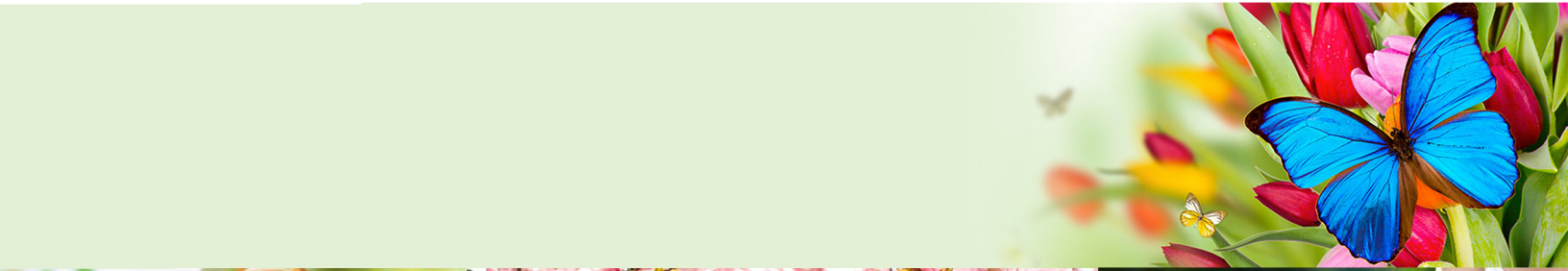

Answer from last month:

Move one - sacrificing of the Queen: White Queen to H8 taking the Rook, Queen taken by the King.

Move 2 - White Rook to G6 - check and black Queen is taken.

Exterior Painting of POA Maintained Homes

If you live in a patio, villa or townhouse, a portion of your POA fees include the painting of your home. Items painted include the trim every three years and the entire home painted every six years. The fee you pay is based on the cost associated with painting an original standard A, B, or C, patio, villa or townhouse.

If you live in a Barbados, Courtyard or Lake Front home, these home types are billed POA fees as patio C homes. A non-standard A, B, or C patio, villa, or townhouse in which changes, additions have been made, either when first built or subsequently, or if there are any extenuating circumstances where additional painting or preparation is required, then there will be an additional charge assessed to you upon completion of the painting job.

The additional amount to be assessed will be the difference between the actual painting costs less the amount billed as part of your POA fees.

Prior to the start of your scheduled trim or full house painting, a letter will be sent to you by the POA letting you know the approximate time frame your house will be painted. As a courtesy to our homeowners, if there is an additional charge for this painting, the notice will state the amount and reasons for the additional charge.

Terminix Home Inspection Alert

Terminix Home Inspection Alert

It has been brought to the POA's attention that a number of homeowners have been solicited by Terminix for a "FREE" home inspection, which includes an inspection of your attic and insulation.

This solicitation has prompted a number of residents to accept this service. It appears that members who have received this inspection are told of rodents and unsanitary conditions in their attic insulation. We have received reports from residents of high pressure sales tactics and extraordinarily high price quotes for the removal and replacement of the attic insulation.

We cannot substantiate these reports, but simply pass along the concerns of fellow residents. We met with the local Terminix Sales Manager to express our concerns. However, we have little confidence that they will alter their practices. Therefore, should you choose to have any service such as this done at your home, we would highly recommend getting more than one quote. The POA Office would be happy to provide you with the contact information of local reputable vendors.

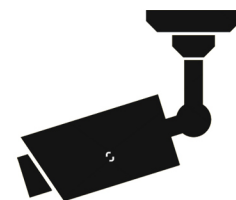
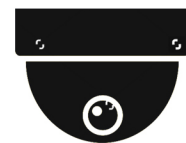
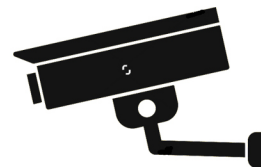


Upgraded Valet Cameras

Guest Play & Tee Times

Guest tee times are available for you and your guests during the season on a daily basis. Guests are allowed to play before 8:00 a.m. and after 12:00 p.m. Tee times may be available after 10:00 am on lighter play days and must be approved by the Director of Golf or Head Professional. You may request tee times online via the Frenchman's Creek website. Please contact the golf shop and/or starter for any questions in regard to guest play and tee times.

Dress Code & Golf Course Etiquette

As a friendly reminder, members and their guests are required to adhere to the standards set at Frenchman's Creek Beach & Country Club. Please follow the proper dress code policy on the golf courses as well as all of the practice facilities. Men are required to wear a collared shirt at all times. No denim, workout attire, tank tops or short shorts are acceptable attire for these areas. All members and guests should follow the proper golf course rules of etiquette. We ask that you adhere to the 90 degree rule while driving your cart, please fill in all your divots with sand, rake all bunkers, fix all ball marks on the green and maintain a four (4) hour pace of play. Cell phones are prohibited on the course as well as the practice facilities. Please respect your fellow members and enjoy your golf.

Practice Facility

The practice facility is available every day for our members and their guests for warm-up prior to your round of golf, for a golf lesson with one of our instructional staff member's and for working on your game and refining your swing. Please Note: Children under the age of sixteen (16) must be accompanied by an adult and are required to utilize the North End (Back End) of the practice facility located by the sales center. Children should be dressed in golf attire at all times when you using any part of the practice facility including the putting green.

