A LARGE DIVERSE ECONOMY

> 500 million inhabitants and a GDP per capita of roughly 27,000 euros (\$29,000 US/capita)

Accounting for nearly 20% of global trade and roughly 16% of global imports

Imported processed agricultural products valued over 12 billion euros in 2013

A LARGE DIVERSE ECONOMY

Low tariffs on unprocessed products, high tariffs on processed products (<u>tariff escalation</u>) and specific products (<u>tariff peaks</u>)

Net importer of raw agricultural products

Erosion of guaranteed prices traditionally paid for specific quantities of specific commodities

A LARGE DIVERSE ECONOMY

Net importer of raw agricultural products

Stringent sanitary, phytosanitary and traceability rules for food and feed products

European consumers pay significantly higher prices for specialty products

TARIFFS AND RULES OF ORIGIN

Duty-free, quota-free entry

Removes <u>tariff escalation</u> allowing more competitive production of value added products

Removes <u>tariff peaks</u> allowing easier diversification of product range

TARIFFS AND RULES OF ORIGIN

Input materials from any CARIFORUM State qualifies as <u>originating material</u>

Input materials from Columbia, Costa Rica, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama and Honduras qualifies as <u>originating providing more than</u> <u>insufficient working or processing</u>
