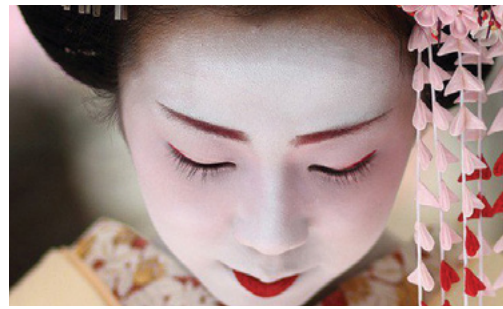

DAY 1 - MALTA - JAPAN

Meet the tour manager at Malta International Airport for your flight to Japan.

DAY 2 - TOKYO

Upon arrival you will be welcomed and transferred to your 4* Grand Pacific La Daiba. Tokyo is Japan's capital and the country's largest city. Tokyo is also one of Japan's 47 prefectures, but is called a metropolis rather than a prefecture. The metropolis of Tokyo consists of 23 city wards, 26 cities, 5 towns and 8 villages, including the Izu and Ogasawara Islands, several small Pacific Islands in the south of Japan's main island Honshu. The 23 city wards are the center of Tokyo and make up about one third of the metropolis' area, while housing roughly eight of Tokyo's approximately twelve million residents. Prior to 1868, Tokyo was known as Edo. A small castle town in the 16th century, Edo became Japan's political center in 1603 when Tokugawa Ieyasu established his feudal government there. A few decades later, Edo had grown into one of the world's most populous cities. With the Meiji Restoration of 1868, the emperor and capital were moved from Kyoto to Edo, which was renamed Tokyo ("Eastern Capital").

DAY 3 - TOKYO

Breakfast and proceed for full day city tour of Tokyo visiting the Meiji Jingu Shrine, drive through the Imperial Palace Plaza which comprises the moats and spacious plaza between the east side of the Imperial Palace and the Marunouchi office buildings. On either side of the road through the middle of the plaza stretches lawn with pine groves. On the north side of the plaza stands a fountain commemorating the marriage of the Emperor and Empress. To the south is a bronze of Kusunoki Masashige, a 14th-century samurai loyal to the emperor. Sensoji is the oldest and most impressive temple in Tokyo. The main hall was first built in 645 to house a tiny golden statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy, that had been repeatedly hauled up in fishing nets

despite being thrown back into the river. The statue was enshrined in the main hall where it ostensibly remains today -- a sight too holy to be seen. The temple was destroyed in the air raids of March 10, 1945, and the present building is a 1958 reconstruction. The temple precincts bustle with people praying, buying fortunes, shopping or sightseeing. Many come for the curative powers of smoke billowing from the bronze urn burning incense in front of the main hall. People rub smoke on joints in the hope of easing aches and pains.

Ginza is the Champs-Elysees of Tokyo. The street has always been fashionable and in the vanguard of change. Early in the Meiji Era gas lights and streetcars brought the area fame. In the Taisho Era "modern boys" and "modern girls" came to Ginza to dance the Charleston. In the fascist age, young military officers strutted along the street in their high-peaked hats. World War II air raids destroyed the district-only the Hattori clock tower survived-but the area was completely rebuilt after the war and quickly regained its former preeminence. The Sony Building displays all of the company's latest products. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 4 - NIKKO

Breakfast and full day tour of Nikko. First visit will be The Toshogu Shrine which is the main attraction of Nikko. The Shinto shrine is dedicated to the kami (spirit) of Ieyasu who founded the Tokugawa Shogunate, a military dynasty that ruled Japan from 1603 to 1867. To create a worthy shrine for the shogun, 15,000 craftsmen worked for two years, using 2.5 million sheets of gold leaf. The enshrinement of Ieyasu's spirit is reenacted twice each year in the Procession of the Thousand Warriors.

Unlike most Shinto shrines, characterized by minimalist architecture that blends into its surroundings, Toshogu is a riot of colour, gold, and carvings, with birds and flowers, dancing maidens, and sages following one another around the buildings. Some visitors find the shrine awe-inspiring and beautiful; others are repelled by the gaudiness. In

contrast to the exuberance of the shrine, Ieyasu's mausoleum itself is relatively simple and austere.

One of the most famous elements of Toshogu is the Sacred Stable, where a white imperial horse is kept (a gift of New Zealand). The stable's fame derives from the original carving depicting the three wise monkeys, "Hear no evil, Speak no evil, See no evil." Other famous carvings at Toshogu include a sleeping cat and an odd rendering of an elephant by an artist who had apparently never seen one.

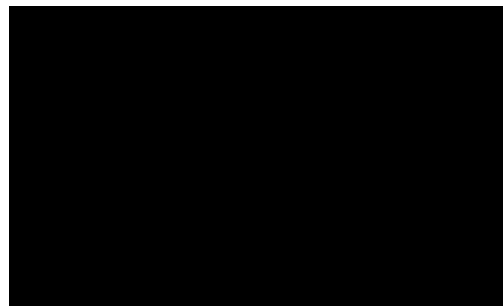
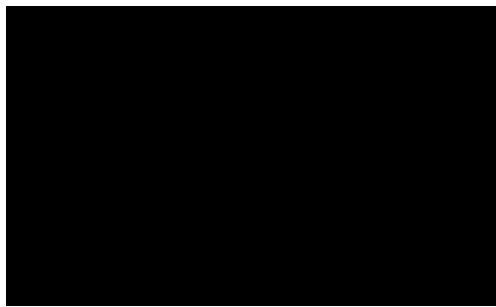
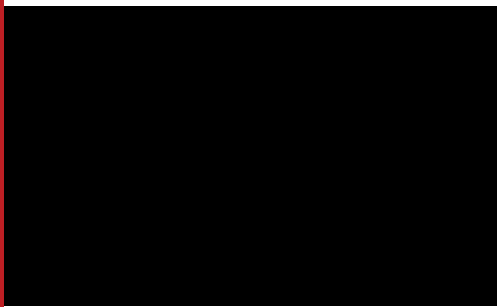
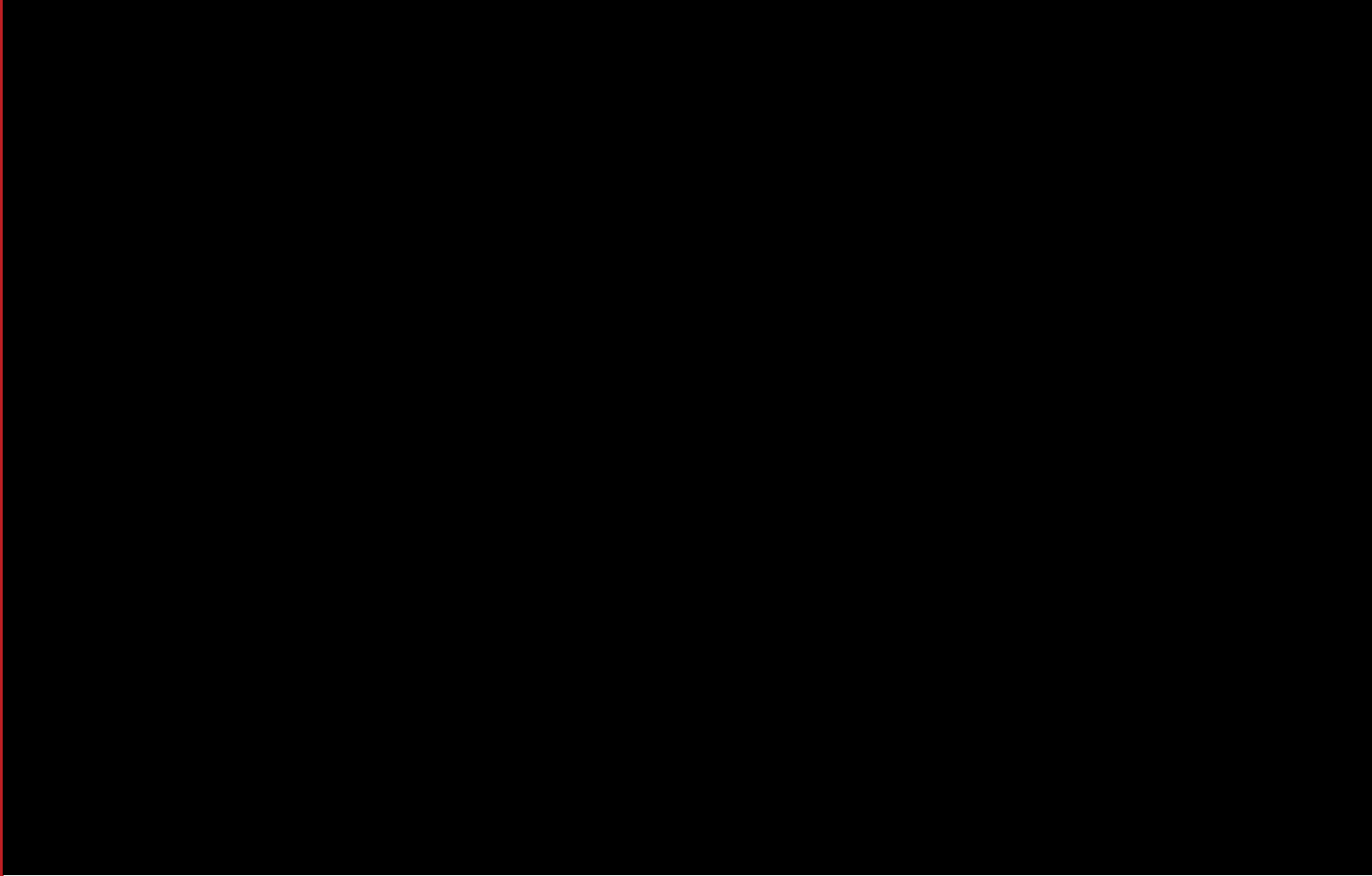
Drive to Kegon Waterfall the almost 100 meter tall most famous of Nikko's many beautiful waterfalls. In fact, it is even ranked as one of Japan's three most beautiful falls, along with Nachi Waterfall in Wakayama Prefecture and Fukuroda Waterfall in Ibaraki Prefecture. Kegon Waterfall is also a popular autumn color spot. The trees around the waterfall are usually most colorful from mid to late October. In the winter, the waterfall is impressive as well, when it freezes almost completely solid. Later drive through Chuzen-ji Lake.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 5 - TOKYO - KYOTO

