### Community

#### Driveways and Garage

No chains or blocking devices of any type are permitted on driveways at any time except during maintenance procedures. All garage doors are to be kept closed except as necessary for ingress or egress.

#### Garbage Pick up

All trash and garbage must be in appropriate containers. Garbage bags should be placed in a can, not on a roadway. Garbage cans/recycling bins should only be placed on the roadside after sunset the day before pick up and removed by the end of the day of pickup.

#### <u>Recycle</u>

#### Use your yellow bin for newspaper and more

- Newspaper and newspaper inserts
- Magazines, catalogs and phone books
- Brown paper grocery bags
- Clean, flattened corrugated boxes, 3'x3' maximum (look for the wavy line between layers)

#### Use the blue bin for all the rest

- Clear, brown, green glass bottles and jars (no lids or caps, please)
- All plastic containers except foam cups or packing materials
- Drink boxes (please remove straws)
- Aluminum cans, pie plates and foil
- Milk and juice cartons

#### Where to take Batteries

• Lead acid batteries: Lead acid batteries are commonly found in emergency lighting and computer back-up systems. To identify lead acid batteries, look for the letters Pb on the battery. All Solid Waste Authority (SWA) collection sites accept lead acid batteries during all operating hours, or you can bring to the POA Office. The closest SWA to Frenchman's is at 14185 North Military Trail (north of Donald Ross Road, behind Publix Shopping Center)

• Auto batteries: Auto batteries should be brought to your retailer when purchasing a replacement, or they can be brought to all SWA collection sites during all operating hours.

• Alkaline and non-rechargeable batteries: These batteries can be thrown away in your garbage.



### **Parking Regulations**

With the increase in auto traffic within the community, we would like to share with you the following parking regulations:

Rules and Regulations - Article V. Traffic Rules, Sections:

(C). "Overnight parking on any street, with the exception of designated cul-de-sacs, is prohibited without prior written permission from the POA Administration or Security".

(D). "Parking is prohibited within ten (10) feet of mail boxes and fifteen (15) feet of fire hydrants".

(I). "All citations issued to a Member's family, guest, invitee, agent or contractor will be treated as citations against the member".

(J). "Parking is permitted on only one side of any roadway. Parking is permitted on even side of a roadway, based on house numbers, on even numbered calendar days; and odd side of a roadway, based on house numbers, on odd numbered calendar days. Parking on Frenchman's Creek Drive is prohibited".

#### **Golf Operations Update**

The season is in full swing with a wide variety of activities for members and guests. We have the weekly tournaments for men and women as well, the demo days with various participating manufacturers. The golf shop is fully stocked with merchandise and equipment for your entire family.

In order to ensure an enjoyable golfing experience for you and your guests please be aware of the following guidelines within the golf operation during this busy holiday season.

#### **Guest Play & Tee Times**

Guest tee times are available for you and your guest during the season on a daily basis. Guests are allowed to play before 8:00 a.m. and after 12:00 p.m. Tee times may be available after 10:00 a.m. on lighter play days and must be approved by the Director of Golf or Head Professional. Please contact the golf shop and/or starter for any questions in regard to guest play and tee times.

#### **Practice Facility**

The practice facility is available every day for members and their guests for warm-up prior to your round of golf. Enjoy the practice facility for a golf lesson with one of our instructional staff members, for working on your game and refining your swing. Please Note: Children under the age of sixteen must be accompanied by an adult and are required to utilize the North End (Back End) of the practice facility located by the sales center. All children should be dressed in golf attire at all times when using any part of the practice facility including the putting green.

#### Dress Code & Golf Course Etiquette

As a friendly reminder, members and their guests are required to adhere to the standards set at Frenchman's Creek Beach & Country. We all must follow the proper dress code policy on the golf courses as well as all of the practice facilities. Men are required to wear a collared shirt at all times. No denim, workout attire, tank tops or short shorts are acceptable attire for these areas. All members and guests should follow the proper golf course rules of etiquette. We ask that you adhere to the 90 degree rule while driving your cart, please fill in all your divots with sand, rake all bunkers, fix all ball marks on the green and maintain a four hour pace of play. Cell phones are prohibited on the course as well as the practice facilities. Please respect your fellow members and enjoy your golf.



### Ask the Pro Rich Luchini, PGA, Head Golf Profesional

On behalf of the Professional Staff, I would like to wish all of the members and their families a very happy and healthy New Year.

I would also like to welcome your new Director of Golf J.R. Congdon to our Professional Staff Team.

I have received some questions in regards to the announcement from the R&A and the United States Golf Association of a few changes in the rules that take effect on January 1, 2017.

The most significant of the changes in the 2016 edition of the Rules is the Withdrawal of Rule on Ball Moving After Address – Rule 18-2b(Ball Moving after Address) has been withdrawn. This means that if a ball at rest moves after the player addresses it, the player is no longer automatically deemed to have caused the ball to move. A one-stroke penalty under Rule 18-2 will be applied only when the facts show that the player has caused the ball to move.

Under Rule 18-2b, a player whose ball moved after address was automatically presumed to have caused the ball to move. In 2012, an Exception to Rule 18-2b was introduced to cover situations where it was known or virtually certain that the player had not caused the ball to move, but the application of that standard was not always clear. The withdrawal of Rule 18-2b means that there no longer will be any presumption and that the same overall test in Rule 18-2 will apply to all actions by the player: if the facts show that the player's addressing of the ball or other actions caused the ball to move, the player will incur a one-stroke penalty.







A chaotic Indian wedding 114 minutes. A bit comical including of course drama and romance. A crazy party planner, a stressed father, are involved in this arranged marriage.


