

# Moving to a Culture Where Safety is a Strategic Priority

Uniquely different from previous general sessions, the opening session of BASA's Facilities and Safety Conference will engage attendees to participate in a critical dialogue elevating "safety" as a strategic priority through creating Safety Conscious Schools. 
