








At school they're having an athletics competition and ... well...

Her father adored her, of course, but when he got married again, Esperanza's life changed completely.




Her stepmother was jealous and monopolized him. If Esperanza asked for something, her stepmother convinced her father to refuse.

One day she needed some sneakers. When she was told at home that she couldn't have them, she went out to look for work. She was 12 years old.






She served complimentary tostadas to each table as diners arrived, and helped with cleaning up.

When the opportunity came, after much deliberation. she raised her hand.






She worked a trial period for six months until she was accepted. One year later, that very same day in the morning, she had been given the news that she was to be promoted to head of department.













For Esperanza, it was a little more difficult because she was just starting her new position, However, she worked hard to make sure she completed all her tasks and was given permission

After the first qualifying rounds, Libertad made it through to the final. She took part in the 400 meter race.














