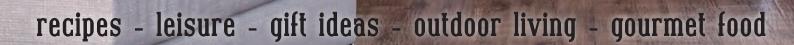

olour aside, it's stressful enough doing a renovation or a new build without worrying if your new floor is going to work. You would never consider buying a sports car if you needed a family car and it's the same with different types of floor covering. Sure we all like the idea of highgloss rich-timber look, but the reality is you might not actually live in a show room.

Start by asking yourself who is responsible for keeping the floor clean? The higher the gloss the easier it will be to see scratches and dust, so the more often you will need to run a dust mop over the floor. If you have less time to worry about keeping the floors dust free then consider a matt finish or even a quality laminate which is far more resistant to scratching than a varnish. Part of reducing the scratches to your new floor is keeping it grit free. Dust and then damp mop with a PH neutral detergent if it needs it. Each type of floor has its own pros and cons.

Try the following check list to determine the right floor for your project:

- Do you live near the beach, have children that bring sand in on their feet or have a medium or large dog in the house? (consider laminate)
- 2. Are you on a tight budget, renovating to sell or renting the place? (consider laminate)
- 3. Do you want a gloss finish? (Consider Bamboo or Timber)



- 4. Do you have environmental concerns? (Consider Bamboo or Cork)
- 5. Do you prefer lots of features, knots and swirls? (Consider Timber or Laminate)
- 6. Is sound a major consideration? (Consider Cork or acoustic underlay)
- 7. Is it a big open area to cover? (Wide planks such as Oak will work well)
- 8. Do you want the floor to make a statement? (Consider traditional hard wood timber)

Come into the shop to feel and explore the different options available. You may be surprised by the technology of modern floors. Borrow samples to check the colour is right in the lighting of your property. Note that brochures and the internet do not give accurate colour representation.

Forgiveness is one of my favourite topics to write about and one of the things I spend a lot of time on with clients who are seeking help with relationship difficulties, anxiety and depression.

It's also important to remember that forgiveness doesn't mean placing yourself at risk - if you've been abused by someone who remains potentially dangerous, then reconciling is not a good idea, but working to forgive will ultimately be beneficial for you.

Learning to practice forgiveness is part of

good mental and physical well-being. Research done over the past 10 years in particular has repeatedly linked forgiveness with reduced levels of anxiety and depression, increased self-esteem, fewer physical health symptoms and an overall reduced death rate. This most likely occurs in part because of the stress reduction associated with forgiveness.

There's no doubt that we live in a world where we can all experience massive injustice as well as unfair and undeserved injury; but not forgiving just leaves us with a catalogue of hurt, bitterness and resentment. Learning to forgive is exactly that - something we all need to learn. Some people are innately better at it and others need to practice. If you want to learn to forgive, a good place to start is by developing empathy for the person who hurt you - this helps you to see the things we all have in common as humans, rather than dividing the world into over-simplified "good" and "bad" people. If you're struggling to forgive and you want to learn more, get some help - do some reading or make an appointment with a psychologist.

Remember - in the end, forgiveness sets you free.

FIVE STEPS TO HELP FIGHT STRESS

Step 1: Practice Deep Breathing

Breathing serves two purposes: it helps you take in oxygen to be transported to all parts of the body through the bloodstream, and it helps in the elimination of waste products. Oxygen helps to clear your mind, rejuvenate your skin and energize your whole body.

Lack of oxygen can lead to mental sluggishness, lack of focus, depression and anxiety. For relief from stress, practicing deep breathing will help you cope. Even under normal circumstances, taking a full, deep breath by itself can be deeply relaxing.

When we are not hydrated enough, we can experience anything from mild headaches and fatigue to seizures, which can be a symptom of severe dehydration. The symptoms of stress and dehydration can be very similar – increased heart rate, nausea, fatigue and headaches.

Try this: Stop drinking all fizzy drinks, caffeinated drinks and juices for a week and replace them with water and see how you feel. If you are a caffeine addict, you may suffer from withdrawal symptoms but the more water you drink, the easier it will be to manage.

