#### DAY 1

Our journey begins at London St Pancras International, travelling by Eurostar to Brussels Midi. Here we walk to our hotel without even leaving the station building, the Pullman Hotel. After settling in we meet our local guide for an introductory 'beer walk' through central Brussels, which covers the city's brewing heritage and recommends places to eat and drink. (D)

#### DAY 2

Today we head northwards by coach from Brussels into Flanders, calling first in Baasrode to visit the small Malheur Brewery. Meaning 'misfortune' Malheur Brewery was reinstated by the De Landtsheer family in 1997, although the family had owned breweries since 1773. After a tour we have the fortune of tasting Malheur 6, Malheur 10 and Malheur 12 brews, before making the short journey



Brand new for 2017 and staying at the upscale Pullman Hotel Brussels Midi, this tour is packed with excitement. Get your bearings with a guided 'Brussels Beer Walk', enjoy ample free time at the 'Belgian Beer Weekend' in the glorious Grand Place, visit the new Train World Museum, steam on a specially chartered train, cruise Gent's canals and visit four very different



to Baasrode Noord station to join the Dendermonde-Puurs Railway. The society has preserved a 14km section of line running alongside the picturesque River Scheldt since 1977. We embark on a specially chartered steam journey along the line to Puurs, which is conveniently located for our next visit. Our day ends with a visit to the much larger and world-famous Duvel-Moortgat Brewery, with pouring explanation and, of course, a taste of the brew itself, before a free first evening at Belgian Beer Weekend. (B)

### DAY 3

Today's excursion visits Gent by train. Alighting at Gent Dampoort, we walk into the city centre, with its cobbled squares flanked by ornate gabled buildings, along the way visiting the fascinating Gruut Brewery. In the middle ages herbs ('Gruyt' or 'Gruut' in Flemish) were used in the brewing process instead of hops. The Gruut Brewery has revived this tradition and you have the chance to taste the difference on our tour and tasting, followed by light lunch. No visit to Gent would be complete without a scenic and relaxing boat trip on its waterways, which we also include before returning by train to Brussels for more free time to visit Belgian Beer Weekend. (B,L)

# DAY 4

Today begins with a visit to Train World Brussels, Belgium's fascinating and brand new railway museum, situated at the historic Schaerbeek station and showcasing the past, present and future of the railways. We include lunch today before a final afternoon's free time at the Belgian Beer Weekend, with Sunday generally being the quieter of the three days. (B,L)

#### DAY 1


Travel from London St Pancras International by Eurostar to Brussels. Here we change trains and continue to Mons for three nights at the Ibis Hotel. This evening we enjoy dinner in a local restaurant. (D)

#### DAY 2

Today begins with a transfer to Strépy-Thieu for a day of fascinating waterway heritage. We start with a guided cruise on the Canal du Centre, taking in a historic hydraulic boat lift, a lock and several turning bridges. The 4 working boat lifts on the canal form a UNESCO World Heritage site. We have the opportunity to visit the lift's engine room before a road train transports us back to Strépy-Thieu for a light lunch. In the afternoon the road train transports us upstream of the colossal Strépy-Thieu boat lift, the largest in the world, where we join our boat to sail into the lift, descending around 70 metres to the lower level. We end our day on the canal

by visiting the Sloping Lock of Ronquières, where we view the longest sloping lock in the world. Toast the end of a fascinating day with a tour and tasting at St Feuillen Brewery. (B,L)

#### DAY 3

For our visit to the "Three Valleys Steam Festival" we depart Mons for Mariembourg by train. A day ticket is provided for you to discover the lines at your leisure and don't forget to visit the Three Valleys Railway Museum at Treignes. A fuller programme will be announced closer to the date. During a day's exhilarating steam, we meet up for our transfer to Brasserie des Fagnes, situated just outside Mariembourg, where we visit the old and modern breweries, taste one of the special brews and enjoy a relaxing lunch together in the Belgian countryside. (B,L)

#### DAY 4

We travel by coach to Thuin, where we visit the historic Tramway Museum, which houses 30 restored vehicles and preserves a rural route that retraces the history of the world's largest tram network. During our visit we ride on specially arranged electric trams and autorail cars. The day continues with a visit to Train World in Brussels, Belgium's fascinating and brand new railway museum, situated at the historic Schaerbeek station and showcasing the past, present and future of the railways. Our final night is spent at the Pullman Brussels Gare du Midi, with dinner served locally. (B,D)

#### DAY 5

For our final visit this morning, we walk the short distance to the Cantillon Brewery, which also houses the Museum of the Gueuze, a beer made using spontaneous fermentation traditional to the Brussels region. After a tour and tasting, we join the Eurostar service to London St Pancras. (B)

#### DAY 1

Details are yet to be announced but the 2016 gala featured the home fleet of three, plus two visiting locos, with passenger and freight trains. The Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum should be open next to Norden station, as well as the Goods Shed at Corfe Castle station. Our included Full Day Rover ticket allows you to explore the line as you wish, hopping on and off at the individual stations (B)

