Up The Creek

TAMAR and MILT MALTZ are well known Philanthropists in Palm Beach County, Cleveland, Ohio, Washington, D.C. and Tel Aviv. Their newest project is *Operation Finale: The Capture& Trial of Adolph Eichmann,* which took two years to develop. It is currently on display at the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage in Cleveland. The exhibit will travel to New York, Chicago, Atlanta, New Orleans and Washington, D.C. It is a co-production of the Mossad, the Maltz Museum and Beit Hatfutsot-the Museum of the Jewish People in Tel Aviv. The exhibition presents four themes: SS Lt. Col.Eichmann's role in the Final Solution; The identification and capture of Eichmann in Argentina; Preparing for and prosecuting Eichmann's trial in Jerusalem; and the legacy of the case. The 4000 square foot exhibition features 60 original artifacts, 70 photographs and seven original films running a total of 35minutes. It starts as a thriller and ends as an epic.





CHRIS and BRETT HANDLER bought Millie and Sol Selko's home on Burgundy Drive. They are going to be full-time residents.


LADIES' NIGHT OUT
