dublin, as seen today, was built in and around Temple Bar. The history of Temple Bar is full of references to culture, design, craft, publishing, the performing arts, coffee houses, political debate, and a lot of colour and energy. Temple Bar is full of different kinds of buildings, streets and architecture, and it is home to one of Europe's oldest theatres, and one of Ireland's smallest theatres. There are around fifty cultural organisations based in Temple Bar. This is why it is known as Dublin's Cultural Quarter.

10

Henry Street



Henry street is one of the two main shopping streets in Dublin. It was developed by Henry Moore, whose estate lands and developments are reflected in the street names around Henry street. 33 million people visiting the street a year makes it Dublin's favourite shopping district. There are over 200 shops on the street ranging from clothing, jewellery, music and sports shops to bigger department stores.

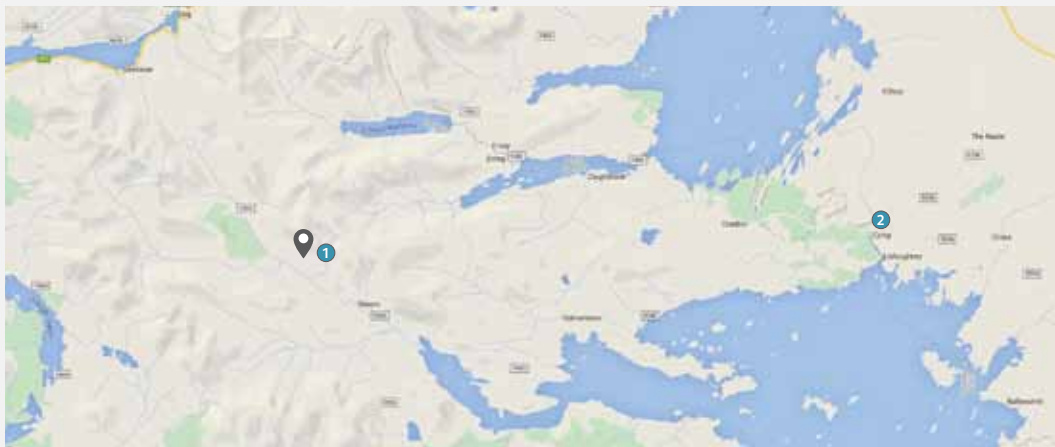

Cong is one of the most beautiful and picturesque villages in Ireland surrounded by The Quiet Man film locations, Connemara countryside, nestled between Lough Mask and Lough Corrib, just 24 miles from Galway. Cong is known for its underground streams that connect Lough Corrib with Lough Mask to the north. It was also the home of Sir William Wilde, historian and father to prominent playwright, novelist, poet, and short story writer Oscar Wilde.