Step 3: Remove unnecessary stressors

It is important to have a comprehensive understanding of your mind, body and spirit and to know how to protect yourself from stress and the damage it can cause. Stress

is a leading cause of poor health and it is up to you to reduce and, where possible, remove unnecessary stressors in your life.

Step 4: Get a Good Night's Sleep

Sleep is essential to maintaining good mental and physical health. It is nature's healer; the opportunity for your brain and body to repair themselves from the stresses of the day. Many adults have insomnia multiple times a week, so it is vital to learn how to manage your insomnia so you are more likely to sleep well and you will take things in your stride and stay calm under pressure.

Step 5: Eat for Well-Being, Not for Stress

Like oxygen and water, food is vital for our health and well-being. It is our energy source and provides our bodies with the nutrients it needs to grow, fight disease and repair itself. Many of us feed ourselves platefuls of food loaded with toxins, chemicals, fats and sugars, which do not benefit our bodies. Nevertheless, we simply expect our bodies to cope. There is an important link between stress and nutrition. A balanced diet can boost our resistance against the effects that stress has on the body, and therefore it is important to make sure we get vital nutrients. Someone with a healthy and balanced diet is likely to be less stressed than someone with a poor diet as their bodies are often working more efficiently and they are more resilient to stress.

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HOW TO CALM YOUR DOG DURING A THUNDERSTO

dogs are terrified thunderstorms. The loud noises, static electricity, and barometric pressure changes cause fear, anxiety, and panic. Dogs can injure themselves and damage property.

Call your dog inside as the storm begins to sit by your side and remain calm. During a storm, give your dog no indications that something is wrong. Follow the same routine you would any other night. Even reassuring the dog can convince it that something is wrong. Help your dog by being calm and happy, not by overloading it with sympathy. Soft singing can help calm some dogs.

Find a small "safe spot" for the dog to hide. Ideally, this spot will block light and noise, while allowing the dog to be near you. Under a table or bed, In a dog crate, with a blanket over it, In a closet or windowless bathroom.

Try wrapping a garment around your dog or let the dog huddle under your arm on the sofa. Your dog may feel reassured by the added pressure. If this seems to help, consider buying a special anti-anxiety garment, a Thundershirt or Anxiety Wrap. The garment should be snug around the dog's chest, ensuring it is the correct size, to ensure the acupressure points of the body are being targeted, and to avoid injuring your dog. These garments may also

help them stay calm if you need to leave the up the volume slightly. It can take a long

house, speak to your vet.

Block the noise. A loud television, music, washing machine, can help drown out the thunder. Choose a sound your dog finds familiar and comforting. Keep your dog away from windows, or put up heavy curtains. Seeing the flash of lightning can be an additional source of anxiety. Block the dog's access to exits, as dogs may try to run away.

Play games. Play fetch or with their favourite toy. An activity that will turn your dog's attention away from the storm. To teach your dog that storms are nothing to fear, play a recording of a thunderstorm on very low volume for 5-10 mins once a week. If the dog shows no signs of agitation, turn

time for your dog to adapt, but eventually your dog may learn not to fear thunder.

If this agitates your dog too much, start with 5-10 minute daily sessions instead. Give your dog a treat or a toy when it shows calm behaviour during a storm, or when it obeys a command despite its fear. Train it to respond to a "relax," "calm," or "settle" command.

If these methods are ineffective, ask your vet about anti-anxiety medications. Quickacting medications must be administered before your dog exhibits any behavioural changes.

Never give a dog medication without consulting a veterinarian first.

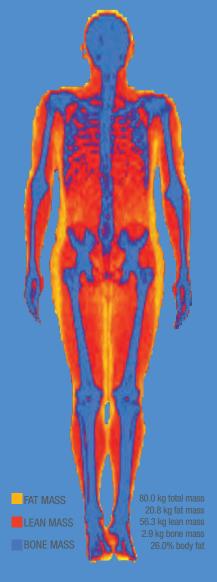


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Osteoporosis is a silent low bone density disease that affects 1 in 5 male and 1 in 3 female Australians by Angus Steventon

What is Osteoporosis?

