

DAY I

We depart London St Pancras by Eurostar to Brussels. We continue through Germany by high-speed train to **Nuremberg** for a night at the InterCity Hotel. (D)



After its outstanding success in 2018 we again offer you this superb tour. In October the Lokpark heritage railway collection at Ampflwang opens its doors with a steam festival. A week later sees a rare steam excursion on the Mariazellerbahn Railway. In between we feature more steam on the Achenseebahn and Zillertalbahn, Innsbruck's Nordkettenbahn, the Gmunden Tramway, the Traunseebahn, boat trips on idyllic Austrian lakes, a brewery and a schnapps tasting. If you fancy a 'Golden October' in Austria, please book early as this is a limited edition tour with only 16 rooms at our small, family-run hotel in Timelkam.



DAY 2

After a morning visit to the German National Railway Museum, we continue into Austria and Timelkam, where we stay for three nights at the Hotel Sonnenhof. Tonight we have arranged a night photo shoot at Ampflwang Lokpark. (B,D)

DAY 3

Today is spent at Ampflwang Lokpark's Steam Gala. The Lokpark is the base of the Austrian Society for Railway History and its collection, having taken over the standard gauge freight line between Ampflwang and Timelkam following the closure of the local mine. Expect at least three locos in steam, with visiting engines, the possibility of footplate rides and lots of photo opportunities in the roundhouse. (B,D)

DAY 4

A mixture of new and nostalgic today as we head first to Gmunden. Here we descend from Gmunden station on the brand new 'Traunseetram', which has replaced the town's heritage vehicles on Austria's oldest tramway and one of Europe's steepest. Alighting on the shores of Lake Traunsee, we enjoy an hour's cruising on the lake's gentle waters before rejoining the 'Traunseetram' along its newly opened link to the 'Traunseebahn' line. Hopping off first for lunch at a local Gasthaus, then again at Schloss Eggenberg Brewery for a tasting, we end the day on one of the route's surviving heritage electric vehicles on the Vorchdorferbahn, before returning to Timelkam. (B,L,D)



DAYS 5-6

On day 5 we travel westwards into the Tyrol for a four night stay at the Hotel Plankenhof in Pill. Day 6 heads from Jenbach to Seespitz on Austria's oldest steam-hauled cog railway, the Achenseebahn, dating from 1889. From Seespitz we enjoy a cruise on the Tyrol's largest lake, Achensee, before returning downhill by steam to Jenbach. This evening we enjoy a tour and tasting at our hotel's in-house schnapps museum! (B,D)

DAYS 7-8

Our next steam adventure on day 7 heads the opposite direction from Jenbach on the Zillertalbahn to Mayrhofen at the head of the valley. Day 8 features a visit to Innsbruck, the capital city of the Tyrol. After viewing the Golden Roof and cityscape shrouded in the stunning backdrop of the Austrian Alps, we include a return trip on the Nordkettenbahn, an extraordinary rail adventure leading from city centre to high mountain. (B,D)

DAYS 9-10

We head eastwards through Austria on day 9 to the city of **St Pölten** for two nights at the Hotel Metropol, positioning ourselves for day 10's steam adventure, a rare **steam-hauled excursion on the Mariazellerbahn**. This narrow-gauge line travels through one of Austria's most remote regions



through the **Pielach Valley**, which gets ever narrower as we continue our ascent, using horseshoe curves, bridges, tunnels and viaducts to climb to **Mariazell**, a pilgrimage destination dominated by its basilica. In Mariazell we also include a ride on the **Mariazell Steam Tramway**. (B,D)

DAY 11-12

Our journey home begins with a scenic trip into Bavaria. Changing in Munich onto the high speed line, we arrive in Cologne for a final night at the Wyndham Hotel Cologne. For our farewell dinner we have chosen one

of the popular and homely Cologne Brewery Taverns, returning home on day 12. (Day 11-B,D, Day 12-B)

Hotel Sonnenhof, Timelkam

The 4* Hotel Sonnenhof is a small, family-run hotel on the edge of Timelkam in charming, beautiful green surroundings. With only 16 bedrooms, it means that space on this tour will be strictly limited.