Breakfast and full day tour of Tokyo visiting Mt. Fuji, Lake Kawaguchi, Kubota Ichiku Art Museum, Ooishi Park, Mt. Tenjo Park & Mt. Kachikachi Ropeway and the Springs of Mt. Fuji (museum included). Mount Fuji is the highest and most popular mountain in Japan, and is considered to be one of the most beautiful conical volcanoes in the world. The base of Mt. Fuji, which forms an almost perfect circle, stretches 35 to 40 km from east to west and the same distance from north to south. The volcano has not been active for more than 250 years, but apparently there was a time when smoke rising from its crater was a familiar feature of the landscape. After lunch transfer to Mishima train station for transfer to Kyoto. Check in at the 4* New Miyako Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.



DAY 6 - KYOTO

After breakfast depart for full day tour of Kyoto visiting all main attractions. we start with Nijo Castle, built by Ieyasu, the founder of the Tokugawa Shogunate, in 1603, is a World Heritage Site and its Ninomaru Palace is designated a National Treasure on account of its splendid architecture and magnificent interior decoration. Ieyasu built the castle as his Kyoto residence, but its greater significance was as a symbol of Tokugawa power in the Kansai region. The palace is an example of "shoin-zukuri" style, its four building groups staggered so that as many rooms as possible could front a garden or court. The interior is decorated with wall paintings by the Kano school. The floorboards of corridors creak underfoot. Called "bush warbler boards," they warned of the approach of an assassin.

After drive to Kinkakuji the Temple of the Golden Pavilion which is a famous structure dating from the Muromachi Period and was listed on UNESCO's World Heritage List in 1994. It is the popular name of Rokuon-ji (Deer Park Temple), a temple dedicated to the Buddhist Goddess of Mercy. Ashikaga Yoshimitsu (1358-1408), the third of the Ashikaga Shoguns, built a retirement estate there in 1398. After his death the grounds were turned into a Buddhist temple for the Rinzaï sect. The only building to remain standing of Yoshimitsu's estate was the Golden Pavilion. The upper stories are covered in gold leaf and the roof is topped by a bronze phoenix. The reflection of the temple shimmers majestically in the waters of a rock-studded pond.

Proceed to Heian Shrine has a relatively short history, dating back just over a hundred years to 1895. The shrine was built on the occasion of the 1100th anniversary of the capital's foundation in Kyoto and is dedicated to the spirits of the first and last emperors who reigned from the city, Emperor Kammu and Emperor Komei. Heian is the former name of Kyoto. A giant torii gate marks the approach to the shrine, around which there are a couple of museums. The actual shrine grounds themselves are very spacious, with a wide open court at the center. The shrine's main buildings are a partial replica of the original Imperial Palace from the Heian Period, built on a somewhat smaller scale than the original. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 7 - NARA PARK

Breakfast and today we have another full day sightseeing of Nara and Uji.

Nara, the oldest capital of Japan was the cradle of Japanese arts, crafts and literature. Buddhism first flourished here under the strong patronage of successive Emperors. Walking through the city's quiet streets is like strolling through the pages of history. Here, you can find the peace of mind and spiritual contentment.

Todaiji Temple, completed in 752, houses one of the largest bronze statues in the world. The temple is approached through an imposing gate supported by eighteen 25-meter-high pillars. It was built in the eighth century. Blown down by a typhoon the gate was rebuilt in. It is a National Treasure, as are two wooden images of the Deva kings in its exterior niches. The present Hall of the Great Buddha, is the world's largest ancient wooden structure and a National Treasure. The Great Buddha, a National Treasure, was cast in bronze in eight sections over three years. The 16.2-meter-high figure is seated on a huge bronze pedestal 20.7 meters in circumference.

Situated in a forest, Kasuga Taisha Shrine conveys an atmosphere of peace and sanctity

perhaps unmatched by any other shrine. Founded Fujiwara-no-Fuhito, the shrine has been identically reconstructed every 20 years. The buildings, painted vermilion, show the Kasuga style of architecture. Some 3,000 lanterns line the road east from the second torii gate. These are lit twice a year during the Mantoro festivals. Through the south gate visitors enter spacious precincts. Beyond the Heiden, a floorless structure rises the Main Hall, surrounded by an impressive gallery. It comprises four buildings, all of which are National Treasures.

Nara Park is otherwise known as "Deer Park" for the twelve hundred deer which inhabit it. These tame deer roam through groves of cedars, and oaks, and romedas and wisteria. They have been deified and are strictly protected as messengers of deities of the Kasuga Taisha Shrine. Nara Park dates from 1880. It was designated as a place noted for scenic beauty by the National Government in 1922. Transfer to Osaka and check in at the 4* Rihga Royal Osaka.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 8 - OSAKA

After breakfast depart for city of Osaka. A water city that affords cruising pleasures and sightseeing. Osaka castle-the symbol of Osaka with its over 400 years of history fusing the old and new, with towering skyscrapers abounded cherry blossom trees and soundings waterways. A sight to be enjoyed in any season. The Osaka Castle was built in the end of the 16th century by Toyotomi Hideyoshi, a well-known warlord who brought the whole country under his rule in the late 16th century. It has been burned down in a series of battles in the 17th century, and reconstructed later. Once again it was destroyed by fire, its donjon only reduced to ashes this time, and was reconstructed at last early in the 20th century. On display at its 1st to 7th floors are various weapons, armors and folklife items of those days. There is a view spot on the 8th floor.

The Umeda Sky Building is a spectacular high rise building in the Kita district of Osaka, near Osaka and Umeda Stations. It is also known as the "New Umeda City". The 173 meter tall building consists of two main towers which are connected with each other by the "Floating Garden Observatory" on the 39th floor. Meals: Breakfast.

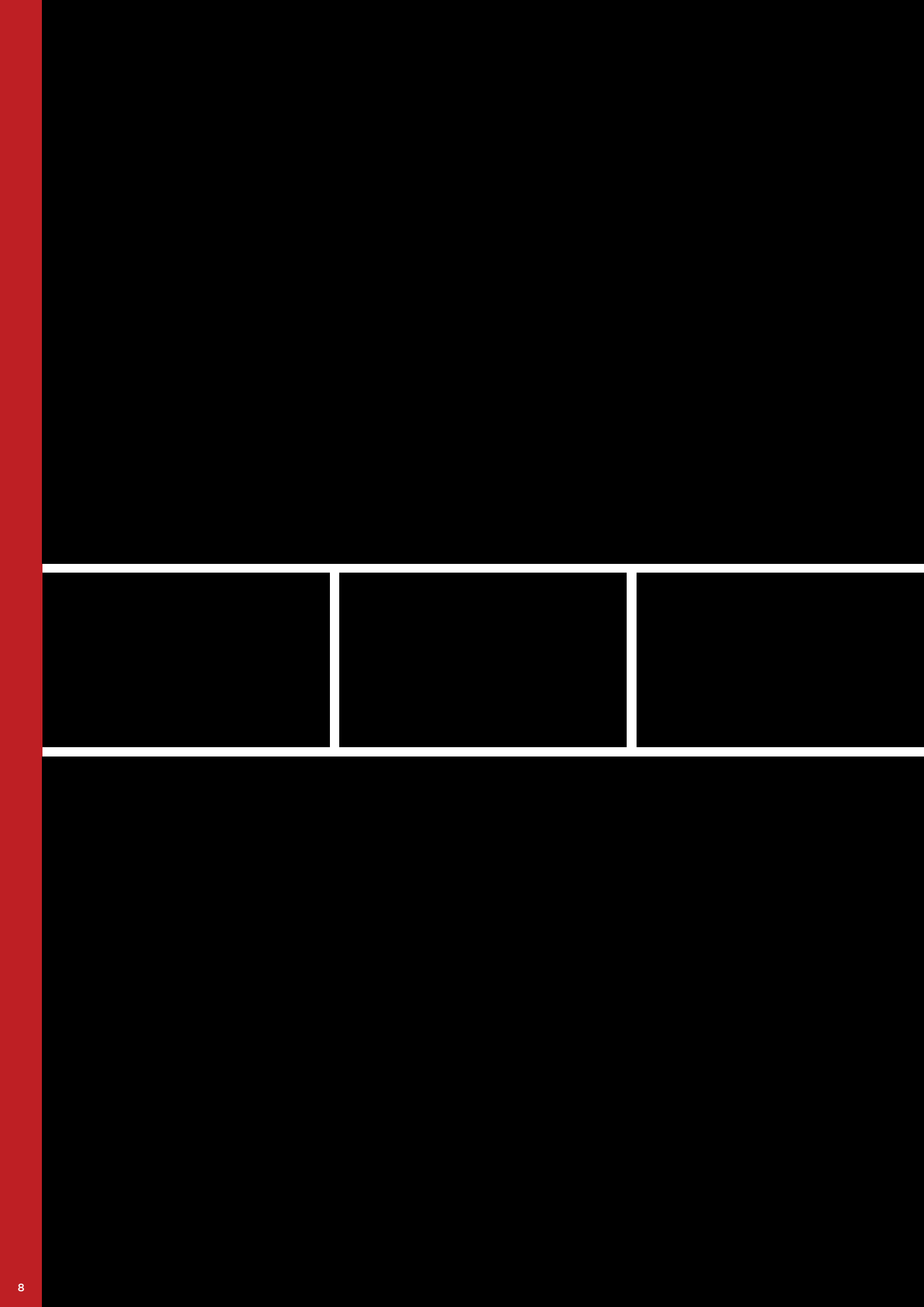
DAY 9 - OSAKA - SEOUL

Breakfast and transfer to Airport for flight to Seoul. Arrival at Incheon airport, meet and greet and transfer to the 5* Grand Hyatt Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 10 - SEOUL

