- Lansdowne's letter to Poynter 23/4/1904 - You told me Hogarth 1935 purchase was made in fear of available Board's disapproval. That would mean the Director should use his own judgment when a quorum disagreed with him. Further you have threatened resignation on your power of acting without Board approval being called in question 7. 205-206 (ins.pg.11 )