Hotel Plankenhof, Pill

We are pleased to return to the hotel we used on our last visit to Austria, the 4* Plankenhof in Pill in the Tyrol. A listed building, the Plankenhof dates back to the 15th century and is in the 11th generation of family ownership. Uniquely, the hotel also houses a 'Museum of Schnapps'!

Metropol Hotel, St Pölten

A modern 4* hotel on the edge of St Pölten's Old Town and pedestrian area.

DAY I

For those booking our rail inclusive package we travel along the spine of Scotland. Leaving the Lowlands behind the wonderfully picturesque **Highland Line** takes you through Perth, Pitlochry and over the Caimgorm Mountains to **Inverness** where we transfer by coach to **Beauly** for two nights at the Priory Hotel. (D)

DAY 2

We take the amazing Kyle Line train, Scotland's original "Great Railway Journey of the World", coast-to-coast The Highlands of Scotland are arguably at their most glorious during the golden weeks of Autumn. This superb rail holiday offers a wealth of spectacular autumnal scenery out of your window, including two of the world's greatest railway journeys – the Kyle Line and the West Highland Line with the fabulous Jacobite steam train.



through stunning scenery and across mountain plateau. Look out for wild deer, eagles and the palm trees of Plockton village, before dramatic sea vistas are revealed as we arrive at **Kyle of Lochalsh**.

Here we enjoy a light lunch in the renowned Lochalsh Hotel, overlooking the Isle of Skye, before retracing our steps to Inverness. (B.L.D.)

DAY 3

This moming we travel to Inverness by coach and enjoy free time to discover this compact and picturesque city. We can visit the magnificent cathedral church, lovely riverside cafes and historic Old Town before departing by road and travelling alongside Loch Ness, with a short break for photography and monster spotting. We then continue through the beautiful Great Glen to Fort William where we check-in to our hotel for two nights, the Alexandra. (B,D)









DAY 4

Today we take a magical train journey along the rail route to the Isles aboard the lacobite steam train*. We cross the world renowned Glenfinnan Viaduct, overlooking Loch Shiel and the Bonnie Prince Charlie monument: a view made even more famous in the Harry Potter films. We round Loch Eilt with its trees of the ancient Caledonian Forest and burst out onto the white-sanded Atlantic shoreline at Morar, Catch distant views of the Isles of Eigg and Rhum before we reach the terminus at Mallaig overlooking the Isle of Skye. After a sightseeing break we return to Fort William. (B.D)

DAY I

We depart London St Pancras by Eurostar to Brussels and onwards through Germany to Cologne. (D)

DAY 2

Our journey continues to **Berlin** for two nights at the Maritim Pro-Arte Hotel in the heart of the city at Friedrichstrasse, and, if you wish, your Tour Manager will take you for a short introductory walk along Unter den Linden to the Brandenburg Gate, where many of



Our great railway journey through central Europe celebrates one of the longest-running international express train services, the Hungaria, which has served the route from Berlin to Budapest since 1960. Comfortable and nostalgic, we have split the journey into bite-sized pieces to enjoy Berlin, Prague and Budapest, all intriguing cities, whilst our route covers great scenery too, plus a stay in historic Nuremberg.



the city's most interesting sights are clustered together. This was the site of the former Royal Prussian Palace, the Soviet 'Palast der Republik', Bebelplatz where the Nazi book burning took place, the State Opera, Museum Island, the Holocaust Memorial and, of course, the Brandenburg Gate itself. (B,D)

DAY 3

Today begins with a half-day guided sightseeing coach tour of Berlin, which uncovers this unique city's turbulent past. The tour will introduce both the east and west of this once divided city, including part of the remaining Berlin Wall. The afternoon is then free to explore independently. Perhaps head west to the famous KuDamm, visit the ruined Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church or enjoy the fascinating food hall of the KaDeWe store, Berlin's answer to Harrod's. Alternatively. a short ride to the east brings you to Alexanderplatz, the former main square of East Berlin with its TV Tower and World Clock. (B,D)