66% of Australian men and women over the age of 50 have low bone mineral density, and most don't realise. The most severe form of this, osteoporosis, affects over 1 million Australians. Osteoporosis is a condition in which bones become thinner, more fragile and more likely to break, even as a result of a minor fall, a bump or sneeze. Fractures caused by osteoporosis can be life threatening and may result in significant ongoing pain and long-term disability. Osteoporotic fractures are so common that in Australia 1 fracture occurs every 3.5 minutes, which probably equates to about 2 fractures since you've started reading this magazine, and 395 fractures by the end of today.

Who is at risk?

Some of the risk factors for poor bone density and osteoporosis are well known, like having a family history of osteoporosis, low dietary calcium, low vitamin D, being female, or early menopause. Most don't realise that there are many other risk factors, such as not enough exercise, smoking, excessive alcohol intake, being underweight, thyroid conditions, lower hormone levels, long-term use of some medications such as corticosteroids and antidepressants, some chronic diseases (e.g. rheumatoid arthritis, chronic liver or kidney diseases) and malabsorption conditions such as coeliac disease and inflammatory bowel disease.

What should I do?

If any of the risk factors mentioned above apply to you or your family, I urge you to speak to your GP. In particular, anyone who experiences a broken bone from a minor bump or fall should be investigated for osteoporosis. Osteoporosis is not just an "old lady disease". Almost a quarter of all people with osteoporosis are men, and I have seen quite a few men and women in their 50's diagnosed with osteoporosis, in my practice.

Osteoporosis is a silent disease and often remains undiagnosed, even when a fracture has occurred, particularly if it is in the

upper back. The good news however is that osteoporosis can be prevented, diagnosed and managed if action is taken early. Regular exercise, consuming enough bone-healthy nutrients, avoiding negative lifestyle habits, identifying your risk factors, having a noninvasive and pain-free bone density scan, and taking osteoporosis medication if prescribed, are key steps for prevention and treatment.

How can I check my bone density?

Riverside Bodyscan, a local business located within the Reliance GP Superclinic at West Gosford, conducts bone density scans- the gold-standard for measuring bone density and diagnosing osteopenia and osteoporosis. This simple scan measures the density of your bones- usually at the hip and spine- takes approximately 10-15 minutes. Ask your GP for a referral to Riverside BodyScan from your General Practitioner, and call (02) 4323 9200 for an appointment.

Giving them a rough idea about what their initial visits will be like, preparing them for X-rays, planning delicious, braces friendly foods with them, will all contribute to them being able to visualise the journey ahead. Your orthodontist will be able to give you an idea of what to expect at each visit, encourage your child to be a part of these conversations. This will help them feel less apprehensive about the process.
- 2. Discuss pain and discomfort during treatment. Your child will feel some level of temporary discomfort after each appointment. Acknowledging this before hand is always valuable. Reminding them that it's only temporary and having the paracetamol on standby is even more so. But depending on their pain threshold, they would probably also benefit from soft foods such as soups and smoothies for the first day or two.
- 3. Work on a hygiene routine together. We recommend brushing for three minutes, three times per day. It's much harder to floss with braces so your gums need extra attention. We also advise rinsing with water after each meal to help wash away any bits of food that may be stuck between your brackets. Packing a toothbrush into their school bag will also help them stay on top of this routine during the day too.