After breakfast proceed for Seoul tour including National Museum of Korea. This new museum built in 2005 is boasting its fantastic collection of Korean arts and relics. It would take a whole day to see everything in the museum. The next visit at Changdeok Palace & Huwon (Secret Garden), UNESCO designated World Heritage. Walking tour of Bukchon Hano Village. Visit Seoul Tower on Mt. Namsan for a bird's eye view of Metropolitan city of Seoul. Also visit Namdaemun traditional market, it is the biggest market in Korea. Meals: Breakfast.



DAY 11 – SEOUL - DAEGU

Breakfast at hotel and transfer to Korean Folk Village outside of Seoul, where the old traditional style houses and life style of 18th-19th century are being practiced by people living in the village. Proceed to Songnisan National Park to visit Beopjusa Temple where you can find the tallest Buddha Statue in Korea. The forest park is ideal place for walking. Afterward, drive to Daegu via expressway. Check in at the 4*Daegu Grand Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 12 – SEOUL - GYEONGJU

Breakfast at hotel. Transfer to Gyeongju, the capital of the Silla kingdom from 57BC - 935AD and the city is also known as the "Museum without walls," as there are 52 designated sites within this city. Upon arrival in Gyeongju, half day Gyeongju tour including Cheomseongdae Astronomic Observatory, Royal Tumuli Park with its Royal tombs. You will have the chance to enter one of the excavated tombs to see the construction and process behind the Royal Kings burial chambers. Last visit is at Bulguksa Temple although rebuilt following destruction by the Japanese during their occupancy. The Temple has been completely restored to its former glory. Check in at the 5* Gyeongju Hilton Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 13 – GYEONGJU

After breakfast, start your full day tour of Gyeongju by visiting Seokguram Grotto, established in the 8th century on the slopes of Mt. Toham. The grotto contains a monumental statue of a sitting Buddha looking out to sea and it is considered a masterpiece of Buddhist art in the Far East. 4 faces Buddha, Gwaeneung Royal Tomb and Scenic drive tour to Guryongpo Port. Drive along the sea for beautiful coastal scenery.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 14 – GYEONGJU - BUSAN

After breakfast, check out and transfer to Unmoonsa Temple (Buddhist Nun's temple).

Proceed to Busan, the second largest city of South Korea. Upon arrival, start half-day Busan tour to Busan Tower on Mt Yongdusan with its observation deck offering stunning views of the city and beyond, Jagalchi Fishery Market where roadside vendors sell various fishes and Nampodong Street. Check in at the 5* Busan Paradise Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 15 – BUSAN - CHUNGJU

After breakfast, transfer to Mt Gayasan National Park via expressway. In Mt Gayasan National Park, visit Haeinsa Temple. Haeinsa Temple has a world famous Korean cultural treasure called Tripikata Koreana, which was made during the Goryo Dynasty to protect the country from the invasion of Mongolian troops by Buddha's power. UNESCO as World Cultural Heritage designated this Tripitaka Koreana. Proceed to Andong, 2 hours away from Haeinsa. Andong is the best-preserved village with its traditional style noble houses. In 1999, Queen Elisabeth II visited Hahoe Village and was welcomed with Birthday Party Table decorated in Korean traditional way. Hahoe Village in Andong is famous for its own mask dance. After a visit to Hahoe Village, proceed to Chungju Lake. Check in at the 3*Cheongpoong Resort.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 16 – CHUNGJU

After breakfast, take a ride on Sightseeing Boat for lakeside scenery.

Transfer to Mt Seorak National Park via Pyeongchang. Visit Woljeongsa Temple, this temple is famous for its pine tree road. Proceed to Gangneung, visit Chamsori Gramophone & Audio Museum. This museum boasts itself with incredible collection of 19th Century gramophones and 1st generation audio systems. Proceed to Sokcho and visit Naksan beach and Naksan Temple on the way to Sokcho.

Check in at the 5*Kensinton Star hotel.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 17 – MT SEORAK NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, transfer to DMZ Unification Observatory at demarcation line at East Coast for a very close view of North Korea and Repository of nature in ecosystem DMZ museum.

Return to Mt. Seorak National Park for cable car ride to Gwongumseong Fortress and visit Sinheungsa Temple. Visit Dongmyeong local port in the evening.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 18 – MT SEORAK NATIONAL PARK - SEOUL

After breakfast, transfer to Gapyeong to visit the Garden of Morning Calm Flower and Tree Park, which displays unique Korean Wild Flowers and trees in a garden located in mountain valley.

Transfer to Seoul. Check in at the 5* Grand Hyatt hotel and time at leisure in the afternoon.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 19 – SEOUL - MALTA

Breakfast at the hotel, morning at leisure and in the afternoon proceed for half day Seoul tour

visiting Jongmyo Shrine (UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE), Insadong Antique Alley, Deoksu palace

After the tour transfer to the Airport for your flight back to Malta.

DAY 1 - MALTA - CHINA

Meet the tour leader at Malta International Airport for your flight to China.

DAY 2 - SHANGHAI

Upon arrival you will be transferred to the 5* Shanghai Marriot Hotel Parkview. Shanghai, the thriving metropolis on China's eastern coast which is a dynamic city constantly changing and growing, with an unforgettable skyline.

DAY 3 - SHANGHAI CITY TOUR

Breakfast and morning briefing with your English speaking tour guide about the exciting trip that awaits you. Then, on to see some of the city's major highlights. Start at the classical Yu Yuan Gardens in the Old Quarter, built during the Ming Dynasty, a quiet and serene sanctuary in this frenetic city, with its scenic pavilions, ponds and streams. Continue to the lively Bund, Shanghai's popular promenade; stroll along the park-like waterfront and experience the old world charm. Tonight attend to a performance by the world-famous Chinese acrobats that includes dance, magic, acrobatics and beautiful music after dinner at a local restaurant. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

DAY 4 - FULL DAY SHANGHAI

After breakfast full day tour to Suzhou, including lunch and a cruise on the Grand Canal. Morning departure from Shanghai for the drive to Suzhou, known as the "Venice of the East". Upon arrival in this charming city, relax on a boat ride along the narrow waterways of the legendary Grand Canal followed by lunch at a local restaurant. Explore a silk factory to know about how silk is produced. End the day in Suzhou with a walk along bustling Guanqin Street, where the locals gather for entertainment and food. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

DAY 5 - SHANGHAI - YICHANG

Breakfast and free time to explore Shanghai by yourself before being transferred to the airport for your flight to Yichang, the second largest city in Hubei province after Wuhan, its capital. Upon arrival, enjoy dinner at a local restaurant before continuing to Yichang Port for embarkation on the 5* Victoria Cruise ship. This evening, you'll

begin the scenic journey on the fabled Yangtze, the longest river in China and the third longest river in the world. You'll be warmly welcomed aboard by the friendly international staff. A memorable voyage awaits you. Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 6 - XILING GORGE

Breakfast and in the afternoon tour the Three Gorges Dam, the world's largest and most ambitious hydroelectric project ever undertaken by man, nearly six times the size of the Hoover Dam. In addition to producing electricity, the dam was constructed to increase the Yangtze River's shipping capacity and reduce the potential for floods. This project has forever changed the landscape surrounding the Yangtze River and has also forced the relocation of people who once lived along the river. Tour the massive site to see this impressive achievement of engineering. Following the visit, return to the ship as it cruises upstream and enters the dramatic Xiling Gorge, the longest and deepest section of the Three Gorges. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

DAY 7 - WU GORGE & QUTANG GORGE

Awake this morning to beautiful vistas on the river. Breakfast and sail through the Wu Gorge, famed for its magnificent Twelve Peaks. Today, your tour will take you either on a scenic journey up Shennong Stream, travelling in small boats between rolling hills and rocky cliffs or on a scenic journey up Shennv Stream, the journey is accompanied by local folk songs and dances. Continue through the Qutang Gorge, the smallest of the three gorges, flanked by lush terraced hillsides. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

DAY 8 - SHIBAOZHAI

Breakfast and the ship arrives this morning at Shibaozhai, built during the Ming Dynasty. This pagoda is sometimes referred to as one of the eight construction wonders of the world, built into the side of a rocky cliff face and constructed without use of nails. This vermilion 12-story pagoda stands impressively over 100 feet high. The tour highlights the main attraction of the temple, with its traditional Chinese design. The structure is inspired by the mountains with

patterns and figures that vary from odd to extraordinary. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