DAY 4

This moming we board the Hungaria service bright and early. Many of the trains feature comfortable and nostalgic compartment seating, with great views from your picture window. Travelling through Saxony, the spires of historic Dresden come into view, followed by Saxon Switzerland's table mountains as we meander along the Elbe Valley. Crossing into Bohemia, we arrive in Prague. A guided tour introduces the city, from the Castle district to Charles Bridge and Old Town Square. Our hotel for two nights is the NH Hotel Prague. (B,D)

DAY 5

Today is free to explore at leisure. Prague is a city of two halves and many contrasts, but is relatively compact. Visit the Castle District on the hilly bank, then descend to the famous Charles Bridge across the River Vltava. From here the Astronomical Clock is a short walk, followed by Old Town Square, flanked by the Tyn Church, Town Hall and many ornate buildings, with the Jan



Hus Monument as a centrepiece. This evening we feature a traditional dinner at the New Town Brewery. (B,D)

DAY 6

Rejoining the **Hungaria**, our journey crosses into Slovakia at Brno, then onwards through the **Hungarian Plain** to **Budapest** for three nights at the Three Corners Hotel, a brand new hotel close to the Museum and Market Hall. Dinner will be provided in a local restaurant. (B,D)

DAY 7

Uncover both Buda and Pest sides of the river on a guided sightseeing tour, including the Matthias Church, Fishermen's Bastion and the famous Danube panorama. Operated since Soviet times, when it was called the Pioneers' Railway, the Children's Railway is operated by children under adult supervision (apart from the driver, who is most definitely an adult!) and gives valuable work experience to young people considering the railways as a career. (B.D)

DAY 8

A day at leisure enables you to discover the Hungarian capital for yourself. The Market Hall, close to the hotel, is a great starting point, before taking in the Vaci Utca shopping street. This evening a gentle **Danube dinner cruise** completes our visit to Budapest, with the spectacular parliament building on one side and the hills of Buda flanking the opposite bank, dining as we cruise amidst this breathtaking backdrop. 

Great value and a great railway holiday featuring the famous 'Rhine in Flames' fireworks event and a plethora of attractions varying from riding scenic branch lines through vineyards, Germany's oldest rack railway to a 'dragon's castle', plus a scenic, possibly steam, ride on the Vulkan Express train, a vineyard visit with wine tasting and of course, we've timed this trip to coincide with the sensational 'Rhine in Flames' celebration at Remagen.



production in a predominantly whitewine area. Guided by our hotelier, we stop first at the lovely town of Altenahr before heading back down the valley to the pretty walled-town of **Ahrweiler**. During the day we also visit Germany's oldest wine co-operative in Mayschoss, with a horse drawn buggy ride through the vineyards, followed by a tasting of the local wines. (B,D)

DAY 3

This morning we take the train along the Rhine to Brohl, where we join the Brohltalbahn. Otherwise known as the Vulkan Express, the line meanders up through the Brohl Valley into the Eifel Hills, whose dramatic rock formations were created during a period of volcanic activity. The railway has recently reintroduced steam to the

line and we will travel by steam train if available. The line leads us to the village of Oberzissen and onwards to Engeln. Following our evening meal back in Remagen we stroll to the waterside promenade to experience the magic of the spectacular 'Rhine in Flames' firework display. (B,D)

DAY 4

Today we head for the opposite bank of the Rhine by ferry and railway, travelling first to Königswinter where we take a return trip on Germany's oldest rack railway, the Drachenfelsbahn, from the valley station up a height difference of 220 metres to the top station, where you will find the ruined Drachenfels ('dragon's cliff') Castle and great views across the river and the Siebengebirge hills. After our visit we continue to Linz-am-Rhein where we join the heritage diesel Kasbachtalbahn Railway, whose 1950s 'Roter Brummer' Uerdinger Railbus transports us from the bottom station to Kalenborn over 9 kms of breathtaking track that rates amongst Germany's steepest. We