- 4. Explain the importance of eating the right foods. Steering clear of acidic and sugary foods will help protect their teeth against plaque during treatment, but what about protecting their braces? Hard foods such as nuts and apples and sticky foods such as lollies and caramels could damage or even break your child's braces. This will result is additional repair costs and a likely delay of treatment time. The Ortho Practice offers a library of recipes on their blog at theorthopractice.com.au/blog.
- 5. Prepare them for lifestyle changes. Most things take getting used to. With braces, your child can expect changes to their speech, the way they eat, sleep or even play a sport or musical instrument. At first this can be quite difficult to adjust to. However, talking to them about these changes in advance will put them in the right frame of mind once their braces are on. Acknowledging that speaking will feel strange at first, or that eating may be restrictive at times, is all they will need to better adjust to changes in their lifestyle.
- **6. Remind them it's only a matter of time.** And even though all good things take time the only thing that isn't temporary about braces is the healthy, beautiful smile that will be revealed at the end of their treatment.
- 7. Ask your orthodontist to help. If all else fails, encourage your child to discuss these issues with their orthodontist. After all, we live and breathe this everyday, and there is no concern we haven't come across. A really good orthodontist will invite your questions and concerns and will do their very best to help you and your child through the process.

And finally, when those braces are on - it won't hurt to tell them they look fantastic too.

Toilet training your child Paediatric Physiotherapist's TOP TIPS

Founder and Clinical Director of Sydney's most sought after children's therapy service, shares her top 10 tips to assist your child with toilet training.

1. Support your child

"Dress your child in pants that are easy for them to put on and pull off. It is more beneficial if you dress your children in bigger sized clothing as this makes it easier for them to take it off. There can be two transitions to work through. The first is to the potty and then from the potty to the toilet. The ideal age to start potty training is when the child is 2-3 years old. Continue to encourage your child through all phases of the process, even if there is a timing failure at first."

2. Empower your child to communicate with you

"Ask your child every now and then - "do you need to go?" Encourage them to tell you or another adult when they feel the urge to go. It is also useful to stimulate discussions and ask them to communicate when they need to do a number one or number two."

3. Praise your child for every progress, no matter how small

"It doesn't matter how small or big the achievement is, or even if the toddler doesn't complete the entire routine successfully - praise them for the part that they were able to do. Rewarding your child reinforces positive support. This can be in the form of reward charts, verbal praise or stickers. As the toddler achieves each stage, reduce the amount of praise."

4. Verbalise and gesture to your child

"Show and help your child practise pulling their pants down and up when toilet training. Additionally, explain to them the process of washing and wiping hands and what they need to do. By verbalising and gesturing to your child what toilet training includes, this helps them visualise and understand the process."

5. Pictures always help

"Use visuals to assist when explaining toilet training to your toddler. Pictures may make it easier for kids to understand the process of going to the toilet and the order of actions they need to follow during the routine."

6. Role play going to the toilet

"Use dolls, teddy bears or other soft toys with your child to demonstrate the toilet training experience. This way they know that everyone goes to the toilet."

7. Timing is everything

"During warmer weather, giving your child an increase in fluid or water intake can help. By providing them with a large drink of water more than 40 minutes before they visit the toilet can assist the process. Make sure you have enough time to devote to your child during toilet training. Stay with them to read a book or chat until they wee and then praise them for going to the toilet."

8. The potty

"Start gradually moving the potty closer to the toilet. Make the transition easier by getting your toddler to practise sitting on the 'big potty'. You will need to buy a step and a smaller seat that fits securely inside the existing toilet seat."

9. For kids with gross motor difficulties

"Have steps over the toilet or a low toilet (if possible) or a rail for kids to hold onto. Extra steps can be useful for children who can't walk."

10. Lifting your toddler/non-mobile child

"If you need to lift your toddler or non-mobile child, bend your knees and slowly stand up, so you don't twist your back. Help your child to do as much as possible. If they can hold a rail or assist with standing, ensure there is enough time for them to plan their movement so you don't risk injuring yourself."

1 tbsp Fish sauce 1 small Red chilli, finely diced ½ bunch Coriander, finely chopped

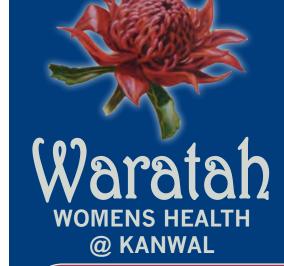
4 Spring Onions (Green section), finely chopped ½ cup Rice flour, if needed,