DAY 9 - XIAN

After breakfast disembark the Yangtze River cruise in Chongqing, a major metropolis and one of the top emerging cities in China. Transfer to the airport for the flight to Xian, ancient capital of eleven dynasties and an archaeological treasure trove. Upon arrival, visit the renowned Shaanxi Provincial History Museum, home to a wealth of historical artifacts and treasures. Check in at the 5* Grand Noble Hotel Xian. Time to relax before the late afternoon visit to the Muslim district of Xian; learn more about Chinese Muslims and witness the preparation of local foods in the market. Return to the hotel with a stop en route at the gigantic Bell and Drum Towers. This evening enjoy a Tang Dynasty 6-course dinner followed by a historical dance performance by the Tang Dynasty Troupe. Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 10 - TERRACOTTA ARMY

After breakfast visit Xingqing Park, a hub of activity where you may have the chance to join the residents of Xian in their morning exercise, singing and dancing. Afterward, stop at a Terafter proceed to an unforgettable experience. Visit the archaeological site of the magnificent Terracotta Warriors, a vast collection of life-sized soldiers, horses and chariots that were entombed with China's first emperor, Qin Shi Huang. This world-famous site, discovered by local farmers in 1974, is still being discovered and excavated today, more than forty years since the time of its unearthing. At tonight's Dumpling Banquet, you can sample nearly 20 delicious varieties of dumplings. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.



DAY 11 - BEIJING

Breakfast and depart Xian for flight to Beijing, sprawling capital of modern China. Check in at the 5* Pentahotel Beijing. Afternoon at leisure - feel the pulse of this city of contrasts with its astonishing history and wondrous sights. Join a half-day Hutong Tour which begins with a Rickshaw ride through the old narrow streets and alleyways. See the courtyard homes which once covered all of Beijing - only a few still survive today and get to know about "old China" from a local family who will welcome you to their home.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

DAY 12 - SUMMER PALACE & THE FORBIDDEN CITY

After breakfast visit the fabled Summer Palace, resort of the Empress Dowager with its palace grounds, filled with a variety of picturesque gardens and architectural structures. Then continue to a local Pearl Shop to learn about the famous Chinese pearls. Have lunch at a local restaurant before continuing to huge Tiananmen Square, the largest public plaza in the world built at the height of the Ming Dynasty. The square's Gate of Heavenly Peace was once used as a staging ground for imperial edicts and by Mao Zedong himself to declare the founding of the People's Republic in 1949. Next, enter the Forbidden City, which served as the Imperial Palace until 1912. The extraordinary and immense walled complex is truly a masterpiece of Chinese architecture; its complex consists of 800 buildings with more than 9,000 rooms. Tonight, dinner at a Beijing restaurant.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

DAY 13 - GREAT WALL OF CHINA

An amazing day! After breakfast travel to the

extraordinary 2000-year-old Great Wall of China, one of the most spectacular structures ever built by man, spanning nearly 4,000 miles of China's northern frontier. En route, stop at a local jade shop to admire wares crafted with one of China's most famous materials. Then it's time to climb the ramparts of this ancient wonder to view breathtaking mountain passes, plateaus and grasslands from this 7th-century defensive fortification. DAY 1 - MALTA

Meet the tour manager at Malta International Airport for our flight to Johannesburg via Larnaca and Dubai.

DAY 2 - JOHANNESBURG

Upon arrival at Tambo international Airport you will be met by our partners in South Africa and

you will be assisted to the coach for the transfer to The 4* Protea Hotel Fire & Ice Melrose Arch, where your luggage will be stored until you return later for check-in. Depart to the Apartheid Museum for an afternoon tour, then return to your hotel.

DAY 3 - KRUGER

Experience the sight of assegai-wielding warriors, share the fascinating secrets of the Sangomas and witness traditional customs such as tribal dancing, spear making and the beer-drinking ceremonies. This cultural village is a unique resort built amid thorn trees and aloes, comprising a traditional Zulu "Umuzi" or homestead, where the Zulu people reside. Travel on to the seaside town of Umhlanga Rocks, which is located 15 minutes from the centre of Durban. Check in at The 4* Protea Hotel Umhlanga Ridge.

DAY 8/9 - DRakensBERG

DAY 10 - DURBAN - PORT ELIZABETH

Transfer to Durban for check in at King Shaka Airport for your flight to Port Elizabeth. Transfer and check in to The 4* Boardwalk Hotel.

DAY 11 - KNYSNA

After breakfast, depart to Knysna via the Tsitsikamma Forest and Plettenberg Bay. Tsitsikamma - the Garden of the Garden Route welcomes you - Tsitsikamma is a khoi word meaning "place of abundant or sparkling water". The region, which sits on a 200m high plateau stretches from the Bloukrans River in the west to the Tsitsikamma River in the east, is bordered on the north by the imposing Tsitsikamma Mountains and in the south by the Indian Ocean.

The area is covered in large tracts of indigenous forest, commercial plantation and Fynbos. Deep river gorges cleft the plateau as they make their way down to the sea, creating spectacular waterfalls and deep kloofs (ravines). The water in the rivers is a characteristic dark brown (Coca Cola Water) due to its high tannin content leached from the surrounding vegetation.

Stop at the seaside town of Plettenberg Bay, before traveling to Knysna. Check in at The 4* Protea Knysna Quays Hotel.



DAY 12 - KNYSNA

After breakfast, depart on your Featherbed Eco tour. The Featherbed Nature Reserve, situated on the Western Head in Knysna, is the premier eco-experience on the Garden Route. Enjoy a ferry trip on the Knysna Lagoon to the Western Head, then in a 4x4 vehicle & trailer drive up the headland onto the Reserve, stopping at spectacular viewpoints. Depart to the Safari Show Ostrich Farm and enjoy a one hour tour, followed by lunch. Travel to Hermanus and check in at The 4* Marine Hotel.

DAY 14 - HERMANUS - CAPE TOWN

The whale viewing during the months of July and August vary from year to year with regards to how many whales are present in Walker Bay and along the coast; however you are almost guaranteed of seeing whales in September, October and November. Travel on to Cape Town, stopping at the cableway and take the cable car up Table Mountain, to enjoy spectacular views of the city and surrounds. Check in at The 4* Protea President Hotel.

DAY 15 - CAPE TOWN

After breakfast join us on the ultimate 'Mother City' experience, designed to orientate and give you a full-colour insight into the extraordinary magic of Cape Town. We've chosen iconic buildings, snatches of its history, and experiences unique to this City. We visit the country's oldest building, The Castle (closed Sundays), and a short distance away, the Company Gardens, both historically fascinating and well conserved. Our drive continues past Parliament Buildings, City Hall and the Slave Lodge, and you'll sense the depth of history via their distinctive architecture. DAY 1 - MALTA - PERU

Flight Malta - Lima

DAY 2 - LIMA

Arrival in Lima, meet and greet and transfer to the 4* Estelar Miraflores hotel.

Lima - The Peruvian capital was founded 1535 by the Spanish conqueror Francisco Pizarro. Here, you will encounter colonial richness and the vibrating vitality of an oriental bazaar. The city has melancholic winters where the fog „garua“ rules and also hot and humid summers. There are huge districts where poor people live but also rich quarters with comfortable, old houses and the smell of jasmine in the evening.

DAY 3 - LIMA - CUSCO - URUBAMBA

Transfer to the airport for flight to Cusco. Upon arrival transfer to the 5* Aranwa Sacred Valley hotel in the Urubamba Valley, known as Sacred Valley, where the Urubamba River, a headstream of the Amazon passes through. On your way to the Urubamba Valley you will undertake a short visit to the sanctuary Cochahuasi Wasi. You will have the opportunity to see Pumas, Condors and Aras. The small conservation project is not comparable with a Zoo. It's also possible to get an insight in the Andean web techniques. You will continue to the "Mercado de Urubamba" and on the way you will have lunch in a typical local restaurant. The "Mercado de Urubamba" is an authentic market where real bartering takes place. The rural people of the surroundings sell and barter agricultural products as well as animals. It is also the place where locals exchange gossips and news.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 4 - URUBAMBA - CUSCO

This morning visit Ollantaytambo, a typical Inca community. Towering above the town of Ollantaytambo we will find the Inca fortress of Ollantaytambo. Steep stone terraces rising from the edge of town lead up to the fortress ruins at the top of the hill. A stone stairway leads up through the terrace walls, allowing visitors to step out on them. One of the best-preserved areas lies north of the Hanan

Huacaypata square: an area of 15 blocks of houses built on top of carved stone walls. Lunch will be served at a local restaurant. The rest of the day is free at leisure.
Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

DAY 5 - URUBAMBA - CUSCO

Transfer by bus to the train station of Ollantaytambo where the tour starts by train that goes through the fertile plain of the Urubamba valley and on to Aguas Calientes. From there, small busses drive up the steep mountain to the ruin town Machu Picchu. Called the Lost City of the Incas, this cultural heritage of mankind is a beautifully located impressive stone city constructed with a technique incredible for its era and even for present times. Stone upon stone, fitted together perfectly without any cement, with impressive delicacy, exquisite detail and discrimination worthy of the world's greatest palaces. There are many theories about Machu Picchu, but one thing is for sure - it is one of the most impressive sites in the world. Enjoy a guided visit of around 2 hours of the ruins and return by bus and train to Ollantaytambo station. Transfer to the 4* Novotel Cusco hotel in Cusco.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 6 - CUSCO