Golf Rule of the Month

Obstruction (Rule 24)

24.1 Movable Obstruction

A player may take relief, without penalty, from a movable obstruction as follows:

- a. If the ball does not lie in or on the obstruction, the obstruction may be removed. If the ball moves, it must be replaced, and there is no penalty, provided that the movement of the ball is directly attributable to the removal of the obstruction.
- b. If the ball lies in or on the obstruction, the ball may be lifted and the obstruction removed. The ball must through the green or in a hazard be dropped, or on the putting green be placed, as near as possible to the spot directly under the place where the ball lay in or on the obstruction, but not nearer the hole.

The ball may be cleaned when lifted under this Rule.

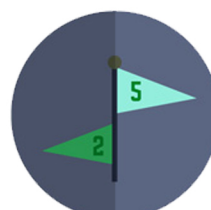
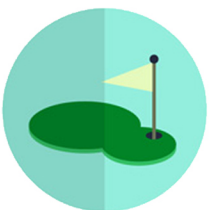
24.2 Immovable Obstruction

- a. **Interference:** Interference by an immovable obstruction occurs when a ball lies in or on the obstruction, or when the obstruction interferes with the player's stance or the area of his or her intended swing. If the player's ball lies on the putting green, interference also occurs if an immovable obstruction on the putting green intervenes on his or her line of putt. Otherwise, intervention on the line of play is not, of itself, interference under this Rule.
- b. **Relief:** Except when the ball is in a water hazard or a lateral water hazard, the player may take relief from interference by an immovable obstruction as follows:

Penalty for Breach of Rule:

Match Play: Loss of Hole

Stroke Play: Two Strokes

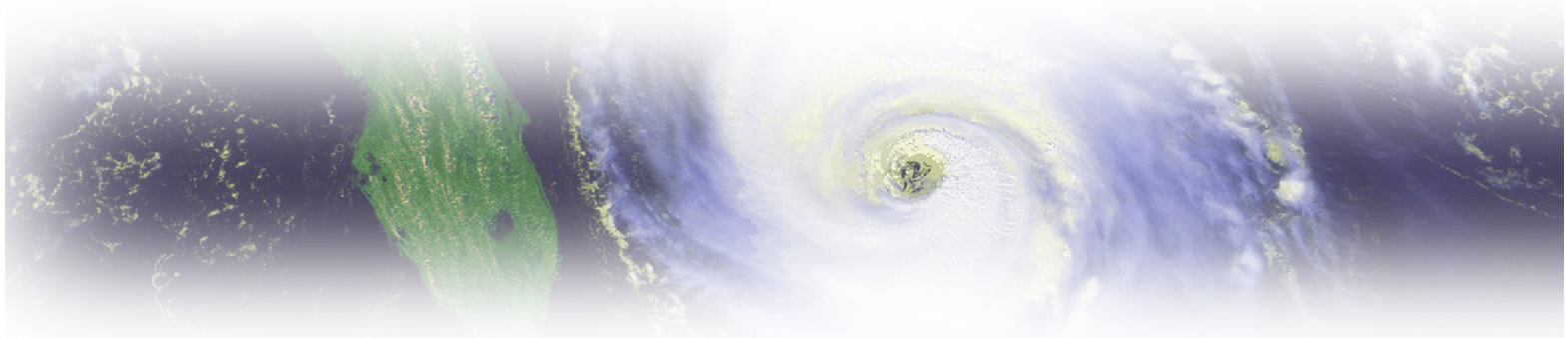

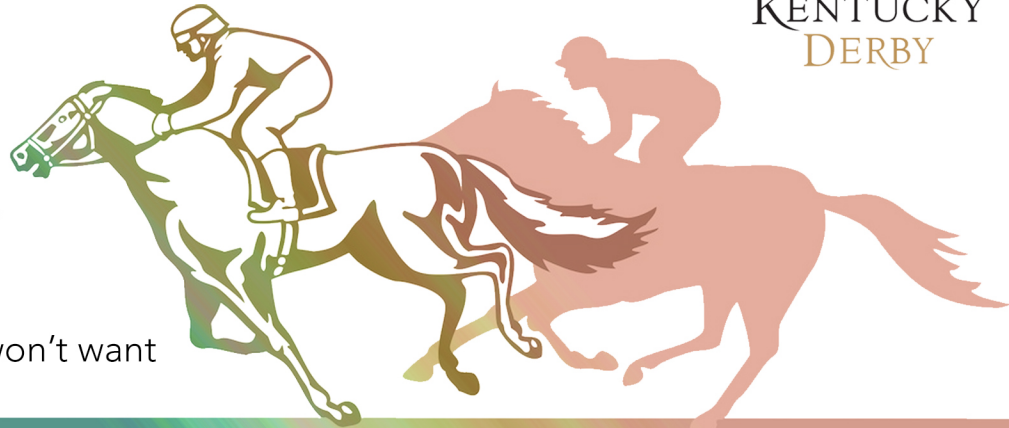