#### DAY 3

Leaving Poole, we travel to Lymington Pier by train for the ferry to Yamouth on the Isle of Wight. Transferring to our hotel, the Travelodge Newport Isle of Wight, the remainder of the day is free to use your 2-Day Rover Ticket on the 'Isle of Wight Classic Buses, Beer & Walks' festival, with 60 vintage buses shuttling between 62 real ale pubs on the island. A short local train journey today takes you through quaint Knaresborough to historic York, which boasts many attractions, not least the Minster, city walls and, of course, the National Railway Museum. After free time to discover the NRM and the city's other attractions, we meet up for a visit to the York Brewery, set within the city walls, where the brewing process is explained on a guided tour, including four tasters of the brewery's products. (B.D)

#### DAY 3

Today's excursion skirts the Dales as we transfer to Keighley for the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway. An included day ticket allows you to ride the scenic line all day through countryside made familiar through film in the Railway Children, hopping on and off as you please. Why not break off in Haworth, the home of the Brontës, and visit the Parsonage, before we meet up in Keighley for the return journey to Harrogate. (B,D)



Enjoy a day at the Keighley & Worth Valley Steam Railway and two other great Yorkshire heritage railways, plus a visit to York and two fabulous breweries. Don't be bitter – hop on board!



#### DAY 4

A fabulous tour of the Dales awaits today, as we transfer first to Bolton Abbey for a ride on the Embsay & Bolton Abbey Railway along the former Skipton-Ilkley Line to Embsay Station, which was built in 1888. #### DAY 1

Arrive in Stirling and make your way to our hotel for four nights, the Stirling Highland Hotel, just a short uphill walk from the station and close to the castle. Tonight we enjoy our first evening meal together. (D)

#### DAY 2

After a leisurely breakfast and some free time to explore Stirling a little, we head south by coach the short distance to the Falkirk Wheel. The Forth & Clyde Canal was originally built to link sea to sea across Scotland's central belt, however.





Build up a head of steam, uncovering Scotland's heritage from a different angle. Enjoy a day at the Bo'ness & Kinneil Steam Gala, soar above the canals by boat on the remarkable Falkirk Wheel and steam through the Highlands on the Strathspey Railway on a tour that also



not long after its construction it was usurped by the railways. After falling into disrepair, volunteers began restoring the canal to its former glory with similar vigour to the pioneers of railway preservation. The Falkirk Wheel is the final piece in the jigsaw, an incredible feat of engineering and design. Our boat is lifted 35 metres by the world's only rotating boat lift, before sailing seamlessly onto the Union Canal. On our way back to Stirling we stop at the Harviestoun Brewery for a talk and tasting with one of their brewers. (B,D)

# DAY 3

One of Scotland's great rail journeys awaits today as we head north, via Perth, and into the Cairngorms, passing dense forests and wild moors, flanked by the Grampians, on our way to the mountain resort of Aviemore. Here we enjoy a return steam excursion from Aviemore to Broomhill on the preserved section of the Highland Line known as the Strathspey Steam Railway. Back in Aviemore, we visit the small, local Cairngorm Brewery, whose tour takes in their fermentation room the Mash Tun in their Brewhouse and conditioning room, before we enjoy a taste of their bottled ales. (B,D)

#### DAY 4

Today our tour reaches its peak with a short coach transfer through majestic scenery to the Bo'ness & Kinneil Railway Steam Gala. Details of the specific steam trains are yet to be confirmed, but our day rover ticket allows you to hop on and off at your leisure. Our day ends with a tasting session of the local ale at the Corbie Inn with craft brewer Kinneil Brew. Cheers! (B,D)

#### DAY 5

Our hotel in Stirling bids "Haste ye back," as we make our way home. (B)

# DAY 1

We arrive in Norwich, the most complete medieval city in England. After registering at our hotel, we walk the short distance to the Chalk Hill Brewery for a tour and tasting. They have been brewing ale here at the Coach & Horses since 1993. Now a 15 barrel plant, they produce six ales, supplying local pubs and festivals, and have won several awards for their ales. We then return to our hotel for our evening meal. (D)

#### DAY 2

Today we commence with a journey through the Norfolk countryside to Hoveton & Wroxham, where we have organized a special steam charter along the Bure Valley Railway from Wroxham to the historic market town of Aylsham,





In February the Campaign for Real Ale meets to judge its 'Champion Winter Ale' in Norwich, which is then followed by a festival dedicated to Winter Ales. We include two evenings at the festival, plus visits to two renowned Norfolk breweries, Norwich Aviation Museum and a specially chartered trip on the Bure Valley Steam Railway.



meandering along the River Bure along ancient pastures and Broadland villages. We then board our coach to Woodforde's Brewery, where we enjoy another tour and tasting. Woodforde's have been producing real ale for over 30 years and boast two 'Champion Beer of Britain' awards. After our visit we return by coach to Norwich for dinner, followed by included entry into Norwich's 'National Winter Ales Festival'. (B.D)

#### DAY 3

Our morning excursion features a visit to the City of Norwich Aviation Museum, which includes a guided tour inside two of their aircraft, usually a Nimrod maritime patrol aircraft and a Vulcan Cold War Bomber. Returning to the city centre, we enjoy a little free time, an early dinner at the hotel, followed by a final evening at the 'National Winter Ales Festival', with entrance included and your chance to sample this year's 'Champion Winter Beer'. (B,D)

After breakfast we have free-time in Norwich before boarding our homeward trains. (B)