In the morning the half-day city tour will show the exact centre of the Inca Empire, the Plaza de Armas. There one can find the cathedral built on the ruins of the ancient Inca Palace. The cathedral borders on other churches on both sides. Next stop will be the old town with its magnificent renovated colonial buildings; some of them are being used as hotels. Then proceed to Sacsayhuaman, a ruin located approx. 3 km above Cusco. Sacsayhuaman also offers a fabulous view of the city. Afterwards visit the surrounding ruins.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 7 - CUSCO - PUNO

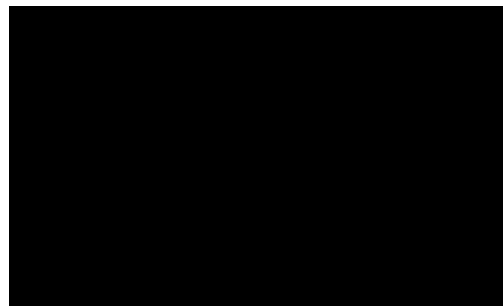
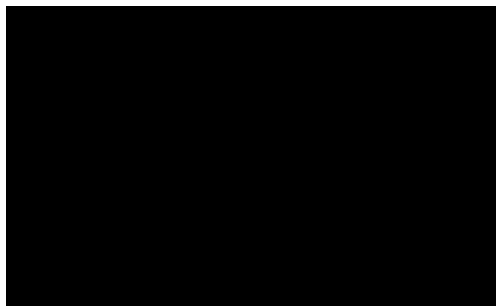
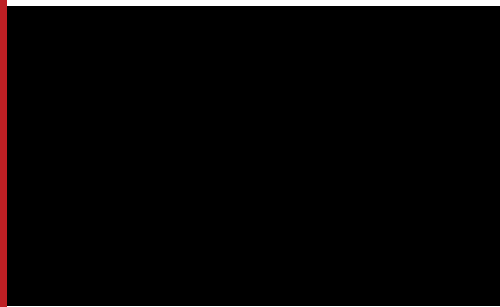
A full day bus journey from Cusco to Puno leads through the Peruvian highland along snow-covered peaks, passes up to 4.300m above sea level and then goes down to Puno, which is right on Lake Titicaca. On route we

will visit the town of Andahuaylillas, the ruins of Racchi, and the small town of Pucara. Lunch in a typical restaurant en route is included. After arrival in Puno transfer to the 4* Casa Andina Private Collection hotel.

Puno - was founded in 1668 and has the byname „Capital of Folklore“. The city is situated at the shores of the highest navigable lake of the world, Lake Titicaca. The „ocean of the Andes“ provides warmth and food for many inhabitants of the region, as the lake provides a milder climate for crops and life stock. According to the legend, the Sun God's children, Manco Capac and Mama Ocllo, emerged from the lake into the world to found the empire of the Incas. The lake remains mystical, full of secrets and leaves a lifelong impression on its visitors.
Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

DAY 8 - PUNO - LIMA

In the morning you will be picked up from your hotel and transferred to Puno's dock where you will depart towards the Uros Islands on Titicaca Lake. The Uros are 40 small floating islands made of packed totora (reed), located within the Titicaca National Reserve. Here the inhabitants of the lake, the Uros, live just as their ancestors did, maintaining their customs and idiosyncrasies. After visiting the Uros Islands we will continue by boat to Taquile Island. There are no roads or electricity in Taquile and the locals have maintained their traditions and culture and many still wear traditional dresses. The Taquileños are known for their high-quality handicrafts, especially for the knitting, which is exclusively performed by males. In the main square there is a cooperative shop, selling woollen goods and hand-woven items, as well as a small church. A typical lunch at Taquile Island is included. Transfer from the hotel to the airport for flight to Lima and transfer to the 4* Estelar Miraflores hotel.
Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.



DAY 9 - LIMA

In the afternoon you will explore the city on a sightseeing tour through Lima. The Plaza de Armas with the beautiful buildings of the government Palace, the town hall, the Palace of the archbishop and the cathedral are still the most important places in town. After that you will visit the beautiful San Francisco monastery which displays the largest collection of religious art in America. The highlight of this convent is the visit of the underground vaults known as "catacumbas" or catacombs.

Proceed through the modern districts of San Isidro and Miraflores and to the Coastline enjoying the view over the beaches of Lima and the Pacific Ocean. Afterwards enjoy a guided visit of one of the Lima's most noted museums, the Rafael Larco Herrera Archaeological Museum which houses the world's largest private collection of Peruvian pre-Columbian Art. Mr. Rafael Larco Hoyle founded the museum on July 28, 1926, in the Chiclin sugar estate in Trujillo, naming it as his father as an expression of filial homage. In 1958 he moved the collection to Lima, installing the Museum in a Colonial house in the district of Pueblo Libre, where it currently functions. This locale was adapted to the characteristics style of the 18th century Colonial houses from Trujillo. The approximate 45,000 objects of the collection have been exhibited to the public in the Permanent Hall, Jewelry Vault and the Classified Storage Area ever since. The Halls of the Larco Museum are organized by subjects. The Metals, Ceramics, the Stones, the Culture, the Great Jewelry Vault and Textile Halls emphasize the technological aspects by Pre-Columbian cultures. Finally the World's unique Erotic Hall gives us a glimpse of the fascinating sexual life of ancient Peruvians.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 10 - LIMA - FOZ DO IGUAZU

Transfer from the hotel to the airport of Lima for flight to Iguassu. Upon arrival transfer to the 4* Mabu Thermas Hotel & Resort.

Foz do Iguacu - Located close to the point where the Iguassu River empties its waters into the Parana River forming the world's widest waterfalls and giving rise to the double border of Brazil and Argentina, the city of Foz do Iguazu, with 325.137 inhabitants (2009 census), is of great tourist interest. Although not being big, Foz do Iguazu is a busy city, thanks to the many visitors that come to see the falls and also to Brazilian shoppers that come to purchase imported goods in Ciudad Del Este, the Paraguayan tax-free city right across the border. The Itaipu Hydroelectric Dam also brings great activity to the city thanks to the high number of its employees living in Foz do Iguassu

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 11 - FOZ DO IGUAZU

You will leave your hotel on the Brazilian side by motor coach and cross the Iguassu National Park towards the Brazilian Falls. You walk along the paths following the cascades and then along the catwalk which leads you very close to the bottom of the Devil's Throat. You will enjoy magnificent views. Afterwards you take an elevator to go up back to the road, and there you will board the motor coach which will take you to the Argentinean side of the falls. You will make a short stop at the Visitor's Centre and proceed from there along the Inferior Circuit, the down-river falls, to the Superior Circuit, the up-river cascades. The Ecological Jungle Train leads you to the most impressive observation point of the falls

- The Devil's Throat. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 12 - FOZ DO IGUAZU - BUENOS AIRES

Transfer from the hotel to the airport for the flight to Buenos Aires. Arrival in Buenos Aires and transfer to the 4* Kenton Palace Buenos Aires hotel.

Buenos Aires - is the capital of Argentina and the center of the political, economic and intellectual life of the country. It is also the most elegant and busy city in South America. This cosmopolitan city with great European cultural influence displays a refined taste in its cooking, in its boutiques and in the elegance of its inhabitants. Whilst of modern construction and dynamic activity, it has managed to preserve old traditions and charming corners.

The atmosphere, the individual personality of each of its neighborhoods, the cordiality of its people and the wide selection of its cultural and commercial opportunities, fascinates one.

Almost 13 million people live there and can enjoy the plentiful nightlife visiting tango bars, discotheques, eternally open bars and restaurants.

During the day, a wide variety of attractions are offered: museums, art galleries, tasteful shops, fascinating antiques, large green areas, parks, wide tree lined boulevards, clubs, sporting events and golf courses. This is the land of tango music, included in UNESCO list of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 13 - BUENOS AIRES

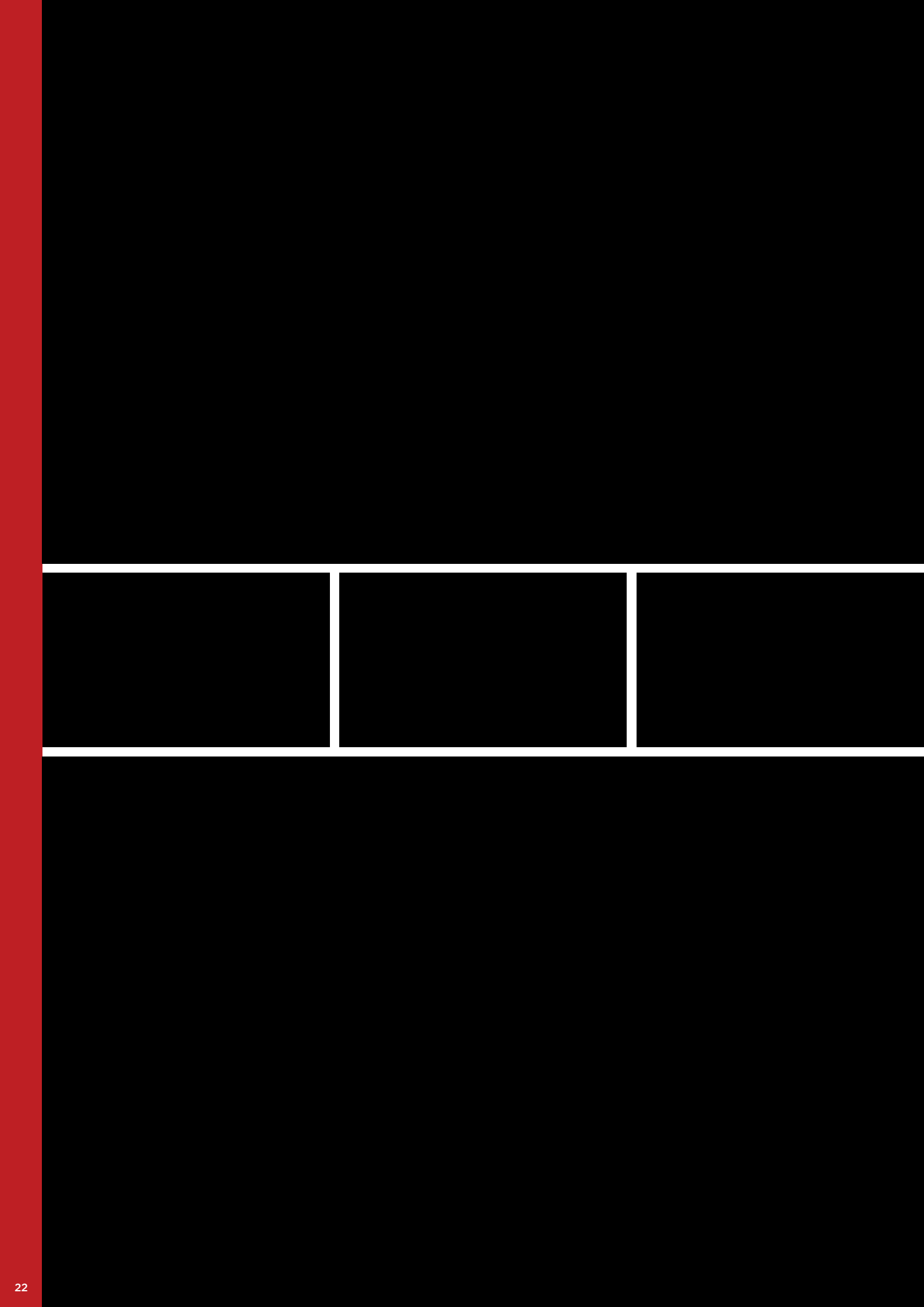
Get in touch with the birth city of the Tango! During your city tour in Buenos Aires you will drive along 9 de Julio Avenue, the widest avenue of the world, you will pass close to the Colon Theatre, one of the world's best known opera houses and the cultural pride of the "porteños" (as the inhabitants of Buenos Aires are called). Visit the famous Avenida de Mayo that runs into the Plaza De Mayo, surrounded by the Casa Rosada (Government House), the Metropolitan Cathedral and the Cabildo (first City Hall, built during Spanish rule). At the other end of Avenida de Mayo the cupola of the Congress building can be seen.

Continue to San Telmo, an historical neighborhood and the eldest district of Buenos Aires. Here you may have some time to stroll around Plaza Dorrego with its many antique shops Your next stop is La Boca, a most colorful area with the famous street Caminito. Continue to the north area driving to Palermo, the green area of the city with its beautiful parks, the City Zoo, Botanical Garden, Argentine Horse Track and National Polo Fields. Palermo is well-known for its artificial lakes. At the end of the tour you will visit Recoleta area, one of the city's most glamorous spots. Here you will see elegant boutiques and excellent restaurants, surrounded by centennial trees. Later proceed to The Tigre Delta with its rivers, streams and numerous green islands is one of the most attractive areas for visitors. The continuous sediment of the Paraná River, which gives the river and estuary their particular brownish-red color, forms the Delta islands. You will drive through the northern district and outskirts of the city to get to Tigre, a charming resort where a great number of summer residences, yachting and rowing clubs concentrate the weekend activities of many "porteños". You will enjoy a boat excursion on a boat along the innumerable channels of the Paraná-

Delta to see some of the hundreds of islands covered with luxuriant vegetation In the evening, you will enjoy a Dinner together with a Tango Show.

Visiting a Tango Show is a MUST when you are in Buenos Aires. The Tango tradition started at the end of the last century, developing from a mixture of various rhythms, which were originally danced in the poorer quarters. Dinner includes entrée, main course, dessert & drinks

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.



DAY 14 – BUENOS AIRES – RIO DE JANEIRO

Transfer from the hotel to the airport for flight to Rio de Janeiro. Arrival in Rio and transfer to the 4* Rio Othon Palace hotel.

Rio de Janeiro - The so called Marvellous City, is the capital of Rio de Janeiro State. Second biggest city in Brazil, with a population of 6.186.710 inhabitants within the city limits, it is nevertheless a beach resort, located by the Atlantic Ocean and by the big Guanabara Bay. Rio is graced by its topography. The city spreads on a 24km (15 mi) long strip of land, nestled between mountains and sea. There are some 45km (28 mi) separating downtown Flamengo from far flung Recreio, bordered on one side by the blue ocean, on the other by verdant hills. Between them lies a colourful state of mind called “carioca”, relaxed and high-spirited. Although being no longer Brazil’s capital, Rio is still an important cultural, financial and tourist centre.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 15 – RIO DE JANEIRO

Downtown is the business heart of Rio. It is the part of the city where colonial Rio meets modern skyscrapers. Your tour starts on 1º de Março avenue, the first commercial street built in the 18th. You will see the Paço Imperial palace, which was the first residence of the Royal Family, Banco do Brasil Cultural Centre and the Candelaria Church. From this point, the bus will proceed to Presidente Vargas avenue, the second most important street in downtown, built to create access from the suburbs to the commercial centre of the Capital in the early nineties, passing through the popular market and Tiradentes Square. Following with the tour you will see the Metropolitan Cathedral of Rio de Janeiro, Rio’s aqueduct, Santo Antonio Church, BNDES and Petrobras buildings reaching Lapa, the most popular night life point in Rio. You will have a panoramic view of the Teatro Municipal, the National Library and the City Council building – all of them inspired in the European 18th century style. Afterwards you will drive through the Flamengo Park, from

where you have the chance to see highlight of this tour, Sugar Loaf. This famous mountain is reached by a cable car 1,200 feet high, an experience you will never forget: looking down at Rio from the Sugar Loaf, one of the most spectacular views in the world. In the Cosme Velho district you will board the cog-wheel train, which will take you through the Tijuca Forest to the top of the Corcovado Mountain. The ride takes 20 minutes and is a wonderful opportunity to have a close look at the tropical forest’s lush vegetation and enjoy panoramic views of the city and its beaches. Disembarking at the top of Corcovado you may climb the stairs or take the elevator and escalators to the very top of the mountain where you will stand next to one of the Seven Modern World Wonders: The Statue of Christ the Redeemer. From here you have a truly divine view of the “Marvelous City”. Following descent, you will get to see some of the most beautiful beaches in Rio.

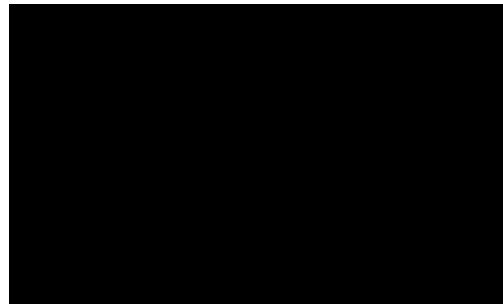
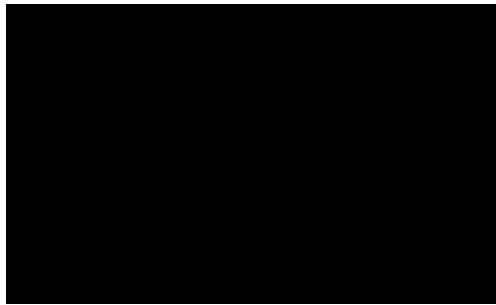
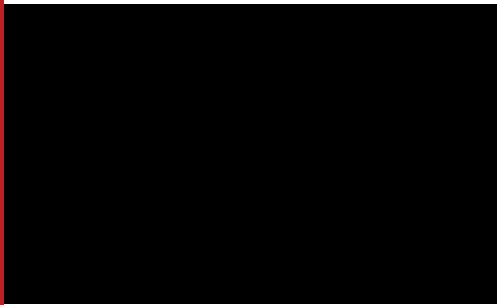

DAY 2 - New York

Half day city tour visiting major sights New York has to offer with a guided tour.

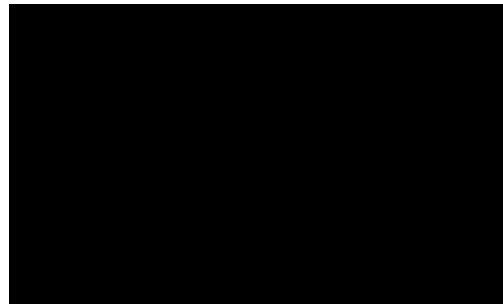
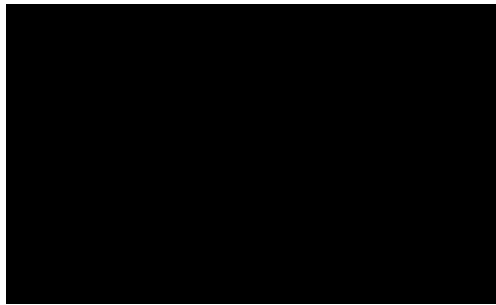
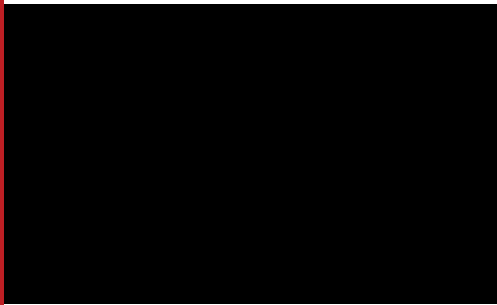

Defined by the Rideau Canal (designated by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site) and the government buildings on Parliament Hill, the city offers many great sights including the public gardens, the Byward Market and City Hall.

Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 4 - OTTAWA - QUEBEC CITY

This morning we travel along the scenic Ottawa River to the French - speaking province of Quebec.

DAY 02 - COLOMBO SIGHTSEEING

In the afternoon you will take the tour of this ancient city which was established in 500BC and served as an administrative centre of Sri Lanka and as the island's capital for 1400 years. The oldest historically documented tree on earth, The Sacred Bo Tree - is also located in this city. The perfection and scale of the dagobas or relic chambers like the Ruwanveliseya, Abhayagiri and the Jetavanarama, which are the largest in the world, are staggering, the latter vying with the largest pyramids at a height of 122m.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 04 - ANURADHAPURA - ELEPHANT RIDE - GIRITALE OR HABARANA

After breakfast proceed for Habarana to take an Elephant Ride.

The feeling of stepping back in time, a time when kings rode on the backs of these magnificent mammals, and the chance for you to do the same is what we at this other corner offer. Climb on to the backs of these gentle

giants, and the tour will take you along the forest trail, across the river, through the village and back all on the elephant back ride. The choice of either being adventurous and riding bareback or on comfortable elephant saddles are the only choice you will have to make.

A pleasant experience is virtually guaranteed. Transfer to Giritale / Habarana and check-in at the 4* Deer Park Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 05 - GIRITALE OR HABARANA - POLONNARUWA - GIRITALE OR HABARANA

After breakfast leave for Polonnaruwa Sri Lanka's medieval capital in 11th & 12th Century AD. Travel via Habarana. Polonnaruwa is a well-preserved city of ancient dagobas, moonstones, beautiful parks, massive buildings and stunningly beautiful statues. The majestic King's Council Chamber, the Lotus Bath, the Lanka Thilaka Viharaya, the Gal Viharaya (rock temple) and the statue of one of Polonnaruwa's great kings, Parakramabahu, are a few of this capital's memorable sights. The Sea of Parakrama - a vast 12th century man-made reservoir dominates the city. Moreover, the monuments here are located in a more compact area, and their development is easier to follow.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 06 - GIRITALE OR HABARANA - SIGIRIYA - DAMBULLA - KANDY

Breakfast and leave for Kandy the beautiful Hill capital, the last Kingdom Capital of the Sri Lanka's royalty. Kandy is surrounded by the lush tropical scenery. En route climb the Sigiriya Rock, the fascinating fortress which was a stronghold of a fifth century king who murdered his father. The red stone rises 600 feet from the green scrub jungle and it is famous for its frescoes painted within a sheltered rock. Only 19 out of the 500 painted in the 5th century remain. The Lion stairway, the mirror wall and the water gardens are amongst Sigiriya's other highlights. Also visit Dambulla Rock cave Temple, where you will see the frescoes over 2000 years old and the colossal figure of the recumbent Buddha carved out of the living rock about 14 meters long. It also holds its own treasure - a magnificent temple, which is a series of five caves established as a monastery in the 3rd

Century BC. These caves, built at the base of a 150m high rock during the 1st Century BC to 993 AD and are by far the most impressive of the many cave temples found in Sri Lanka.

Proceed to Kandy, En route visit a Spice Garden in Matale which grows spices and herbs used for Sri Lankan cuisine and medication. Check-in at the 4* Mahaweli Reach Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 07 - KANDY PINNAWELA - KANDY SIGHTSEEING

After breakfast visit the Elephant Orphanage in Pinnawela near Kegalle to see the daily routine of up keeping of baby elephants and other abandoned elephants.

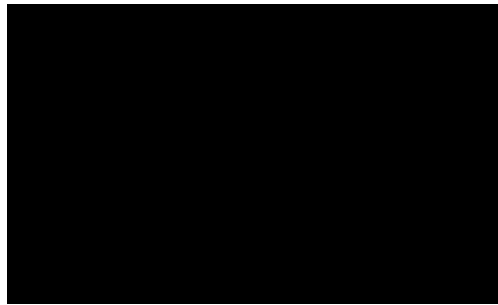
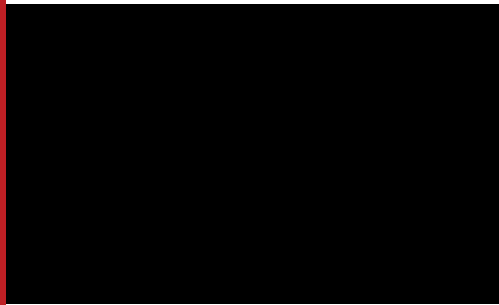
The unique concept of the Elephant Orphanage of Pinnawela is one of the most visited sites in Sri Lanka. Founded in the year 1975, with 03 baby elephants found abandoned in the forest, is today the home of nearly 65 elephants of different ages and sizes. Bottle feeding of the baby elephants is the highlight event of the place. In the evening experience a typical Sri Lankan Cultural Show of drumming, dancing, music and fire walking followed by a visit to the most sacred place of the Buddhist world, the Dalada Maligawa - Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relics of the Lord Buddha.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 08 - KANDY SIGHTSEEING - NUWARA ELIYA

Breakfast and today explore the city of Kandy. Visit the Peradeniya Botanical Gardens, a Batik Factory, a Gem Bureau where you will see a documentary film on how Sri Lankan Gem mining is traditionally done and an Arts and Crafts Centre. Also drive around the Kandy Lake to see the scenic beauty of the city. Proceed to Nuwara Eliya the Tea Garden of Sri Lanka situated 6200ft above the sea level. The hill station of Nuwara Eliya is celebrated for its fresh climate, the wonderful scenery all around, and its "Englishness". Wonderful mountain panoramas surround the wide valley, into which fall many lovely but icy waterfalls. En route visit a Tea Factory, Tea Plantation and Ramboda falls in Ramboda. The temperature varies from 10 to 20 degrees Celsius, falling to near zero on winter nights and producing occasional frost. Check-in at the 4* Grand Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.



DAY 09 - HORTON PLAINS

Early hours visit Horton Plains which lies shrouded in cold mists on top of Sri Lanka's mountains, at a height of more than 2,000m. A part of the Peak Wilderness Sanctuary and dramatically different from the coastal plains thousands of feet below, it is a plateau of 3,150 hectares in area. It is a wild and windswept plain of grasslands or patanas and patches of eerie forests. Residents include elk, monkeys, eagles, horned lizards and the occasional leopard. The Plains were uninhabited by the local population but were prized hunting and fishing grounds for the Europeans who "discovered" them in the early 19th century. The visit from your hotel to the entrance will be by jeep.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 10 - NUWARA ELIYA - ELLA - YALA

After breakfast depart for Yala via Ella Wellawaya and stop for view the Ravana Falls and the Ella Gap. Check-in at the 4* Cinnamon Wild Hotel. In the afternoon visit the Yala National Park which has a large wildlife sanctuary and offers the wild life enthusiast and nature lover the opportunity to observe a great variety of fauna. Visit the Yala National park and the tour will be conducted through the park where you will have the opportunity to see Leopards, Bears, Sambhurs, Wild Boar and Elephants.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 11 - YALA - GALLE - COLOMBO -

NEGOMBO

Breakfast and travel to Colombo through the picturesque coastal line via Galle - the Old Portuguese Fort rebuilt by the Dutch. Galle is also the centre of the ebony elephant makers, tortoise shell craft and handmade laces. En route visit Ambalangoda where he famed 'devil masks' are produced. Also visit a Turtle Sanctuary in Kosgoda to spare few hours at one of the sanctuaries in Sri Lanka and see the life of Turtles where you can see almost the full life journey of Turtles in these sanctuaries.

Proceed to Negombo via Colombo and **CHECK-in** at the 4* Jetwing Blu Hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner.

DAY 12 - NEGOMBO

Breakfast at hotel and later transfer to airport for your departure flight back to Malta.

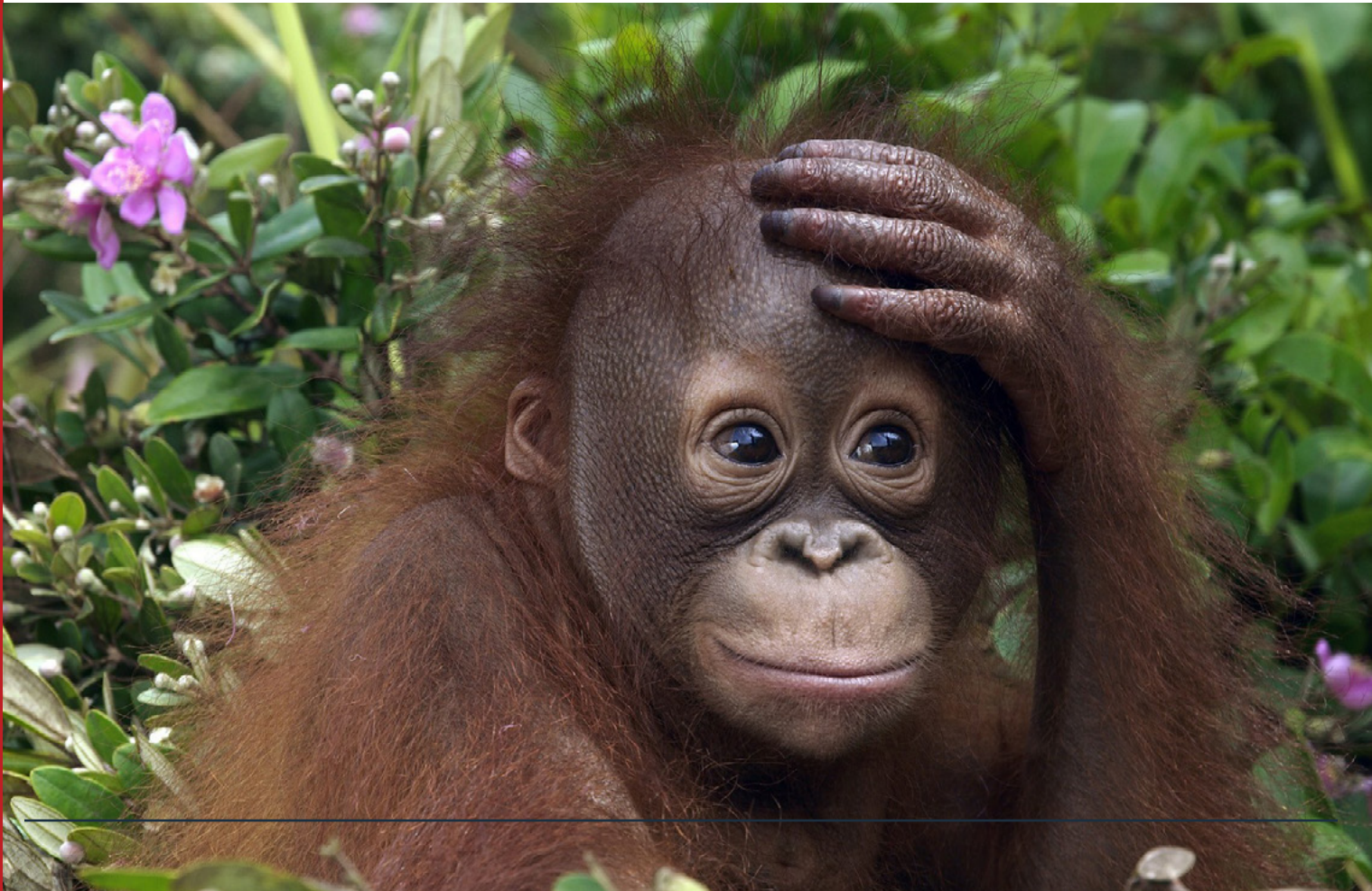

Highlights of Malaysia

DAY 1 - MALTA - MALAYSIA

Flight Malta - Kuala Lumpur.

DAY 2 - ARRIVAL KUALA LUMPUR

Upon arrival meet and greet and transfer to the 4* Royale Bintang hotel. Check-in and rest of the day is at leisure.

DAY 3- KUALA LUMPUR

Morning tour of the Countryside. Drive to the outskirts of the city, we will first cruise along the 'Ambassador Row', Istana Sharif Ali and Malay villages. Our first stop, the Royal Selangor Pewter, is exceptional craftsmanship. During the tour of the factory, you will get a chance to learn the different processes, such as casting, filing, polishing, soldering, hammering and engraving of pewter products. Next, we stop at a Batik Factory to see how batik is being designed and printed. Our last stop will be at the limestone hills of Batu Caves. A flight of 272 steps will lead up to the sacred Hindu temple cave where the shrine of Hindu deity, Lord Murugah lies. Another cave, called the museum cave, is filled with images of deities and murals depicting scenes from the Hindu scriptures. Return to hotel after tour. Rest of the day is at your own leisure to discover the good bargains and cozy cafes and restaurants of Kuala Lumpur, the happening city.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 4 - KUALA LUMPUR - TAMAN NEGARA

Meet at hotel lobby, around 09.00hrs for an overland journey to Kuala Tembeling Jetty. On arrival at Kuala Tembeling, proceed to register yourself with the National Park and Wildlife Department.

Board a motorised longboat for 3 hours ride to Kuala Tahan, the headquarters of Taman Negara. On route you will pass by local villages and lush tropical rainforest. Birds, monkeys, monitor lizards or water buffaloes may be along the river. Expected arrival at Kuala Tahan at 1700 hours. Check in at the 3* Mutiara Taman Negara Resort. In the evening meet your guide at the Resort's reception who will give you a brief orientation introduction. Your first adventure will be a night jungle walk in the 130 million years old tropical rainforest. Take the boardwalk on a lookout for nocturnal insects amidst the chorus of the rainforest. Do note however, sighting of wildlife in the tropical forest due to its density, is a bonus. Overnight in air-conditioned chalet. (Night Walk is subject to weather change).
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 5 - TAMAN NEGARA

Meet the guide and start with a jungle walk for 1 ½ hours up Teresik Hill. Walking along the boardwalk will reward you with a panoramic view of the tropical rainforest at the top of Teresek Hill. The guide will highlight to you the rich flora found enroute. On a clear day, you can see Mount Tahan, the highest mountain in Peninsular Malaysia. Before returning to the base, we will go on a canopy walkway, built 40 meters above the ground and 530 meters in length. You will experience the rainforest from a different perspective, as you will be closer to the top of the trees. In the afternoon, we will take a motorised boat to the cataracts of Lata Berkoh. There is a deep pool delightful for swimming, resting or reading on the rocky area overlooking the river. We will stop over at Lubuk Tenor Fish Sanctuary where a fascinating fish feeding experience awaits. Lubok Tenor, blessed with clear water (unless there is recent heavy rain) and many fish is the result of a successful ecotourism project involving local villagers and the government to create fish sanctuaries. Return to the resort. The boat will drift along the river quietly in search of wild birds and animals. However, sighting of wildlife is not guaranteed.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 6 - TAMAN NEGARA - KUALA TEMBELING - CAMERON HIGHLANDS

The boat for Kuala Tembeling departs at 0900 hours. This journey will take between 2 to 3 hours depending on water level. Proceed overland to Cameron Highlands which is located at 1542 meters above sea level, famed for its tea plantations and cool temperatures. Estimate to reach Cameron Highlands in late afternoon. Check in at the 4* Strawberry Park Resort and rest of day is at leisure.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 7 - CAMERON HIGHLANDS

Depart for an exploratory tour of Cameron Highlands, used as a highland retreat station for the British during the colonial days. Proceed for "Countryside Tour". Since the discovery of the Cameron Highlands by William Cameron in 1885, the highlands have not only been transformed into a farming land and a retreat for the wealthy Chinese businessman but have also become the most popular destination for local and foreign holiday makers alike. In 1929, John Archibald Russell a Scottish, was the first person to be granted a piece of land to cultivate tea in this region. Today, his company Boh Plantations is the biggest tea grower in Malaysia. This half-

day tour will take you to one of his plantations to watch the processing of black tea and later to sample various kind of tea in the tea house. After the tea break (on own account) we will visit local fruit and vegetable market, an apiary farm, butterfly garden, Chinese Buddhist temple, cactus and flower gardens and lastly a strawberry farm. Return to hotel after tour. Rest of the day is at your own leisure.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 8 - CAMERON HIGHLANDS - PANGKOR

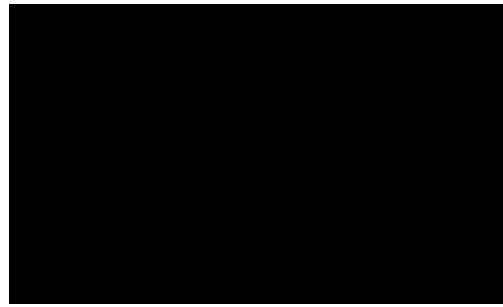
Early morning set off to Penang. En route visit the Sam Poh Tong cave temple. Thereafter stop at the Royal town of Kuala Kangsar for a spell of photographing of the exterior view only of Ubudiah Mosque, Iskandariah Palace and Istana Kenangan. Proceed further to Kuala Sepetang mangrove forest, the best-managed mangrove forest in Malaysia and one that serves a very important ecological role in protecting the coastline from erosion. Delight in the novelty of walking through natural mangrove forest on a boardwalk. Kuala Sepetang produces the bulk of the nation's top quality mangrove charcoal. Visit a charcoal kiln where charcoals are produced. Proceed to Marina Island Pangkor Jetty and by boat to the island of Pangkor Laut with its charming mix of fishing settlements and resorts. Check in at the 5* Pangkor Laut Resort.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 9 - PANGKOR - KUALA LUMPUR

Transfer to Airport for your flight to Malta.
Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 10 - MALTA

Arrival in Malta.

DAY 1 - MALTA - ECUADOR

Flight Malta - Quito.

DAY 2 - MALTA - ECUADOR

Arrive in Quito and transfer to the 4*Hotel Quito.

DAY 3 - QUITO

The morning's tour begins with a visit to the colonial section of Quito. Walk along the narrow cobblestone streets and feel the charm of 16th-century Quito.
